WE WERE POSTED FOR A 10:00 START THIS MORNING, BUT SINCE WE POSTED THIS MEETING LAST WEEK A GOOD FRIEND OF THE CITY PASSED AWAY AND HIS FUNERAL WAS THIS MORNING AT 10:00 A.M. AND SO WE APPRECIATE EVERYBODY'S PATIENCE WHILE A NUMBER OF US ATTENDED MR. CHAPA'S FUNERAL. WHAT I WOULD LIKE TO DO IS JOIN ME IN A MOMENT OF SILENCE FOR MR. CHAPA, BUT EARLIER THIS MORNING AS YOU SAW A FEW MINUTES AGO THE REPLACE OF OUR MEMORIAL SERVICE WE HOLD EVERY SEPTEMBER 11th WITH AUSTIN FIRE DEPARTMENT REMEMBERING THE TRAGEDY OF FIVE YEARS AGO. IF YOU WILL PLEASE JOIN ME IN A MOMENT OF SILENCE. THANK YOU VERY MUCH. THERE BEING A QUORUM PRESENT, AT THIS TIME I'LL CALL TO ORDER THE MEETING OF THE AUSTIN CITY COUNCIL, MONT, SEPTEMBER 11th, 2006, APPROXIMATELY 11:40 A.M. TECHNICALLY WE HAVE 13 AGENDA ITEMS POSTED FOR THIS MEETING. OF COURSE, THIS IS OUR -- THE FIRST OF PERHAPS AS MANY AS THREE MEETINGS WHERE WE APPROVE AND ADOPT THE BUDGET FOR THE NEXT FISCAL YEAR. IT'S A SIMPLE AND COMPLICATED PROCESS. WE'VE SPENT, YOU KNOW, CITY MANAGER AND HER STAFF, OF COURSE, SPENDS MONTHS IN ADVANCE OF THIS MEETING PREPARING THE BUDGET. SHE THEN PRESENTS THAT TO US AS COUNCIL AND COMMUNITY AT THE END OF JULY EACH YEAR. WE AS A COUNCIL AND COMMUNITY HAVE TAKEN THE LAST MONTH AND MORE TO GET PUBLIC COMMENT ON THE BUDGET AND ALSO, OF COURSE, HAVE INDIVIDUAL COUNCIL QUESTIONS ANSWERED. AND SO IN ORDER TO GET US THROUGH THIS MEETING, STAFF SCRIPTS A PROCEDURE FOR US TO FOLLOW TO MAKE SURE WE FOLLOW STATE LAW. THERE'S SEVERAL ISSUES WE HAVE TO MAKE SURE THAT WE HANDLE PROPERLY AND ALSO SEQUENTIALLY TO GET US THROUGH THIS IN A REASONABLE AMOUNT OF TIME IN A

WAY I THINK MOST PEOPLE CAN LITERALLY FOLLOW THE MATH OF WHAT IT IS WE'LL BE DOING. SO THE AGENDA TODAY DEALS WITH ADOPTION OF THE FISCAL YEAR '07 BUDGET AND CONTAINS A NUMBER OF ITEMS RELATED TO THE BUDGET, OUR FIRST AGENDA ITEM IS THE ADOPTION OF THE FISCAL YEAR '07 OPERATING BUDGET, AS REQUIRED BY STATE LAW THE VOTE ON THE ORDINANCE SETTING THE ACTUAL TAX RATE MUST BE SEPARATE FROM THE VOTE ADOPTING THE BUDGET. AND WE'LL BE TAKING UP AS AGENDA ITEM 3 TODAY. ONUNDER ITEM NUMBER 1, I'LL FIRST ENTERTAIN A MAIN MOTION ON THE OPERATING BUDGET AND RECOGNIZE INDIVIDUAL COUNCILMEMBERS FOR ANY NUMBER OF AMENDMENTS TO THAT MAIN MOTION. SO AGENDA ITEM NUMBER 1, MAIN MOTION READS AS FOLLOWS: ITEM NUMBER 1, THE OPERATING BUDGET, ADOPT THE OPERATING BUDGET AS PROPOSED INCLUDING THE ERRATA, AND I'LL ASK THE MOTION -- MAKER OF THE MOTION WHETHER IT'S ON FIRST AND SECOND AND/OR SECOND AND THIRD READINGS. OPERATING THE BUDGET ON THE FISCAL YEAR TWIENG OCTOBER 1, 2006 AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30th, 2007. AND MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR EACH DEPARTMENT, PROJECT AND ACCOUNT INCLUDING THE ERRATA. DO I HAVE A MAIN MOTION ON THE OPERATING BUDGET?

MAYOR, I MOVE TO APPROVE FIRST, SECOND AND THIRD READING OF AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING AND APPROVING THE OPERATING BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1st, 2006, AND ENDING ON SEPTEMBER 30th, 2007 AND MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR EACH DEPARTMENT, PROJECT AND ACCOUNT INCLUDING THE ERRATA.

Dunkerley: I SECOND THAT.

Mayor Wynn: MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER COLE, SECONDED BY MAYOR PRO TEM TO ADOPT THE OPERATING BUDGET ON ALL THREE READINGS AS SHE STATED. WHAT I'LL DO NOW IS WE'LL SET ASIDE -- WE HAVE THAT MOTION AND SECOND ON THE TABLE. NOW WE WILL SYSTEMICLY AND SLOWLY ENOUGH WALK THROUGH ANY POTENTIAL AMENDMENTS TO THAT OPERATING BUDGET. SO, WE HAVE BEEN WORKING AS INDIVIDUAL OFFICES REALLY FOR SEVERAL WEEKS NOW COMING UP WITH WHAT COULD BE POTENTIAL AMENDMENT

TO THE OPERATING BUDGET, AND AT THIS TIME I WILL ENTERTAIN MOTIONS TO AMEND THE OPERATING BUDGET. COUNCILMEMBER.

MAYOR? I MOVE TO AMEND THE PROPOSED BUDGET OF THE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT BY APPROPRIATING \$995,386 AND ADDING 15 F.T.E.S FOR THE RECUTEMENT AND DEVELOPMENT OF FUTURE PARAMEDICS AND TO STRENGTHEN SUPERVISORY OVERSIGHT OF THE CURRENT WORKFORCE.

Mayor Wynn: ACTUALLY, COUNCILMEMBER, I'M GOING TO ASK THAT WE TABLE THAT MOTION BECAUSE I THINK FROM A SEQUENCE STANDPOINT WE NEED TO GO AHEAD AND DO THE REVENUE FIRST, THE PROPERTY TAX FIRST.

Leffingwell: WITHDRAW.

Mayor Wynn: MAYOR PRO TEM, THANK YOU.

THIS ADDITIONAL STAFF WILL ALSO ADDRESS THE BACKLOG OF FINGERPRINTING AND MANAGING -- FOR AUTOMATED PALM AND FINGERPRINT IDENTIFICATION SYSTEM AND ADD VALUABLE ASSETS TO THE RECENTLY ACCREDITED FORENSICS LAB.

Mayor Wynn: OKAY, COUNCILMEMBER. MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER McCRACKEN, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER MARTINEZ TO FURTHER AMEND THE OPERATING BUDGET BY APPROPRIATING \$479,200 AS OUTLINED TO OUR POLICE DEPARTMENT. FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED? MOTION PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. MAYOR PRO TEM.

Kim: MAYOR, I AMEND THE PROPOSED BUDGET OF THE HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT BY APPROPRIATING \$275,000 TO ESTABLISH A SECOND DAY LABOR SITE IN SOUTH AUSTIN.

Mayor Wynn: MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER KIM, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER COLE TO FURTHER AMEND THE OPERATING BUDGET BY APPROPRIATING \$275,000 TO OUR HEALTH DEPARTMENT FOR A SECOND DAY LABOR SITE IN SOUTH AUSTIN. FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED? MOTION TO AMEND PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. COUNCILMEMBER KIM.

Kim: MAYOR, I AMEND THE PROPOSED BUDGET OF THE HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT BY APPROPRIATING \$155,121 AND ADDING ONE F.T.E. TO THE EXPAND, OUTREACH AND EDUCATION TO REDUCE THE YOUTH...... EUTHNATION.

Mayor Wynn: HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED. MOTION TO AMEND PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. COUNCILMEMBER McCRACKEN.

McCracken:, MAYOR, IN THIS BUDGET THAT WE'RE CONSIDERING TODAY WE HAVE ALREADY BUILT IN AN

INCREASE IN GRAFFITI REMOVAL FUNDING. WHAT WE HAVE LEARNED IN THIS BUDGET PROCESS THAT ACCORDING TO THE STAFF IS THAT YOU ARE OUR CURRENT GRAFFITI REMOVAL CURRENTLY TAKES ABOUT 10 DAYS AND THAT THE STANDARD REMOVAL TIME NATIONALLY IS 24 TO 48 HOURS. SO WHAT WE HAVE IN ADDITION TO THE ADDITIONAL FUNDING WE ALREADY HAVE IN THE BUDGET, I'M PROPOSING ADOPT A POLICY ITEM ON GRAFFITI REMOVAL SO THE COUNCIL WILL ESTABLISH POLICY ITEM AND IN OFFERING THIS I RECOGNIZE THAT THE AMOUNT OF FUNDS WE HAVE APPROPRIATED IN THIS BUDGET WILL NOT GET US TO GRAFFITI REMOVAL IN 48 HOURS, BUT WHAT THIS DOES IS BECOMES A POLICY TO GUIDE US NOT JUST THIS YEAR BUT IN THE COMING YEARS AS WELL. AND SO THE BUDGET POLICY ITEM FROM COUNCIL THAT I'M PROPOSING IS THIS. THAT THE POLICY OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN WILL BE TO REMOVE ALL GRAFFITI VISIBLE TO THE PUBLIC WITHIN 48 HOURS AND THE POLICY OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN WILL BE TO REMOVE ALL GANG-RELATED GRAFFITI VISIBLE ON TO THE PUBLIC WITHIN 24 HOURS. AS PART OF THAT AS WELL THAT THE CITY MANAGER WILL REPORT TO COUNCIL ONCE EACH SIX MONTHS DURING REGULAR PUBLIC MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL ON OUR SUCCESS IN ACHIEVING COMPLIANCE OF THIS COUNCIL POLICY AND AT THAT TIME IF THE CURRENT PROCEDURES, PRACTICES AND BUDGET APPROPRIATIONS ARE NOT RESULTING WITH THE CITY COMPLYING, THE DURING IN REPORT THE CITY MANAGER WILL BE PROVIDING ACTION PLANS AND RECOMMENDATIONS FOR COMING BUDGETS FOR THE COUNCIL. INSTEAD THAT WILL BE NEED TO DO BRING THE CITY IN COMPLIANCE WITH THIS NEW COUNCIL POLICY ON GRAFFITI REMOVAL.

