# HISTORIC LANDMARK COMMISSION JUNE 24, 2013 DEMOLITION AND RELOCATION PERMITS HDP-2013-0371 605 E. 42<sup>ND</sup> STREET

#### **PROPOSAL**

Demolish a ca. 1926 house.

#### ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, clipped side gabled, frame house with synthetic siding; partial-width, front-gabled, independent porch on concrete piers and square wood posts; single and paired 1:1 fenestration with 3:1 wood screens.

#### RESEARCH


From city utility permits, it appears that the house was built in 1926 by Ernest W. and Ione Cartwright, who lived here until around 1932. Ernest W. Cartwright was a wholesale meat salesman, who, according to his obituary, was also very active in scouting. A widow, Elma Merryman, who worked as a stenographer at the State Railroad Commission, rented the house in the early 1930s; Martin and Wilma Kilian rented the house until around 1940. Kilian was a plumber. The next owner-occupants were G. Fred and Evelyn Eckhardt, who lived here from the mid-1940s until around 1950. Eckhardt was a city fireman, and Evelyn was an elementary school teacher. The house has been a rental unit since around 1950, with various tenants, including a meat cutter, geologist, students, and an X-ray technician.

#### STAFF COMMENTS

The house does not appear in any City survey.

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and an addition to the house over demolition. While the house has neither the architectural nor the historical significance to warrant individual designation as a historic landmark, this house is on a very intact residential block in the Hancock neighborhood and would be contributing to a potential historic district for the street and/or those adjacent. If rehabilitation is not feasible, encourage relocation over demolition, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin documentation package consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history for archiving at the Austin History Center.
