Authorize award and execution of a 36-month requirement services contract with STANLEY CONVERGENT SECURITY SOLUTIONS, INC. for monitoring, maintenance, testing, and repair of security and fire alarms for the Austin Public Library in an estimated amount not to exceed \$798,582, with three 12-month extension options in estimated amounts not to exceed \$266,194 per extension option, for a total estimated contract amount not to exceed \$1,597,164.

Amount and Source of Funding

Funding in the amount \$177,463 is available in the Fiscal Year 2012-2013 Operating Budget of the Library Department. Funding for the remaining 28 months of the original contract period and extension options is contingent upon available funding in future budgets.

There is no unanticipated fiscal impact. A fiscal note is not required.

This contract will provide monitoring, maintenance, testing, and repair services to the Austin Public Library's owned and existing security and fire alarm systems.

The Contractor will provide monitoring services of the security and fire alarm systems of 23 Library locations. In addition to monitoring services, this contract includes repair, maintenance, replacement, testing, and installation of equipment. These additional support services will be on an as-needed basis and are needed to ensure compliance with security and fire code standards/requirements, and to secure and protect the Library properties and facilities from identified and/or potential risks. All repair parts and equipment installed by the Contractor will be non-proprietary, and therefore will not bind the City to a future Sole Source condition.