Mayor Wynn: SO OUR 10th PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE OPERATING BUDGET TECHNICALLY IS REVENUE NEUTRAL, EXPENDITURE NEUTRAL, BUT IT'S A MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER McCRACKEN, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER COLE TO OUTLINE THIS PERFORMANCE MEASURE FOR OUR HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT, SPECIFICALLY REGARDING OUR GRAFFITI REMOVAL PROGRAM, AS OUTLINED BY THE

COUNCILMEMBER. FURTHER COMMENTS?

McCracken: MAYOR, ONE MORE COMMENT. TO REPORT AT THE TRAVIS HOUSE AND GUADALUPE IT'S BEEN MORE THAN 10 DAYS SO THIS WILL BE OUR FIRST OPPORTUNITY.

SO MY MOTION IS TO AMEND THE PROPOSED BUDGET BY INCREASING THE GENERAL FUND TRANSFER TO THE NEIGHBORHOOD HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,200,000 TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR AFFORDABLE HOUSING PROGRAMS AFFECTED BY REDUCTIONS IN FEDERAL GRANT FUNDINGS. AND IN FACT BY THIS INVESTMENT WE MAKE TODAY UNDER WIRELESS ACCELERATOR, WHAT IT DOES, IT ALLOWS YOU TO EXPAND HERE IN AUSTIN THE NUMBER OF STARTUP COMPANIES ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE WIRELESS ACCELERATOR AND THAT AUTOMATICALLY MAKES EVERY COMPANY HE... WHO IS NOW ABLE TO ELIGIBLE FOR EMERGENCY TECHNOLOGY GRANTS. WE'RE GETTING A TWOFER BY DOING THIS BECAUSE WE'RE EXPANDING THE NUMBER OF COMPANIES WHO WILL CBT TO THE ECONOMIC FUTURE IN EE... EMERGENT TECHNOLOGIES AND AUTOMATICALLY MAKING EVERY ONE OF THESE COMPANIES ELIGIBLE FOR THE STATE'S EMERGING TECHNOLOGY FUND AS WELL.

COUNCILMEMBER McCRACKEN, WILL THIS HELP US GET WI-FI AND COMMUTER RAIL?

McCracken: AS YOU SAW TODAY, COUNCILMEMBER KIM, AND I HAVE BEEN TALKING ABOUT HOW IMPORTANT IT'S GOING TO BE TO HAVE WI-FI ON OUR RAIL SYSTEM AND OUR BUSES, WE SAW IN TODAY'S PAPERS THAT THE CAPITAL METRO IS ACTUALLY PUTTING IN PLACE A SYSTEM THAT WILL HAVE WI-FI ON ALL BUSES, RAPID TRANSIT BUSES AND RAIL SYSTEMS. AND SO HOPEFULLY WE WILL MAKE IT WHERE THERE WILL BE AUSTIN COMPANIES SELLING THEIR CONTENT PEOPLE ARE USING ON THEIR WIRELESS DEVICES.

THAT'S GREAT. I'M LOOKING FORWARD TO IT.

Mayor Wynn: WE HAVE A MOTION AND SECOND TO FURTHER AMEND THE OPERATING BUDGET WITH \$150,000 APPROPRIATION FOR THE AUSTIN TECHNOLOGY WIRELESS INCUBATOR PROGRAM. FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED? THE MOTION PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. COUNCILMEMBER McCRACKEN.

McCracken: IN CONJUNCTION WHAT WE'VE JUST DONE WITH THE WIRELESS ACCELERATOR, WE'VE LEARNED COUNCILMEMBER KIM AND LEFFINGWELL AND I THROUGH THROUGH THE EMERGING TECHNOLOGIES COMMITTEE THAT WE'RE ACTUALLY HAVE ENTERED KIND OF A NEW ECONOMIC STRUCTURE IN TERMS OF WHAT OUR ECONOMIC FUTURE IS

IN AUSTIN AND IT'S DIFFERENT THAN IT'S BEEN IN THE PAST. SO READ THE POLICY PROFESSIONAL AND THEN I'LL EXPLAIN IT HERE SHORTLY. BUT IT'S THAT I MOVE THE COUNCIL ADOPT THE FOLLOWING POLICY, THAT THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT POLICY SHALL BE EXPAND TO DO INCLUDE A FOURTH ELEMENT, EMERGING TECHNOLOGIES. ECONOMIC GROWTH AND REDEVELOPMENT SERVICES NEW FOCUS ON EMERGING TECHNOLOGIES SHALL INCLUDE POLICIES AND -- DIGITAL MEDIA, FILM, NANO TECHNOLOGY, TECHNOLOGY COMMERCIALIZATION, VIDEO GAMES AND WIRELESS AND COLLABORATION ON ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVES CARRIED OUT IN OTHER DEPARTMENTS AND EXEER PRICE FUNDS SUCH AS CLEAN ENERGY WITH AUSTIN ENERGY.

Dunkerley: SECOND.

Mayor Wynn: SO MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER McCRACKEN, SECONDED BY THE MAYOR PRO TEM THAT TECHNICALLY IS A REVENUE EXPENDITURE NEW.... NEUTRAL AMENDMENT, ABOUT OUT POLICY DIRECTIVE RESOLUTION. IN FACT, I THINK WE ON THE DAIS HAVE FURTHER BACKUP AS TO MORE BROAD WAY THE IMPACT OF THIS DIRECTED TO THE CITY MANAGER.

Dunkerley: I'D LIKE TO MAKE A COMMENT. WHEN I FIRST GOT ON COUNCIL SEVERAL YEARS AGO, THE MAYOR AND I WERE ON A JOINT TASK FORCE TO LOOK AT THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT POLICY. AND WE CAME UP WITH WHAT LEE LIKE TO CALL THE THREE-LEG STOOL. SMALL BUSINESSES, THE LARGE BUSINESSES, AND THEN CULTURAL ARTS. AND I'M VERY HAPPY NOW THAT WE HAVE STABILIZED THAT STOOL AND WE HAVE A FOURTH LEG. SO WELCOME EMERGENT TECHNOLOGY.

Mayor Wynn: COUNCILMEMBER KIM.

Kim: I'D ALSO LIKE TO MAKE A COMMENT IN THAT I HAD THE OPPORTUNITY OF ATTENDING A TALK BY CONGRESSMAN LAMAR SMITH AND HE MENTIONED SOME FACTS THAT I'D LIKE TO SHARE WITH YOU ALL. THAT 50% OF OUR NATION'S EXPORTS ARE IN HIGH TECH. IN TERMS OF THE VALUE OF OUR EXPORTS. 40% OF OUR PRODUCTIVITY GROWTH IS IN HIGH TECH. ALSO WE DESPERATELY NEED PATENT REFORM

IN THE UNITED STATES. ON AVERAGE FOR PHARMACEUTICAL, THE USE LIFE OF A PATENT IS ABOUT 12 YEARS N HIGH TECH IT IS SIX MONTHS. SO AS WE ARE EXPANDING OUR FOCUS ON EMERGING TECHNOLOGIES, WE ALSO SHOULD KEEP IN MIND IT IS AN INTERNATIONAL MARKET, A GLOBAL MARKET AND WITH THAT WE -- I HOPE THAT WE WILL FOCUS OUR ATTENTION AND OUR ADVOCACY IN MAKING SURE THAT OUR COMPANIES ARE COMPETITIVE GLOBALLY, WORKING WITH THE CHAMBER OF COMMERCE WHICH IS EQUALLY POSITION TO DO HELP MAKE AUSTIN AN INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY.

Mayor Wynn: THANK YOU, COUNCILMEMBER. FURTHER COMMENTS? COUNCILMEMBER McCRACKEN.

McCracken: JUST TO KIND OF EXPAND ON WHY IT'S IMPORTANT AND WHY WE'RE DOING THIS TODAY IS THAT, AS MAYOR PRO TEM DUNKERLEY JUST STATED, SHE AND MAYOR WYNN WERE THE LEADERS IN ESTABLISHING A VERY FORWARD-THINKING ECONOMIC POLICY FOR THE CITY OF AUSTIN AND THAT HAS RESULTED IN I THINK WHAT YOU SAW RECENTLY SAYING FIVE YEARS AGO HE WOULD HAVE THOUGHT WE WOULD HAVE LOST OUR SEMI..... SEMICONDUCTOR BUSINESS AND NOW YEAR STRENGTHENING OUR POSITION. THAT IS THE EXAMPLE OF THE BENEFITS OF HAVING A STRONG FORWARD-THINKING ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT POLICY BECAUSE IT IS REALLY PROBABLY SAVED OUR HIGH-TECH ECONOMY LOCALLY. MADE A MEASURABLE DIFFERENCE IN OUR CITY'S FUTURE. WE'RE LEARNING THOUGH THAT IS CLASSIC THAT THE CHANGES IS SO RAPID YOU HAVE TO STAY AHEAD OF THE CURVE AND THE CITIES AND REGIONS THAT DO ARE GOING TO BE THE ONES THE GLOBAL LEADERSHIP IN THE FUTURE ECONOMIES. AND THE EMERGING TECHNOLOGIES COMMITTEE, WE HAVE LEARNED FROM LEADING ACADEMICS, EXECUTIVES FROM OUR MAJOR TECHNOLOGY EMPLOYERS AND SMALL EMERGING TECHNOLOGY FIRMS THAT TWO THINGS, FIRST THE EMERGING TECHNOLOGY SECTOR FORMS A CRITICAL PART OF OUR FORWARD THINK STRATEGY. SECOND THING IS THERE ARE OTHER REGIONS NATIONALLY AND GLOBALLY THAT ARE TAKING A MORE PROACTIVE APPROACH TO EMERGING THEIR TECHNOLOGY SECTORS THAN AUSTIN AND WE CANNOT AFFORD TO SIT

BACK AND MISS THIS OPPORTUNITY TO TAKE OUR EXISTING ASSETS AND MOVE FORWARD IN WHAT IS OUR CITY'S ECONOMIC FUTURE WHICH IS CONVERGENCE OF HIGH TECHNOLOGY INDUSTRIES THE IN FILM, NANO TECHNOLOGY, BIOTECH, THESE INDUSTRIES ARE ALL CONVERGING. FROM THE CUTS FROM THE PREVIOUS THREE YEARS, BUT IF SIMPLE. INTO THESE RESOURCES THAT WE NOW HAVE TO DELIVER THE SERVICES THAT OUR CITIZENS DEMAND AND EXPECT. SO IT'S WHOLLY APPROPRIATE THAT WE CONTINUE TO PLUG AHEAD AND IN FACT PERHAPS EVEN GET OUT AHEAD OF SEVERAL CURVES WHEN IT COMES TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND JOB CREATION AND ULTIMATELY OF CONTINUED RECOVERY FOR THE CITY'S BUDGET. SO THANK YOU ALL. WE HAVE A REVENUE EXPENDITURE NEUTRAL PROPOSED AMENDMENT ON THE TABLE. IT'S AMENDMENT NUMBER 26 BY COUNCILMEMBER McCRACKEN, SECONDED BY THE MAYOR PRO TEM. FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING NONE. ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED? MOTION TO AMEND PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. COUNCILMEMBER LEFFINGWELL.

