Additional Backup Information

On February 25, 2013, approximately 35 acres of compost piles, yard waste piles and processed sludge piles at Hornsby Bend Biosolids Treatment Plant caught fire due to low humidity and unusually strong winds causing spontaneous combustion and the winds further spread embers throughout the piles. These fires could not be extinguished through typical firefighting methods due to the type of fire, so they would continue to smolder until extinguished. The continuous smoldering compost piles placed both the environment and public at risk. For this reason OMI Environmental Solutions was contacted to extinguish the fires before they could spread and affect the surrounding community.

Due to the threat of public calamity, normal procurement procedures could not be followed and the immediate appropriation of funds was necessary to protect City and community property.
