PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1929 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, front-gabled frame bungalow-style house with an enclosed, partial-width, projecting inset front porch, now with modern replacement windows; single and paired 1:1 fenestration.

RESEARCH

City utility permits and Sanborn maps reveal that the house was built in 1929 by Benjamin F. Lensing, who lived at 2914 Rio Grande Street, as a rental unit. Benjamin F. Lensing never occupied this house, and he died in 1929. The house was rented to a wide variety of tenants, the first being John McCoy, a laborer at Lone Star Ice Company, and his wife, Lucinda. The McCoys lived here for about a year. There were frequent changes in the tenants of this property; in the early 1930s, the house was rented by UT instructor Melvin Thomas, Helmer and Bertha Rydberg (he worked in the display department at Scarbrough's department store), and William Butler, an engineer at the Austin Ice Company. The first time that there was a tenancy of more than a year or two in this house was in the 1940s, when the house was rented by C. Alfred and Elfreida Anderson. He was a mechanic. Winnie Allen, who had been a teacher in the Austin public schools, and later an archivist at the University of Texas, rented this house in the 1950s.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house is listed in the Comprehensive Cultural Resources Survey (1984) but without a priority for research.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Release the demolition permit. The house has been modified, and has neither the architectural nor the historical significance to warrant individual designation as a historic landmark.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES:

Benjamin F. and Elizabeth Lensing, the builders of the house

The 1900 U.S. Census shows Benjamin F. Lensing as the 15-year old son of Henry and Mary Lensing, who lived at 3006 Rio Grande Street. Benjamin Lensing had no occupation listed; his father, Henry, was a teamster. The 1930 U.S. Census shows Elizabeth F. Lensing as a 41-year old widow living in the home of her sister and brother-in-law, Noble and Helena Baker, at 2914 Rio Grande Street. Elizabeth Lensing had been born in New York and was a nurse in a private home. Noble A. Baker was a 55-year old Texas-born meat cutter. Helena Baker was 47 years old and had been born in Texas.

Melvin and Myrtle Thomas (ca. 1930- ca. 1932)

The 1930 U.S. Census shows Melvin and Myrtle Thomas as the renters of this house. Melvin Thomas was a 27-year old university teacher who had been born in Nebraska. Myrtle Thomas was also 27, and had been born in South Dakota to Danish-born parents. They had a young son, Stanley, who had been born in Utah.

Wilson and Lila Young (ca. 1940- ca. 1941)

Wilson and Lila Young appear as the renters of this house in the 1940 U.S. Census report. Wilson Young was then 33, had been born in Texas, and was a butcher in a retail grocery store. Lila Young was then 31 and had been born in Texas. They had a young son, Robert, who had been born in Texas.

Winnie A. Allen, age 86, of Austin, formerly of Bertram, died Friday, July 26, 1996.






The 1922 Sanborn map shows a house with the address of 2906 Rio Grande Street, but this house is a little to the north of the current house, which was built in 1929. The same house appears on the 1935 Sanborn map below with an address of 2908 Rio Grande Street. City directories reveal that the house now at 2908 Rio Grande Street was built ca. 1910. Note that this section of Rio Grande Street was called Hopkins Court in 1922, but the name Hopkins Court never appeared in city directories.