Leffingwell: MAYOR, CONTINUING WITH ANOTHER MOTION TO ENHANCE OUR TECHNOLOGY INFRASTRUCTURE HERE IN THE CITY, I MOVE TO AMEND THE PROPOSED BUDGET BY INCREASING TRANSFERS TO THE SUPPORT SERVICES FUND AND APPROPRIATING \$30,000 IN THE FINANCIAL ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES DEPARTMENT TO INCREASE FUNDING FOR GRANTS FOR TECHNOLOGY OPPORTUNITIES, SOMETIMES KNOWN AS GTOX.

Mayor Wynn: MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER
LEFFINGWELL, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER McCRACKEN
TO FURTHER AMEND WITH THIS \$30,000. COUNCILMEMBER
LEFFINGWELL.

Leffingwell: MAYOR, THIS IS AS IT SAYS, IT'S A GRANT. THESE FUNDS ARE MORE THAN MATCHED BY OTHER SOURCES, PRIVATE SOURCES TO DISTRIBUTE INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY OPPORTUNITIES IN THE FORM OF COMPUTERS AND TRAININGS, MAINLY TO UNDERPRIVILEGED PEOPLE. AND I THINK IT WILL BE A GREAT ADDITION TO THE BUDGET. IT IS STRONGLY RECOMMENDED BY THE

TELECOMMUNICATIONS COMMISSION.

Mayor Wynn: AGREED. FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED? MOTION TO AMEND PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. COUNCILMEMBER LEFFINGWELL.

Leffingwell: AND NOW WE SWITCH TO TREES. I MOVE TO AMEND THE FISCAL YEAR BUDGET OF THE PARKS AND RECOMMENDATION DEPARTMENT BY INCREASING APPROPRIATIONS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$100,000 AND ADDING TWO F.T.E.S FOR ENHANCING TREE MAINTENANCE ON CITY-WOAND PROPERTY.

SECOND.

Mayor Wynn: MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER
LEFFINGWELL, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER McCRACKEN
TO FURTHER AMEND THE OPERATING BUDGET
SPECIFICALLY WITH \$100,000 APPROPRIATION TO OUR
PARKS DEPARTMENT FOR TREE MAINTENANCE. FURTHER
COMMENTS?

Leffingwell: AND MAYOR, THIS 100,000 -- AS WE MENTIONED IN PREVIOUS COUNCIL MEETING IN A DISCUSSION ON THIS SUBJECT, THERE WILL ALSO BE \$1 MILLION THAT'S BEING PROVIDED IN THE AUSTIN ENERGY BUDGET FOR THE SAME PURPOSE. SO IT ACTUALLY WILL BE A TOTAL OF \$1,100,000 BETWEEN THE TWO.

Mayor Wynn: CORRECT. FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED? MOTION TO AMEND PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. COUNCILMEMBER MARTINEZ.

Martinez: I MOVE WE AMEND THE BUDGET BY TRANSFERRING \$100,000 TO THE TOWN LAKE HIKE AND BIKE TRAIL LIGHTING PROJECT TO PROVIDE LIGHTING ALONG THE TRAIL.

Mayor Wynn: MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER MARTINEZ THAT I WILL GLADLY SECOND REGARDING A \$100,000 TRANSFER ESPECIALLY FOR A C.I.P. PROJECT REGARDING THE LIGHTING OF THE TOWN LAKE HIKE AND BIKE TRAIL. I

CAN JUST SAY THAT WE ALL RECOGNIZE THE REMARKABLE AMOUNT OF USE THE TOWN LAKE HIKE AND BIKE TRAIL HAS EACH DAY, IT'S A REMARKABLE ASSET FOR US, BUT IT'S TIRED AND IT'S BEEN -- HASN'T BEEN MAINTAINED TO THE LEVEL THAT MANY OF US WOULD LIKE TO SEE. AND BASED ON THAT, THERE'S A GREAT ORGANIZATION, THE TOWN LAKE TRAIL FOUNDATION HAS SPRUNG UP OVER THE LAST COUPLE OF YEARS AND THEY'VE BEEN HELPING US IDENTIFY PROJECTS AND THERE'S BEEN SEVERAL PRIVATELY FUNDED PROJECTS OCCURRED ON THE TOWN LAKE HIKE AND BIKE TRAIL. TWO VERY IMPORTANT SORT OF TRAIL RESTRUCTURE PROJECTS JUST THIS PAST SUMMER. EARLIER IN THE YEAR, THAT SAME FOUNDATION DID A PILOT PROJECT WITH A SMALL PROJECT DOWN NEAR WHERE THE ZILKER TRAIN HAS ITS U-TURN. AND ACTUALLY IT'S A SOLAR-POWERED, LOW-PROFILE LIGHTING AND IT'S A SPOT IN THE TRAIL THAT'S VERY DARK AND IT'S A TRIP HAZARD FOR MANY PEOPLE. AND THAT PROJECT HAS BEEN VERY WELL RECEIVED BY MOST USERS THAT I'VE TALKED TO. THE PARKS DEPARTMENT HAVE IDENTIFIED FIVE AREAS OF THE TRAIL THAT ARE DARKER OR MORE DANGEROUS THAN OTHERS, AND THIS \$100,000 LIKELY WOULD ONLY ACCOMPLISH ONE OF THOSE NEXT FIVE PROJECTS. WE'RE ASKING THE PARKS DEPARTMENT AND OUR FRIENDS WITH THE TOWN LAKE TRAIL FOUNDATION TO HELP US IDENTIFY AND PRIORITIZE WHICH WOULD BE THOSE PROJECTS. THERE'S STILL THE OPPORTUNITY TO CONTINUE THE MODEL THE FOUNDATION HAS HAD AND THESE FUNDS COULD VERY EASILY BE USED TO MATCH PRIVATE DOLLARS THAT WOULD LIKE TO EXPAND THE EFFICACY OF THESE DOLLARS. SO IT'S. FRANKLY, A PRETTY SMALL AMOUNT OF MONEY WHEN YOU THINK ABOUT THE FACT THAT THERE'S AN ESTIMATED 1.5 MILLION CITIZENS VISITS A YEAR ON THAT TRAIL. AND SO WHEN YOU LOOK AT IT FROM A SORT OF A CITIZEN USE PER DOLLAR RATIO, THIS IS NOT MUCH MONEY, BUT IT'S FOR A HIGH-PROFILE PART OF OUR COMMUNITY THAT I THINK IS IN DESPERATE NEED. I APPRECIATE EVERYBODY'S SUPPORT TO CONTINUE THE PROGRESS AND MOMENTUM ON IMPROVING THE MAINTENANCE AND JUST THE APPEARANCE OF THE TOWN LAKE HIKE AND BIKE TRAIL, AGAIN, MOTION AND SECOND ON THE TABLE REGARDING THE \$100,000 PROJECT FOR TOWN LAKE TRAIL LIGHTING. FURTHER

COMMENTS? HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED? MOTION TO AMEND PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. COUNCILMEMBER COLE.

Cole: MAYOR, I'D LIKE TO TO MAKE A MOTION TO AMEND THE PROPOSED BUDGET BY PROBE YAIGHT \$90,258 FOR VARIOUS GENERAL FUND DEPARTMENTS AND INCREASE TRANSFERS TO SUPPORT SERVICES IN THE AMOUNT OF -- I'M SORRY. SUPPORT SERVICES FOR DEPARTMENTS FOR A TOTAL OF \$105,042 TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL FUND TO GO REWARD EXCEPTIONAL EMPLOYEE PERFORMANCE.

SECOND.

Mayor Wynn: MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER COLE, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER KIM TO FURTHER AMEND THE OPERATING BUDGET WITH THIS ADDITIONAL TRANSFER OF \$105,042 FOR USE SPECIFICALLY FOR EMPLOYEE PAY PERFORMANCE PAY. FURTHER COMMENTS? COUNCILMEMBER LEFFINGWELL.

Leffingwell: MAYOR, I BELIEVE THIS REPRESENTS A 25% NUMBER FOR THE APPROPRIATION FOR THE EMPLOYEES FOR EXCEPTIONAL PERFORMANCE. OF COURSE, WE WANTED TO DO MORE. AND WITH THE INSTRUCTION TO THE CITY MANAGER OR THE DIRECTION TO THE CITY MANAGER THAT THAT IS OUR GOAL IN THE NEXT BUDGET TO INCREASE FROM 25% TO AT LEAST 35%, SHE WILL BE WORKING ON A PROGRAM TO REVISE AND AMEND THE EXISTING STRUCTURE FOR MAKING THESE AWARDS AND PERHAPS GOING TO A SECOND TIER AWARD, A FIRST TIER AND A SECOND TIER. SO THAT IS OUR GOAL TO REACH THE 30% OR MORE IN THE NEXT BUDGET ON THIS ITEM.

Mayor Wynn: THANK YOU, COUNCILMEMBER. FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED? MOTION TO AMEND PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. COUNCILMEMBER McCRACKEN.

McCracken: YEAH, I MOVE TO AMEND THE PROPOSED BUDGET BY INCREASING THE GENERAL FUND TRANSFER TO THE SUPPORT SERVICES FUND AND APPROPRIATING \$200,000 IN THE OFFICE OF THE CITY AUDITOR TO SOLICIT, NEGOTIATE AND EXECUTE A CONTRACT WITH CONSULTANTS HAVING EXPERTISE IN PUBLIC SAFETY OPERATIONS AND ADMINISTRATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONDUCTING AN INDEPENDENT ASSESSMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY IN THE CITY OF AUSTIN.

