The Emergency Solutions Grant program is designed to be the first step in a continuum of assistance to help clients quickly regain stability in permanent housing after experiencing a housing crisis including homelessness. The Homeless Emergency Assistance and Rapid Transition to Housing Act of 2009 (HEARTH Act) consolidated three separate homeless assistance programs administered by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) into a single grant program, and revised the Emergency Shelter Grants program and renamed it as the Emergency Solutions Grants (ESG) program.

On February 27, 2013, the City of Austin received notification from HUD of the availability of additional ESG funds. The grant appropriation in the 2012-2013 budget is \$596,000. The requested increase represents the difference between the grant appropriation of \$596,000 and the total grant award amount of \$615,010.

The City proposes to utilize the ESG funds for the FY12-13 ESG Shelter Maintenance and Operations program at the Austin Resource Center for the Homeless (ARCH). The additional ESG funding must be expended by September 30, 2013.
