Since 1986, the City of Austin and Capital Area Council of Governments (CAPCOG), through interlocal agreements, have cooperated in delivering emergency 9-1-1 service in Austin and Travis County. The delivery of 9-1-1 service requires maintaining and upgrading equipment and software, providing supplies to employees, training employees and maintaining addresses in the areas served. The City of Austin provides this service pursuant to a current Interlocal Agreement with CAPCOG with CAPCOG reimbursing the City. The County's reimbursement amount paid to the City, under the Interlocal Agreement, is the City's portion of contingency revenue received by CAPCOG for FY 2013.					
The City's FY 2011-2012 Budget included a reimbursement from CAPCOG of \$330,414 for costs associated with Graphic Information System (GIS) and Master Street Address Guide (MSAG) addressing. The FY 2012-2013 Budget also included a reimbursement from CAPCOG in the amount of \$330,414 for the 12- month renewal option.