Mayor Wynn: MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER
McCRACKEN, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER MARTINEZ
FOR A \$200,000 APPROPRIATION TO THE OFFICE OF THE CITY
AUDITOR SPECIFICALLY FOR A PUBLIC SAFETY
ASSESSMENT. FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING NONE, ALL
THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED? MOTION TO
AMEND PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. COUNCILMEMBER COLE.
I'LL RECOGNIZE YOU AT THIS POINT. COAL TAR SEALANTS
YES, MAYOR, I'D LIKE TO MAKE A MOTION TO AMEND THE
PROPOSED BUDGET OF THE PUBLIC SAFETY AND
EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT DEPARTMENT BY
APPROPRIATING 90,000 AND ADDING TO MARSHALS TO
PROVIDE ADEQUATE BACKUP WHEN SERVING WARRANTS.

Mayor Wynn: MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER COLE, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER MARTINEZ TO FURTHER AMEND THE OPERATING BUDGET WITH A \$90,000 APPROPRIATION FOR TWO MARSHALS. FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED? MOTION PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. MAYOR PRO TEM.

Dunkerley: I MOVE TO AMEND THE PROPOSED BUDGET OF THE AUSTIN PUBLIC LIBRARY BY ADDING FIVE CUSTODIAL POSITIONS TO BRINGING THE CLEANING OF BRAJ LIBRARIES UNDER THE DIRECT SUPERVISION OF LIBRARIES MANAGEMENT. THESE SERVICES WERE FORMERLY DONE BY AN OUTSIDE CONTRACTOR, THUS NO ADDITIONAL FUNDING IS NEEDED, JUST THE FIVE POSITIONS ARE CREATED BY THIS MOTION.

FIVE CUSTODIAL POSITIONS FOR THE AUSTIN PUBLIC LIBRARY DEPARTMENT. FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED? MOTION TO AMEND PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. MAYOR PRO TEM.

Dunkerley: I MOVE TO AMEND THE PROPOSED BUDGET BY TRANSFERRING ONE POSITION AND \$90,860 FROM THE AUSTIN POLICE DEPARTMENT TO THE HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT FOR PROJECT OUTREACH. THERE IS NO FISCAL IMPACT TO THE GENERAL FUND.

Mayor Wynn: MOTION MADE BY MAYOR PRO TEM, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER COLE, AGAIN ON TECHNICALLY A REVENUE EXPENDITURE NEUTRAL PROPOSAL TO AMEND THE OPERATING BUDGET, SPECIFICALLY REGARDING A TRANSFER OF ONE POSITION FROM THE POLICE DEPARTMENT TO OUR HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT. FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED. MOTION TO AMEND PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. COUNCILMEMBER COLE.

Cole: YES, MAYOR, I'D LIKE TO MAKE A MOTION TO AMEND THE PROPOSED BUDGET OF THE AUSTIN POLICE DEPARTMENT BY ADDING ONE FORENSIC CHEMIST IN THE AMOUNT OF \$88,700 TO BE FUNDED BY TRAVIS COUNTY TO ADDRESS ALL COUNTY CASES ON A PRIORITY BASIS. THE FISCAL IMPACT TO THE DEPARTMENT IS ZERO.

Mayor Wynn: MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER COLE, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER LEFFINGWELL, AGAIN TECHNICALLY AN EXPENDITURE REVENUE NEUTRAL PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE OPERATING BUDGET, SPECIFICALLY FOR A COUNTY-FUNDED FORENSIC EXPERT IN OUR POLICE DEPARTMENT. FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED? MOTION TO AMEND PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. SO FOR FOLKS KEEPING SCORE OUT THERE, WHAT WE HAVE DONE, AGAIN, WE STILL HAVE A MOTION AND SECOND ON THE TABLE REGARDING THE OVERALL OPERATING BUDGET, BUT OUR FIRST AMENDMENT TO THAT BUDGET WAS INCREASING THE REVENUE BY \$9,343,270. AND NOW OVER THE LAST HOUR OR SO, WE HAVE TAKEN AND PASSED 35 DIFFERENT

AMENDMENTS TO THAT ORIGINAL MOTION. A HANDFUL OF THESE WERE REVENUE EXPENDITURE NEUTRAL, BUT ULTIMATELY WE SPENT THAT \$9 MILLION AND CHANGE ON ALL OF THESE PROGRAMS AS OUTLINED. THAT GETS US TO A ZERO SUM NOW, BUT WHAT WE ALSO HAVE, WE HAVE OUR FUND AMENDMENTS THAT WE TRY TO ROLL INTO THE OPERATING BUDGET AT THE SAME TIME. SO I GUESS I'D LIKE TO ASK GREG IF HE WOULD READ THE OTHER MAYBE NINE OR SO FUND AMENDMENTS THAT WE'LL JUST ROLL INTO THAT SAME MAIN MOTION.

THANK YOU, MAYOR. AS YOU JUST MENTIONED, THE AMENDMENTS YOU JUST WALKED THROUGH FOR THE GENERAL FUND AND SO ITEM C IS TO WALK THROUGH AMENDMENTS TO OTHER FUNDS AND IN EFFECT THIS IS SINGING UP OTHER FUNDS WITH THE FUNDS YOU JUST MADE IN THE GENERAL FUND. THE FIRST IS AMEND OTHER FUND EXPENDITURES, AUTHORIZE POSITIONS AND TRANSFERS TO REFLECT AMENDMENTS APPROVED FOR THE GENERAL FUND. AMENDMENT 2 IS AMEND THE AUSTIN ENERGY FUND OPERATING BUDGET BY APPROPRIATING \$1,900,000 AND ADDING 26 F.T.E.S FOR ELECTRIC SERVICES DELIVERY TO IMPROVE CYCLE TIME AND FOCUS ON SENATORS DELIVERY. -- CUSTOMERS SERVICE. AMEND THE BUDGET OF THE PARKS AND RECOMMENDATION DEPARTMENT SOFTBALL FUND BY REDUCING REVENUE IN THE AMOUNT OF 186,000 TO REFLECT REDUCTION IN FEES CHARGED FOR LEAGUE PLAY. NUMBER 4, AMEND THE F.Y. 20007 PROPOSED BUDGET OF VARIOUS ENTERPRISE DEPARTMENTS BY APPROPRIATING AN ADDITIONAL 175,280 TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL FUNDING TO REWARD EXCEPTIONAL EMPLOYEE PERFORMANCE. I WANT TO MAKE SURE I DO THIS RIGHT BECAUSE STATE LAW REQUIRES WE DO THIS VERY SPECIFICALLY SO I'LL READ MY SCRIPT. ITEM NUMBER 3. HOWEVER, THE MEDIAN HOME PRICE IN AUSTIN NOW IS ABOUT \$160,000. SO IF YOU HAVE A MEDIAN PRICED HOME OR LESS, YOU ARE GOING TO EXPERIENCE STILL A TAX DECREASE UNDER THIS SCENARIO. I JUST WANTED TO POINT THAT OUT. IT'S NOT A TAX INCREASE FOR EVERYONE, IT'S A VERY SLIGHT TAX INCREASE FOR THE AFTERNOON HOMEOWNER. -- AVERAGE HOMEOWNER.

Mayor Wynn: COUNCIL, IF YOU REMEMBER, ALSO PART OF THE STATE LAW WE HAVE TO TAKE A -- ALTHOUGH WE IDENTIFY ALL OF OUR FOLKS HERE AT CITY COUNCIL, WE TAKE A SPECIFIC ROLL CALL RECORD VOTE FOR THIS MOTION AND SECOND ADOPTING THE AD VALOREM TAX RATE AND I'LL ASK THE CITY CLERK TO CALL THE ROLL. [ROLL CALL VOTE]

Mayor Wynn: SO ITEM 3 PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. THANK YOU ALL VERY MUCH. ITEM NUMBER 4 TAKES US TO OUR FINES, FEES AND OTHER CHARGES. MR. KANALY, CAN YOU WALK US THROUGH THIS?

Mayor Wynn: ALL THREE READINGS. THANK YOU VERY MUCH. FURTHER COMMENTS ON THE MOTION? HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED? ITEM 5 PASSES ON THREE READINGS WITH VOTE OF 7-0. ITEM 6 IS SIMILAR, OUR CIVIL SERVICE ITEM REGARDING OUR POLICE DEPARTMENT.

AGAIN, ITEM 6 APPROVE ON FIRST, SECOND OR THIRD READINGS OF AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH CLASSIFICATIONS AND NUMBER OF POSITIONS IN THE CLASSIFIED SERVICE OF THE AUSTIN POLICE DEPARTMENT AND REPEALING ORDINANCE 20060525-024.

Mayor Wynn: I'LL ENTERTAIN THAT MOTION.

MAYOR, I'D LIKE TO MOVE APPROVAL ON FIRST, SECOND AND THIRD READING ON AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH CLASSIFICATIONS AND NUMBER OF POSITIONS IN THE CLASSIFIED SERVICE OF THE AUSTIN POLICE DEPARTMENT AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NUMBER 20060525-024.

Mayor Wynn: MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER COLE, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER MARTINEZ TO APPROVE ITEM 6 ON ALL THREE READINGS. FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED? MOTION PASSES ON ALL THREE READINGS ON A VOTE OF 7-0. ITEM NUMBER 7 IS OUR PERSONNEL POLICIES.

THANK YOU, MAYOR. ITEM 7, ADOPT A RESOLUTION

AMENDING THE PERSONNEL POLICIES BY INCREASING VACATION ACCRUAL SCHEDULES FOR NON-CIVIL SERVICE EMPLOYEES, MODIFYING POLICY LANGUAGE TO ALLOW FOR NEW DOMESTIC PARTNER BENEFITS AND VACATION ACCRUAL FOR PEACE OFFICERS AND EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT DEPARTMENT.

Mayor Wynn: I'LL ENTERTAIN THAT MOTION.

MOVE APPROVAL.

Mayor Wynn: MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER
LEFFINGWELL, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER McCRACKEN
TO APPROVE ITEM 7, OUR PERSONNEL POLICY. FURTHER
COMMENTS? MOTION PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. COUNCIL, I
BELIEVE WE CAN TAKE UP ITEMS 8, 9 AND 10 TOGETHER AS
ONE MOTION, BUT I'LL LET MR. KANALY CONFIRM THAT AND
PERHAPS WALK US THROUGH THEM.

