2118 Brackenridge Street – 208 East Live Oak Street

PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1930 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, flat-roofed, Spanish Colonial Revival-style stucco house with a partial-width inset porch with segmental arches; 1:1 fenestration; several rear additions.

RESEARCH

The house appears to have been built in 1930 by G.A. Kennedy, who never lived in the house. The first occupants of the house were renters, Andrew and Elizabeth Holden, who appear in the 1930-31 city directory. Andrew Holden was an auditor in the State Comptroller's Office. By 1932, the house had been purchased by Ernest C. and Clevie Cox, who lived here until around 1938. Ernest Cox was originally from North Texas, growing up in Ellis and Cleburne Counties, around Dallas and Fort Worth. He was a farm laborer and truck driver in his youth, but by the time he had married and moved into this house, he was working in the State Adjutant General's Office. He and Clevie must have divorced around 1938 – the 1939 city directory shows the house owned and occupied by Lonnie Lee and Clevie Brasfield, and Ernest C. Cox appears as a single man living in Alexandria, Virginia in the 1940 U.S. Census, where he was an organizer for a veterans' organization.

Lonnie Lee Brasfield was the son of a watch repairman in Austin, and in 1930, he was working as an advertising salesman. He then sold cars for Capitol Chevrolet and then the Goad Motor Company before World War II. After the war, he went into real estate. He was killed in an automobile accident in 1954. Clevie Brasfield remained in the house until around 1958; she passed away in 1993.


After Clevie Brasfield moved out of the house, it became a nursery, kindergarten, and day care center, which it remains to this day. With the kindergarten use, several additions have been made to the back of the building.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house appears in the Comprehensive Cultural Resources Survey (1984) but without a priority for research.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Release the permit after completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history of the property for archiving at the Austin History Center.

Ernest C. Cox' World War I draft registration card shows that he was living in Cleburne, Texas, was single, and a student and farm laborer.

The 1920 U.S. Census report shows Ernest C. Cox as a 24-year old single truck driver living in Palmer, Texas. By 1930, he had married (according to the 1930 census report), and lived with his wife, Clevie in an un-numbered rented house on Jarratt Avenue in Austin. Ernest Cox was then 33, had been born in Texas, and was a major in the Texas National Guard. Clevie Cox was then 25, had been born in Texas, and was the general secretary of the Texas Treasury Department. They had a boarder, Florence Hughes, 60, a Texas-born widow with no occupation listed.

The 1940 U.S. Census shows Ernest C. Cox as a lodger in the home of Thomas and Jessie Finney in Alexandria, Virginia. Ernest C. Cox had lived in Austin in 1935, and was an organizer for a veterans' association.

LONNIE LEE and CLEVIE BRASFIELD (ca. 1938 – ca. 1958)

Lonnie and Clevie Brasfield appear in the 1940 U.S. Census at this address, a house they owned, which was worth \$4,400. (By comparison, the house at 206 East Live Oak was worth \$7,000). Lonnie Brasfield was then 31, had been born in Alabama, and was a salesman for a car company. Clevie Brasfield was then 34, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed. The couple had a son, Robert Stanford, 3 months old. With them also lived Lonnie Lee Brasfield's mother, Nannie, a 60-year old widow who had been born in Texas, and had lived in Dallas in 1935. Lonnie Lee and Clevie Brasfield had been living in this same house in 1935.

The 1930 U.S. Census shows Lonnie Lee Brasfield as the 21-year old son of L.L. and Minnie Brasfield, who lived in a rented house at 700 W. 13th Street in Austin. L.L. Brasfield was a 50-year old Tennessee-born watch repairer. Lonnie Lee Brasfield was an advertising salesman.

Real Estate Man Fatally Injured In Car Turnover

An Austin man was fatally infured and his brother seriously injured late Wednesday afternoon when the car in which they were riding overturned on Highway 290 approximately two miles west of Oak Hill. (Photo, Page 7).

Dead is L. L. (Lee) Brasfield, 46, of 208 East Live Oak. He died of a cerebral concussion and hemorrhage in Brackenridge Hospital. His brother, Sam Brasfield, 39, of 308 West Johanna Street, surfered internal injuries, fractures of the ribs and cuts and bruises about the body.

Highway Patrolman Hank Logsdon reported that the car carrying the two men was headed toward Austin when it overturned at approximately 5 p. m. The vehicle, a 1950 Oldsmobile, overturned several times and was listed as a total loss.

Both men were thrown from the car, which came to rest on its wheels inside a barbed wire fence which runs alongside the highway. They had been on a fishing trip.

Lee Brasfield was a real estate man, while his brother, who was listed by Logsdon as the driver of the car, is a salesman here.
