
Impact Fees Background & 2012 Impact Fee Update Highlights

- Austin impact fees apply only to water and wastewater infrastructure
- Collections average approximately \$6.0 million annually
- State law requires the impact fees to be updated every five years.
 - Updates are proposed for land use assumptions (LUA), impact fee capital improvement plan (IF CIP), and the assessed & collected fees
 - As a policy, Austin's collected fees have been less than the calculated maximum allowable
- The most recent update was adopted by Council in 2007
- Impact fee service area boundary has only minor changes from 2007
- Joint Committee recommended to maximize fees and eliminate zones
- Upward pressure on fees due to new rate revenue reduction calculations



Impact Fee Capital Improvements Plan & Fee Calculation Method


- Identify new growth projects
- Determine capacity to be used in 10-yr planning horizon and its cost
- Account for contribution of revenues from new users toward paying for growth facilities through rates
 - This 5-year update includes an Austin-specific rate revenue credit
 - ~36% for Water
 - ~35% for Wastewater
 - Previous updates have used a 50% across the board credit
- Divide adjusted cost by the number of 10-year growth service units = maximum allowable impact fee (MAIF)
 - Water MAIF (preliminary draft subject to change):
 - increases from \$3,307 per Service Unit (SU) to \$5,415 per SU (64% increase)
 - Wastewater MAIF (preliminary draft subject to change):
 - increases from \$1,852 per SU to \$2,284 per SU (23% increase)






Land Use Assumptions

- Population and employment served in 2010 and 2020 allocated to Planning Areas, Water Pressure Zones and Wastewater Basins
- Convert water meters to Service Units (flow) based on weather normalized 2011 total water usage
- Population and employment growth converted to service units for determining facility usage



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


Austin Impact Fee Analysis





Water Impact Fees Comparison Top 15 Largest Texas Cities






Wastewater Impact Fees Comparison Top 15 Largest Texas Cities






Water Impact Fees Comparison Central Texas Cities

Summary Discussion

- Schedule:
 - Outreach and Stakeholder input thru November
 - December/January RCA to Set Public Hearing
 - Public Hearing and Council Approval in January/February
- Incentives
 - Proposed elimination of current zone incentives
 - Waivers and Adjustments (W&As)
 - Rapidly increasing percentage of W&As
 - e.g. Affordable Housing, State/ISD Facilities, Annexations, Council Approved Exemptions, etc.
 - Analysis of W&As on-going via the IFAC
- Other Considerations:
 - Phasing
 - Administration (currently 1,164 Impact Fees options in Amanda)