YES, MAYOR, YOU ARE CORRECT. ITEMS 8, 9 AND 10 YOU CAN TAKE UP COLLECTIVELY. THEY ARE ALL REIMBURSEMENT RESOLUTIONS RELATED TO THE CAP PAL BUDGET OF THE -- CAP PAL BUDGET, AUSTIN WATER AND ENERGY. WHAT THIS ALLOWS IS TO BEGIN PROJECTS, THE BEGINNING OF FUNDING PROJECTS AND SELLING THE DEBT AT A LATER DATE. I'LL READ THEM NOW. ITEM A, REIMBURSEMENT TO DECLARE INTENT TO -- AND \$7 MILLION IN CERTIFICATES OF OBLIGATION BONDS. ITEM 9, REIMBURSEMENT RESOLUTIONS FOR AUSTIN WATER. AUSTIN'S ATTEMPT TO REIMBURSE ITSELF FROM PROCEEDS OF TAX EXEMPT OBLIGATIONS FOR ACQUISITION AND CONSTRUCTION COSTS IN AN AGGREGATE MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$170 MILLION RELATED TO THE FISCAL YEAR 2006-2007 AUSTIN WATER UTILITY CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS. ITEM 10, REIMBURSING RESOLUTION SES FOR AUSTIN ENERGY. APPROVE A RESOLUTION DECLARING CITY OF AUSTIN'S OFFICIAL INTENT TO REIMBURSE ITSELF FROM THE PROCEEDS OF TAX EXEMPT OBLIGATIONS TO BE ISSUED FOR ACQUISITION AND CONSTRUCTION COSTS IN AN AGGREGATE AMOUNT --MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$89,101,000 RELATED TO ELECTRIC UTILITY CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS.

Mayor Wynn: I'LL ENTERTAIN A MOTION ON COMBINED ITEMS 8, 9 AND 10. MOTION MADE BY THE MAYOR PRO TEM, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER McCRACKEN TO APPROVE ITEMS 8, 9 AND 10 AS OUTLINED BY MR. KANALY. FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED? MOTION PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. ITEM 11, IS OUR ACVB PARKING PLAN AND MR. BOB LANDERS AND HIS STAFF HAVE JOINED US. PERHAPS JUST A FEW WORDS FROM MR. LANDER ABOUT THE PLAN AND THE SUCCESS WE'VE BEEN HAVING LATELY. WELCOME, MR. LANDER.

THANK YOU, MAYOR, MAYOR PRO TEM, COUNCILMEMBERS, MADAME CITY MANAGER. WE HAVE ENJOYED RESURGENCE I THINK IS THE BEST WAY TO PUT IT AND WE'VE HAD AN EXCELLENT YEAR AS FAR AS THE CONVENTION MARKET IS CONCERNED. WE HAVE AN ANNOUNCEMENT THAT'S GOING TO COME OUT TODAY I THINK IS EXCITING. WE HAVE REBOOKED ONE OF OUR MAJOR MUSIC CONVENTIONS FOR NEXT JULY WHICH IS 20,000 PEOPLE COMING BACK AGAIN FOR THE CONVENTION KNOWN AS NAM AND IT'S THE INTERNATIONAL MUSIC PRODUCTS ASSOCIATION. THAT WILL COME OUT TODAY AND THEY WILL REBOOK. THEY ARE COMING BACK TO AUSTIN NEXT SUMMER. OUR PLAN MUCH LIKE THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DIVERSITY THAT YOU ALL ARE TALKING ABOUT FOR THE CITY, WE KIND OF MATCHED THAT IN OUT WE'RE GOING TO ATTACK THE MARKET IN UPCOMING YEARS FOR THE CONVENTION MARKET. AS THE ECONOMIC DOWNTURN CAME ACROSS THE COUNTRY AND CAME TO AUSTIN IN THE AREA OF TRAVEL AND HOSPITALITY, I DON'T THINK FIVE YEARS AGO WE WERE PREPARED WITH A DIVERSE MARKET MIX. AS WE LOOK FORWARD, WE ARE PREPARED TO ADDRESS ALL MARKETS ACROSS THE BOARD AND HOPEFULLY HAVE THE FUNDS TO BE ABLE TO ADDRESS THOSE MARKETS, NOT ONLY CONVENTION MARKETS, THE LEISURE MARKETS AND THE MARKETS THAT IN TIMES WHEN WE HAVE SOME [INAUDIBLE] ECONOMY WILL NOT TAKE QUITE SO AN UNCERTAIN DOWNTOWRN AS WE HAVE IN THE PAST. WE'RE VERY EXCITED ABOUT THE FIEW, FUTURE BOOKINGS ARE MOVING UP EVERY DAY AND OUR PRODUCT AND THE INVESTMENT THAT WE MADE IN INFRASTRUCTURE CERTAINLY HAVE

HELPED AND EVERY DAY THE PROMINENCE OF WHAT WE HAVE TO OFFER IN AUSTIN RISES.

Mayor Wynn: GREAT. THANK YOU, MR. LANDER. COUNCILMEMBER KIM.

Kim: THANK YOU, I THINK YOU ARE DOING AN EXCELLENT JOB. I'M HOPING WE'LL BE ABLE TO SEE MORE CONVENTIONS IN AUSTIN. ONE YOU KNOW WE'RE COMPETING FOR IS THE NATIONAL ROWING CHAMPIONS WHICH WAS JUST HELD IN SEATTLE. THAT'S 2,000 VISITORS TO THAT CITY. AND I'M HOPING AUSTIN WILL WIN THE BID FOR THAT NEXT YEAR. I WANTED TO ASK YOU A FEW QUESTIONS HAVING TO DO WITH THE CHANGES OR THE NEW INITIATIVES IN YOUR MARKETING PLAN SPECIFICALLY WITH THE MINORITY CHAMBERS AS WELL AS FOR THE INTERNATIONAL VISITORS, CONVENTION ATTENDEES AS WELL AS VISITORS TO AUSTIN.

SURE. THE POTENTIAL THAT COMES OUT OF OUR INVESTMENT INTO THE MINORITY CHAMBERS IS DIFFERENT FOR EACH GROUP, AS YOU KNOW. THE -- WE'VE HAD SOME TREMENDOUS SUCCESS IN THE HISPANIC MARKET. WE HAD THE U.S. HISPANIC CHAMBER, WE'VE HAD TREMENDOUS SUCCESS IN THAT MARKET. WE ARE NOW EXPERIENCING SOME VERY, I THINK, SIGNIFICANT SUCCESS IN THE AFRICAN-AMERICAN MARKET, BELIEVE IT OR NOT THAT IN THE LAST YEAR WE HAVE PUT ACTUALLY 13 PIECES OF DEFINITE BUSINESS ON THE BOOKS IN THAT MARKET. WITHIN THE ASIAN MARKETS, I THINK THE POTENTIAL ON THE GROUP SIDE OR THE MEETINGS MARKET IS CERTAINLY LESS. THAN WHAT WE INITIALLY COULD HAVE DETERMINED. WE'VE CONTACTED ABOUT 100 DIFFERENT GROUPS IN THE ASIAN MEETING MARKET AND HAVE FOUND THAT THE POTENTIAL FOR AUSTIN NOT TO BE AS SIGNIFICANT AS OTHER GROUPS. HOWEVER. WE THINK THAT MARKET PARTICULARLY IS A MARKET THAT COULD GIVE US SOME SUCCESS AS RELATES TO INDIVIDUAL TOURISTS AND WHAT WE CALL THE F.I.T. MARKET.

Kim: THE WHAT MARKET?

INDEPENDENT TRAVELERS.

Kim: DO YOU HAVE INFORMATION ON VISITORS IN TERMS OF MONEY THEY SPEND AND THE AMOUNT OF TIME THEY SPEND FROM THE VISITORS FROM ASIA OR THE ASIAN-AMERICAN TRAVELER?

YES. WE HAVE THAT -- THOSE NATIONAL FIGURES, AND NATIONALLY AS RELATES TO THE ASIAN MARKET, THAT MARKET IS KNOWN TO BE CERTAINLY A MARKET THAT STAYS A LITTLE BIT LONGER, SPENDS A LITTLE BIT MORE AS IT RELATES TO THE OTHER MARKETS.

Kim: WHAT IS OUR ALLOCATION FOR OUTREACH FOR THE ETHNIC CHAMBERS TO HELP NEWS GETTING MORE HOTEL AND -- HOTEL AND MOTEL TAX?

EACH OF THE CHAMBERS PAID A DIFFERENT AMOUNT, EACH OF THE MINORITY CHAMBERS HAVE PAID A DIFFERENT AMOUNT WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE TWO ASIAN CHAMBERS AND THEY ARE PAID EQUALLY.

Kim: WHAT IS THE AMOUNT THE TWO ASIAN CHAMBERS GET?

\$60,000 COMBINED.

Kim: EACH CHAMBER GETS 30,000?

RIGHT.

Kim: ARE THEIR SCOPES OF WORK DIFFERENT?

THEY ARE NOT. AND THAT IS SOMETHING WE NEED TO ADDRESS BASICALLY BECAUSE OF WHAT I TALKED ABOUT EARLIER, THE POTENTIAL IN THAT MARKET CERTAINLY IS MUCH LOWER THAN IT IS IN THE HISPANIC MEETINGS MARKET OR THE AFRICAN-AMERICAN MEETINGS MARKET.

Kim: SURE, IN TERMS OF CONVENTIONS GEARED TOWARDS THOSE POPULATIONS. I UNDERSTAND THAT. HOW MUCH DOES THE HISPANIC CHAMBER AND THE AFRICAN-AMERICAN CHAMBER RECEIVE FROM THE CONVENTION AND VISITORS BUREAU?

THE HISPANIC CHAMBER IS ABOUT 125,000, AND THE BLACK

CHAMBER IS 90,000.

Kim: SO THE TWO ASIAN CHAMBERS GET 30,000 EACH. WELL, I WOULD LIKE NOT IN THIS BUDGET BUT IN THE NEXT -- FOR THE NEXT YEAR LOOK AT COMBINING THOSE TWO GRANTS INTO ONE. I THINK IT'S IMPORTANT AS WE ARE FOCUSING WITH SUCH SMALL DOLLARS TO REALLY DO WELL IN TERMS OF GETTING MORE ASIAN VISITORS AND AS WELL AS CONVENTIONEERS, THAT IT JUST MAKES SENSE WITH TWO SCOPES OF WORK THAT ARE SIMILAR TO HAVE THAT TO REALLY BE MEANINGFUL FOR THAT TO BE ONE.

WE'LL LOOK FORWARD TO WORKING WITH BOTH ASIAN CHAMBERS. WE'VE HAD VERY LITTLE RESOURCES TO BE ABLE TO ADDRESS THE INTERNATIONAL MARKETS IN ANY SIGNIFICANT WAY THE LAST FEW YEARS. I THINK SOMETHING ON THE HORIZON WE HAVE TO LOOK TO. WE HAVE TO TAP INTO AIR LIFT THAT COMES IN THROUGH HOUSTON AND DALLAS, BUT WE THINK THERE IS POTENTIAL AND THERE'S POTENTIAL IN EUROPE AS WELL AS IN ASIA AND I THINK THOSE ARE TWO THINGS WE NEED TO KEEP IN OUR LINE OF SIGHT FOR SURE. [ONE MOMENT, PLEASE, FOR CHANGE IN CAPTIONERS]

I WOULD LIKE YOU TO TALK A LITTLE BIT ABOUT THROUGH THE QUALITY OF LIFE, YOU FOUND THAT THE OUTREACH INTO THE AFRICAN AMERICAN COMMUNITY HERE SOMETIMES NEEDS TO BE BROUGHT AND BY DOING SO WE'VE BEEN ABLE TO UTILIZE OUR CONTACTS WITHIN THE COMMUNITY NOW AND OF COURSE WITH THE NEW SALESPERSON DEDICATED TO THIS MARKET AND ALSO DEDICATED TO OUTREACH IN THE COMMUNITY, YOU'VE BEEN VERY EFFECTIVE, AND I THINK EVEN TO AN EXTENT THAT WE DON'T FULLY UNDERSTAND. WE'VE BEEN RUNNING TO MIX ON SOME CONVENTIONS THAT PEOPLE IN THE AFRICAN AMERICAN COMMUNITY HAVE SAID BUT YOU DON'T HAVE TO SHOP, WE'RE FINDING THAT IS NOT TRUE, SO WE'RE -- WE NEED SOME PRODUCT IMPROVEMENT, YOU KNOW, IN AUSTIN AS RELATES TO THAT MARKET, BUT RIGHT NOW WE'RE FINDING THAT WE'RE NOT ABLE TO AT... ATTRACT -- WE WERE INCLUDED IN THE FINALS, WE DIDN'T GET IT, WE CAME CLOSE TO THE LARGEST ONE, CALLED NESBI, WHICH IS AN ENGINEERING CONFERENCE, WE WERE

DOWN TO THREE, ST. LOUIS AND ATLANTA, AND THOSE ARE TWO VERY TRADITIONAL AFRICAN AMERICAN DESTINATIONS FOR CONVENTIONS. WE DIDN'T GET IT.

I WANTED TO COMMEND YOU ON THE EFFORT AND COMMITMENT TO WORK ON THIS.

THANK YOU.

Mayor Wynn: FURTHER COMMENTS, QUESTIONS? THANK YOU, MR. LAMBERT. WILL YOU WALK US THROUGH TECHNICALLY WHAT OUR ITEM 11 WILL BE?

THANK YOU, MAYOR. IT'S TO APPROVE THE MARKETING PLAN, EXTEND THE CONTRACT AND AISLE WEED THROUGH THAT, APPROVE A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE AUSTIN CONVENTION AND VISITOR BUREAU 2006 DOCTOR 2007 MARKETING PLAN AND PROPOSED BUDGET IN THET AMOUNT OF \$8,159,156. SET THE CONTRACT TO AVCB. APPROVE NEGOTIATION AND EXECUTION OF NEW AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF AUSTIN AND AVCB, ENDING SEPTEMB th 2011. AS REQUIRED BY THE TEXAS TAX CODE.

OUR BUDGET MONTH AND HER INDIVIDUAL SORT OF DIPLOMACY WORK AS WE FIGURE OUT HOW TO AMEND OUR OPERATING BUDGET IN SUCH A WAY THAT WE FEEL IS VERY EFFECTIVE OF THE DIVERSE NEEDS IN THIS COMMUNITY, SO THANK YOU, MAYOR PRO TEM.

THANK YOU.

SO WITH THAT, AGAIN CONGRATULATIONS TO A CITY MANAGER, HER STAFF FOR BRINGING FORWARD THIS BUDGET AND HARD WORKING STAFF THAT GOT US TO THIS POINT AND GOT US TO THIS MEETING AND IN A SOUND WAY, REALLY APPRECIATE ALL THE WORK YOU DID, WITH THAT I WILL ACTUALLY ADJOURN THE MEETING OF THE ON CITY COUNCIL, BUT DON'T LOSE YOUR SEATS BECAUSE NOW I NEED TO GO AND TAKE UP AS POSTED OUR MILLER LOCAL GOVERNMENT CORPORATION MEETING. AND HOUSING ASSISTANCE FUND BUDGET IN THE AMOUNT OF \$767,626 FOR A TOTAL BUDGET OF \$12,669,729. AND DIRECTING STAFF TO DEVELOP PROGRAM GUIDELINES FOR THE NAME HOUSING PROGRAMS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2006-2007 FINALLY ESTABLISHING ADMINISTRATIVE APPROVAL FOR THE GENERAL MANAGER.

MOTION PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. THERE BEING NO MORE BUSINESS BEFORE THIS MEETING OF THE AUSTIN HOUSING FINANCE CORPORATION, WE STAND ADJOURNED. THANK YOU ALL VERY MUCH.

THANK YOU. ALL RIGHT, COUNCIL, MAYOR, GREG, DO YOU HAVE A FINAL MUSIC THEME FOR US TODAY?

CONTINUE THE THEME AS THE CITY MANAGER LAID OUT IN THE PROPOSED BUDGET LOOKING TO WHAT WE HOPE IS A BRIGHT FUTURE. (music)

COMMEMORATE THE TIME THE FIRST PLANE STRUCK THE FIRST TOWER.

WHILE WE WAIT FOR THE APPROPRIATE TIME, WE'RE GOING TO HAVE A COUPLE MORE FOLKS COME UP AND SAY A FEW MORE WORDS, FIRST OF ALL, OFFICERS. HAS JOINED US THIS MORNING. WANT HIM TO STEP UP AND SHARE HIS EXPERIENCE WITH US AS WELL. THE YOUTH...... EUTHNATION.

Mayor Wynn: HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED. MOTION TO AMEND PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. COUNCILMEMBER McCRACKEN.

McCracken:, MAYOR, IN THIS BUDGET THAT WE'RE CONSIDERING TODAY WE HAVE ALREADY BUILT IN AN INCREASE IN GRAFFITI REMOVAL FUNDING. WHAT WE HAVE LEARNED IN THIS BUDGET PROCESS THAT ACCORDING TO THE STAFF IS THAT YOU ARE OUR CURRENT GRAFFITI REMOVAL CURRENTLY TAKES ABOUT 10 DAYS AND THAT THE STANDARD REMOVAL TIME NATIONALLY IS 24 TO 48 HOURS. SO WHAT WE HAVE IN ADDITION TO THE ADDITIONAL FUNDING WE ALREADY HAVE IN THE BUDGET, I'M PROPOSING ADOPT A POLICY ITEM ON GRAFFITI REMOVAL SO THE COUNCIL WILL ESTABLISH POLICY ITEM AND IN OFFERING THIS I RECOGNIZE THAT THE AMOUNT OF FUNDS WE HAVE APPROPRIATED IN THIS BUDGET WILL NOT GET US TO GRAFFITI REMOVAL IN 48 HOURS, BUT WHAT THIS DOES IS BECOMES A POLICY TO GUIDE US NOT JUST THIS YEAR BUT IN THE COMING YEARS AS WELL. AND SO THE BUDGET POLICY ITEM FROM COUNCIL THAT I'M PROPOSING IS THIS, THAT THE POLICY OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN WILL BE TO REMOVE ALL GRAFFITI VISIBLE TO THE PUBLIC WITHIN 48 HOURS AND THE POLICY OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN WILL BE TO REMOVE ALL GANG-RELATED GRAFFITI VISIBLE ON TO THE PUBLIC WITHIN 24 HOURS. AS PART OF THAT AS WELL THAT THE CITY MANAGER WILL REPORT TO COUNCIL ONCE EACH SIX MONTHS DURING REGULAR PUBLIC MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL ON OUR SUCCESS IN ACHIEVING COMPLIANCE OF THIS COUNCIL POLICY AND AT THAT TIME IF THE CURRENT PROCEDURES, PRACTICES AND BUDGET APPROPRIATIONS ARE NOT RESULTING WITH THE CITY COMPLYING, THE DURING IN REPORT THE CITY MANAGER WILL BE PROVIDING ACTION PLANS AND RECOMMENDATIONS FOR COMING BUDGETS FOR THE COUNCIL, INSTEAD THAT WILL BE NEED TO DO BRING THE CITY IN COMPLIANCE WITH THIS NEW COUNCIL POLICY ON GRAFFITI REMOVAL.

Mayor Wynn: SO OUR 10th PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE OPERATING BUDGET TECHNICALLY IS REVENUE NEUTRAL, EXPENDITURE NEUTRAL, BUT IT'S A MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER McCRACKEN, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER COLE TO OUTLINE THIS PERFORMANCE MEASURE FOR OUR HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT, SPECIFICALLY REGARDING OUR GRAFFITI REMOVAL PROGRAM, AS OUTLINED BY THE COUNCILMEMBER. McCracken: MAYOR, ONE MORE COMMENT. TO REPORT AT THE TRAVIS HOUSE AND GUADALUPE IT'S BEEN MORE THAN 10 DAYS SO THIS WILL BE OUR FIRST OPPORTUNITY.

Kim: MAYOR, THIS IS A MOTION TO HELP OUT WITH THE NEIGHBORHOOD PLANNING TEAMS, AND THEY ARE VOLUNTEERS FROM THEIR NEIGHBORHOODS AND THEY DO NEED SOME ASSISTANCE IN TERMS OF UNDERSTANDING THE PLANNING PROCESS AND KNOWING HOW THEY CAN BE MORE INVOLVED, MORE ACTIVELY AND EFFECTIVELY INVOLVED. SO WITH THIS AMENDMENT TO ADD TO THE BUDGET OF NEIGHBORHOOD PLANNING AND ZONING DEPARTMENT, MY HOPE IS THAT PEOPLE WILL BE ABLE TO --BE ABLE TO GO THROUGH THEIR NEIGHBORHOOD PLANNING PROCESS WITH MORE SUCCESS AND LESS FRUSTRATION AND ACTUALLY PUT MORE IN THERE THAT IS MEANINGFUL

FOR THEIR NEIGHBORHOODS. MY MOTION IS TO AMEND THE PROPOSED BUDGET BY APPROPRIATING \$332,864 AND ADDING 5 F.T.E.S TO INCORPORATE AN ADVANCED TEAM FACILITATION AND TRANSITION TEAM FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF NEIGHBORHOOD PLANS.

SECOND.

Cole: I'D LIKE TO MAKE AN AMENDMENT THAT RECOGNIZES OUR COMMITMENT TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING AND ALSO RECOGNIZES THAT WE HAVE TO SUPPORT A SENIOR ELDER CARE. SO MY MOTION IS TO AMEND THE PROPOSED BUDGET BY INCREASING THE GENERAL FUND TRANSFER TO THE NEIGHBORHOOD HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,200,000 TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR AFFORDABLE HOUSING PROGRAMS AFFECTED BY REDUCTIONS IN FEDERAL GRANT FUNDINGS. AND I'D ALSO LIKE TO SAY THAT I'M VERY PROUD OF THE COUNCIL FOR HOPEFULLY ADOPTING THIS MOTION AND THAT IT WOULD BE CONSISTENT WITH OUR BOND CAMPAIGN.

Dunkerley: SECOND.

Mayor Wynn: SO MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER COLE, SECONDED BY THE MAYOR PRO TEM TO FURTHER AMEND THE OPERATING BUDGET BY INCREASING GENERAL FUND TRANSFER TO OUR NEIGHBORHOOD HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,200,000 AS OUTLINED BY THE COUNCILMEMBER. FURTHER COMMENTS? COUNCILMEMBER McCRACKEN.

McCracken: I THINK WHAT WE HAVE HERE IS A VERY -- A CLEAR EXAMPLE OF THE IMPACT ON LOCAL GOVERNMENTS OF THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT SLASHING COMMUNITY

DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANTS. SO WHAT THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT DOES IS CUT COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANTS AND YET AS WE SAW FROM THE PHOTOS AND THESE REPORTS, THE LINES FOR FOLKS LOOKING FOR HOUSING WAS VERY LONG SO THE NEED IS GROWING AND THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT IS LEAVING US SHORT SO THAT'S WHY WE'RE STEPPING IN TODAY.

Mayor Wynn: UNDERSTOOD. FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED? MOTION TO AMEND PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0.

MAYOR, I'D LIKE TO MAKE THE -- SORRY.

Mayor Wynn: GO AHEAD.

MAYOR, I'D LIKE TO MAKE THE NEXT MOTION THAT RECOGNIZES THE COMMUNITY WORK THAT THE URBAN LEAGUE HAS DONE FOR A NUMBER OF YEARS ON EMERGENCY HOME REPAIR. AS WE DELVE INTO TRYING TO DO SOMETHING ABOUT OUR AFFORDABLE HOUSING PROGRAM, WE HAVE TO RECOGNIZE KEEPING THE STOCK OF EXISTING HOUSING FOR THE ELDERLY AND OTHERS THAT CAN'T MAINTAIN EMERGENCY HOME REPAIR. FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED? MOTION PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. COUNCILMEMBER KIM.

Kim: MAYOR, I'D LIKE TO AMEND THE PROPOSED BUDGET BY INCREASING TRANSFERS OUT FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE TRANSPORTATION FUND BY \$2 MILLION TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL FUNDING FOR STREET MAINTENANCE TO INCREASE A PERCENTAGE OF THE -- THE PERCENT OF LANE MILES MAINTAINED ANNUALLY FROM 8% TO 9% AND I BELIEVE THIS WILL START US GETTING IN THE DIRECTION OF EVENTUALLY NEXT YEAR ATTAINING 10% WHICH SHOULD BE THE STANDARD FOR ALL CITIES TO MEET.

Martinez: MAYOR, I WANT TO PROPOSE TO AMEND THE BUDGET BY APPROPRIATING \$503,672 FOR VARIOUS GENERAL FUND DEPARTMENTS AND INCREASE THE GENERAL FUND TRANSFER TO THE SUPPORT SERVICES FUND IN THE AMOUNT OF \$12,735 TO INCREASE APPROPRIATIONS OF VARIOUS SUPPORT SERVICES FUND DEPARTMENTS FOR A TOTAL OF \$516,407 TO BEGIN A BASIC BILINGUAL PROGRAM FOR SPANISH ONLY STARTING ON THE

PAY PERIOD BEGINNING JANUARY 7, 2007.

SECOND.

AND WHAT MY AMENDMENT WOULD BE WOULD BE ADD SIGN LANGUAGE TO THE BILINGUAL PROGRAM AND TO BEGIN THE START DATE AT A TIME WHERE IT CAN BE FUNDED WITHIN THE \$516,407. NOT INCREASING REVENUE.

AND COUNCIL, THAT CAN BE ACCOMPLISHED RIGHT NOW. YOU HAD IT AT ANY TIME ACTIVELY SET TO BEGIN IN THIS FIRST PAY PERIOD IN JANUARY. YOU COULD ACCOMPLISH THE ADDITION OF THE SIGN LANGUAGE BY DELAYING ONE PAY PERIOD, THE PAY PERIOD FOLLOWING JANUARY 7th. I'D LIKE TO SUBMIT THAT AMENDMENT.

SO I WILL MOVE TO AMEND THE PROPOSED BUDGET BY INCREASING TRANSFERS TO THE NEIGHBORHOOD HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT C.I.P. BUDGET IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1 MILLION TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR THE CITY'S CONTRIBUTION TOWARDS A SINGLE ROOM 5:00 PANSY FACILITY AS RT PA OF........ PART OF THE MENTAL HEALTH FACILITY.

AUSTIN TAKEN RECOGNITION SICKLE CELL HAS BEEN ON THE RISE IN AUSTIN AND IT IS A HEREDITARY DISEASE THAT ESPECIALLY EFFECTS AFRICAN-AMERICANS, ASIAN-AMERICANS AND HISPANIC-AMERICANS. WITH THAT I'D LIKE TO MAKE A MOTION TO AMEND THE PROPOSED BUDGET OF THE HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT BY APPROPRIATING \$50,000 TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL FUNDING FOR SICKLE CELL ANEMIA.

McCracken: I MOVE TO AMEND THE PROPOSED BUDGET BY INCREASING THE TRANSFER TO NEIGHBORHOOD PLANNING AND ZONING DEPARTMENTS C.I.P. PROGRAM BY \$200,000 TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL FUNDING TO THE DOWNTOWN MASTER PLAN AND CODE.

Mayor Wynn: MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER
McCRACKEN THAT I'LL GLADLY SECOND TO INCREASE THE
TRANSFER FOR \$200,000 SPECIFICALLY FOR THE
DOWNTOWN MASTER PLAN. FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING
NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED?
MOTION TO AMEND PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0.
COUNCILMEMBER MARTINEZ.

Martinez: I MOVE TO AMEND THE PROPOSED BUDGET BY TRANSFERRING OUT \$186,000 TO THE SOFTBALL FUND TO ALLOW THE REDUCTION OF SOFTBALL PROGRAM FEES FROM THE HIGHEST CURRENT FEE OF \$378 TO \$300, ALL OTHER SOFTBALL LEAGUE FEES WILL BE LOWERED BY THE SAME AMOUNT OF \$78 AS WELL.

Mayor Wynn: MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER MARTINEZ THAT I'LL GLADLY SECOND, SPECIFICALLIAL CAILGHT

\$186,000 AS ADDITIONAL TRANSFER IN ORDER TO BUY DOWN OR REDUCE THE COST OF TEAM FEES FOR OUR SOFTBALL LEAGUES IN OUR PARKS DEPARTMENT. FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED? MOTION TO AMEND PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. COUNCILMEMBER MARTINEZ.

Martinez: MAYOR, I MOVE TO AMEND THE PROPOSED BUDGET OF THE PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT BY INCREASING APPROPRIATIONS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$100,000 FOR THE AUSTIN INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT, METZ ELEMENTARY HOST PROGRAM.

SECOND.

Mayor Wynn: MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER MARTINEZ, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER KIM TO FURTHER AMEND THE OPERATING BUDGET, SPECIFICALLY TO OUR PARKS DEPARTMENT WITH AN ADDITIONAL \$100,000 FOR AISD METZ'S HOST PROGRAM.

FOR THOSE THAT DON'T KNOW WHAT THE HOST PROGRAM IS, HOST IS A ACRONYM FOR HELPING ONE STUDENT TO... TO SUCCEED, BUT IT'S BASICALLY A ONE ON ONE MENTORING PROGRAM AND IT'S A NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED MOMGDZ. OVER THE PAST YEARS WE FUNDED THIS OUT OF ONE-TIME FUNDING THROUGH THE HOLLY MITIGATION PROGRAM AND I WANT TO THANK ALL OF MY COLLEAGUES FOR SUPPORTING, PUTTING THIS INTO THE GENERAL FUND AND INCREASING THE FUNDING BY 20,000 THIS YEAR UP TO 100. SO I JUST WANT TO SAY THANKS.

Mayor Wynn: THANK YOU, COUNCILMEMBER. FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED? MOTION TO AMEND PASSES ON VOTE OF 7-0. COUNCILMEMBER McCRACKEN.

McCracken: MOVE TO AMEND THE PROPOSED BUDGET BY INCREASING TRANSFERRING TO THE SUPPORT SERVICES FUND AND APPROPRIATING \$150,000 IN THE FINANCIAL ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES DEPARTMENT FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE COLLABORATION OF THE AUSTIN

TECHNOLOGY WIRELESS INCUBATOR PROGRAM.

SECOND.

Mayor Wynn: MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER
McCRACKEN, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER LEFFINGWELL
TO FURTHER AMEND THE OPERATING BUDGET WITH \$150,000
APPROPRIATION SPECIFICALLY FOR THE AUSTIN
TECHNOLOGY WIRELESS INCUBATOR PROGRAM. FURTHER
COMMENTS?

MAYOR, JUST A QUICK BACKGROUND, THIS IS -- THIS EXPANDS OUR INITIAL PARTNERSHIP WITH AUSTIN TECHNOLOGY INCUBATOR IN THE WIRELESS ACCELERATOR WHICH HAS BEEN IDENTIFIED AS KEY EMERGING MARKET IN THE EMERGING TECHNOLOGY SECTOR AS PART OF OUR ECONOMIC FUTURE. ONE BENEFIT OF THIS IN PARTICULAR IS THAT WE ALWAYS HEAR ABOUT GOFTSD FAILING TO --MATCHING FUNDS. NOT MAKING INVESTMENTS IN THE FUTURE. AND IN FACT BY THIS INVESTMENT WE MAKE TODAY UNDER WIRELESS ACCELERATOR, WHAT IT DOES, IT ALLOWS YOU TO EXPAND HERE IN AUSTIN THE NUMBER OF STARTUP COMPANIES ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE WIRELESS. ACCELERATOR AND THAT AUTOMATICALLY MAKES EVERY COMPANY HE... WHO IS NOW ABLE TO ELIGIBLE FOR EMERGENCY TECHNOLOGY GRANTS. WE'RE GETTING A TWO-FER BY DOING THIS BECAUSE WE'RE EXPANDING THE NUMBER OF COMPANIES WHO WILL CBT TO THE ECONOMIC FUTURE IN EE... EMERGENT TECHNOLOGIES AND AUTOMATICALLY MAKING EVERY ONE OF THESE COMPANIES ELIGIBLE FOR THE STATE'S EMERGING TECHNOLOGY FUND AS WELL.

COUNCILMEMBER McCRACKEN, WILL THIS HELP US GET WI-FI AND COMMUTER RAIL?

McCracken: AS YOU SAW TODAY, COUNCILMEMBER KIM, AND I HAVE BEEN TALKING ABOUT HOW IMPORTANT IT'S GOING TO BE TO HAVE WI-FI ON OUR RAIL SYSTEM AND OUR BUSES, WE SAW IN TODAY'S PAPERS THAT THE CAPITAL METRO IS ACTUALLY PUTTING IN PLACE A SYSTEM THAT WILL HAVE WI-FI ON ALL BUSES, RAPID TRANSIT BUSES AND RAIL SYSTEMS. AND SO HOPEFULLY WE WILL MAKE IT WHERE THERE WILL

BE AUSTIN COMPANIES SELLING THEIR CONTENT PEOPLE ARE USING ON THEIR WIRELESS DEVICES.

THAT'S GREAT. I'M LOOKING FORWARD TO IT.

Mayor Wynn: WE HAVE A MOTION AND SECOND TO FURTHER AMEND THE OPERATING BUDGET WITH \$150,000 APPROPRIATION FOR THE AUSTIN TECHNOLOGY WIRELESS INCUBATOR PROGRAM. FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED? THE MOTION PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. COUNCILMEMBER McCRACKEN.

McCracken: IN CONJUNCTION WHAT WE'VE JUST DONE WITH THE WIRELESS ACCELERATOR, WE'VE LEARNED COUNCILMEMBER KIM AND LEFFINGWELL AND I THROUGH THROUGH THE EMERGING TECHNOLOGIES COMMITTEE THAT WE'RE ACTUALLY HAVE ENTERED KIND OF A NEW ECONOMIC STRUCTURE IN TERMS OF WHAT OUR ECONOMIC FUTURE IS IN AUSTIN AND IT'S DIFFERENT THAN IT'S BEEN IN THE PAST. SO READ THE POLICY PROFESSIONAL AND THEN I'LL EXPLAIN IT HERE SHORTLY. BUT IT'S THAT I MOVE THE COUNCIL ADOPT THE FOLLOWING POLICY, THAT THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT POLICY SHALL BE EXPAND TO DO INCLUDE A FOURTH ELEMENT, EMERGING TECHNOLOGIES. ECONOMIC GROWTH AND REDEVELOPMENT SERVICES NEW FOCUS ON EMERGING TECHNOLOGIES SHALL INCLUDE POLICIES AND --DIGITAL MEDIA, FILM, NANO TECHNOLOGY, TECHNOLOGY COMMERCIALIZATION, VIDEO GAMES AND WIRELESS AND COLLABORATION ON ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVES CARRIED OUT IN OTHER DEPARTMENTS AND EXEER PRICE FUNDS SUCH AS CLEAN ENERGY WITH AUSTIN ENERGY.

Dunkerley: SECOND.

Mayor Wynn: SO MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER McCRACKEN, SECONDED BY THE MAYOR PRO TEM THAT TECHNICALLY IS A REVENUE EXPENDITURE NEW.... NEUTRAL AMENDMENT, ABOUT OUT POLICY DIRECTIVE RESOLUTION. IN FACT, I THINK WE ON THE DAIS HAVE FURTHER BACKUP AS TO MORE BROAD WAY THE IMPACT OF THIS DIRECTED TO THE CITY MANAGER.

Dunkerley: I'D LIKE TO MAKE A COMMENT. WHEN I FIRST GOT ON COUNCIL SEVERAL YEARS AGO, THE MAYOR AND I WERE ON A JOINT TASK FORCE TO LOOK AT THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT POLICY. AND WE CAME UP WITH WHAT LEE LIKE TO CALL THE THREE-LEG STOOL. SMALL BUSINESSES, THE LARGE BUSINESSES, AND THEN CULTURAL ARTS. AND I'M VERY HAPPY NOW THAT WE HAVE STABILIZED THAT STOOL AND WE HAVE A FOURTH LEG. SO WELCOME EMERGENT TECHNOLOGY.

Mayor Wynn: COUNCILMEMBER KIM.

Kim: I'D ALSO LIKE TO MAKE A COMMENT IN THAT I HAD THE OPPORTUNITY OF ATTENDING A TALK BY CONGRESSMAN LAMAR SMITH AND HE MENTIONED SOME FACTS THAT I'D LIKE TO SHARE WITH YOU ALL. THAT 50% OF OUR NATION'S EXPORTS ARE IN HIGH TECH. IN TERMS OF THE VALUE OF OUR EXPORTS. 40% OF OUR PRODUCTIVITY GROWTH IS IN HIGH TECH. ALSO WE DESPERATELY NEED PATENT REFORM IN THE UNITED STATES. ON AVERAGE FOR PHARMACEUTICAL, THE USE LIFE OF A PATENT IS ABOUT 12 YEARS N HIGH TECH IT IS SIX MONTHS. SO AS WE ARE EXPANDING OUR FOCUS ON EMERGING TECHNOLOGIES, WE ALSO SHOULD KEEP IN MIND IT IS AN INTERNATIONAL MARKET, A GLOBAL MARKET AND WITH THAT WE -- I HOPE THAT WE WILL FOCUS OUR ATTENTION AND OUR ADVOCACY IN MAKING SURE THAT OUR COMPANIES ARE COMPETITIVE GLOBALLY, WORKING WITH THE CHAMBER OF COMMERCE WHICH IS EQUALLY POSITION TO DO HELP MAKE AUSTIN AN INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY.

Mayor Wynn: THANK YOU, COUNCILMEMBER. FURTHER COMMENTS? COUNCILMEMBER McCRACKEN.

McCracken: JUST TO KIND OF EXPAND ON WHY IT'S
IMPORTANT AND WHY WE'RE DOING THIS TODAY IS THAT, AS
MAYOR PRO TEM DUNKERLEY JUST STATED, SHE AND
MAYOR WYNN WERE THE LEADERS IN ESTABLISHING A VERY
FORWARD-THINKING ECONOMIC POLICY FOR THE CITY OF
AUSTIN AND THAT HAS RESULTED IN I THINK WHAT YOU SAW
RECENTLY SAYING FIVE YEARS AGO HE WOULD HAVE
THOUGHT WE WOULD HAVE LOST OUR SEMI.....
SEMICONDUCTOR BUSINESS AND NOW YEAR

STRENGTHENING OUR POSITION. THAT IS THE EXAMPLE OF THE BENEFITS OF HAVING A STRONG FORWARD-THINKING ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT POLICY BECAUSE IT IS REALLY PROBABLY SAVED OUR HIGH-TECH ECONOMY LOCALLY. MADE A MEASURABLE DIFFERENCE IN OUR CITY'S FUTURE. WE'RE LEARNING THOUGH THAT IS CLASSIC THAT THE CHANGES IS SO RAPID YOU HAVE TO STAY AHEAD OF THE CURVE AND THE CITIES AND REGIONS THAT DO ARE GOING TO BE THE ONES THE GLOBAL LEADERSHIP IN THE FUTURE ECONOMIES. AND THE EMERGING TECHNOLOGIES COMMITTEE, WE HAVE LEARNED FROM LEADING ACADEMICS, EXECUTIVES FROM OUR MAJOR TECHNOLOGY EMPLOYERS AND SMALL EMERGING TECHNOLOGY FIRMS THAT TWO THINGS, FIRST THE EMERGING TECHNOLOGY SECTOR FORMS A CRITICAL PART OF OUR FORWARD THINK STRATEGY, SECOND THING IS THERE ARE OTHER REGIONS NATIONALLY AND GLOBALLY THAT ARE TAKING A MORE PROACTIVE APPROACH TO EMERGING THEIR TECHNOLOGY SECTORS THAN AUSTIN AND WE CANNOT AFFORD TO SIT BACK AND MISS THIS OPPORTUNITY TO TAKE OUR EXISTING ASSETS AND MOVE FORWARD IN WHAT IS OUR CITY'S ECONOMIC FUTURE WHICH IS CONVERGENCE OF HIGH TECHNOLOGY INDUSTRIES THE IN FILM, NANO TECHNOLOGY, BIOTECH, THESE INDUSTRIES ARE ALL CONVERGING. FROM THE CUTS FROM THE PREVIOUS THREE YEARS, BUT IF SIMPLE. INTO THESE RESOURCES THAT WE NOW HAVE TO DELIVER THE SERVICES THAT OUR CITIZENS DEMAND AND EXPECT. SO IT'S WHOLLY APPROPRIATE THAT WE CONTINUE TO PLUG AHEAD AND IN FACT PERHAPS EVEN GET OUT AHEAD OF SEVERAL CURVES WHEN IT COMES TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND JOB CREATION AND ULTIMATELY OF CONTINUED RECOVERY FOR THE CITY'S BUDGET. SO THANK YOU ALL. WE HAVE A REVENUE EXPENDITURE NEUTRAL PROPOSED AMENDMENT ON THE TABLE, IT'S AMENDMENT NUMBER 26 BY COUNCILMEMBER McCRACKEN, SECONDED BY THE MAYOR PRO TEM. FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING NONE. ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED? MOTION TO AMEND PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. COUNCILMEMBER LEFFINGWELL.

Leffingwell: MAYOR, CONTINUING WITH ANOTHER MOTION TO ENHANCE OUR TECHNOLOGY INFRASTRUCTURE HERE IN

THE CITY, I MOVE TO AMEND THE PROPOSED BUDGET BY INCREASING TRANSFERS TO THE SUPPORT SERVICES FUND AND APPROPRIATING \$30,000 IN THE FINANCIAL ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES DEPARTMENT TO INCREASE FUNDING FOR GRANTS FOR TECHNOLOGY OPPORTUNITIES, SOMETIMES KNOWN AS GTOX.

Mayor Wynn: MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER LEFFINGWELL, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER McCRACKEN TO FURTHER AMEND WITH THIS \$30,000. COUNCILMEMBER LEFFINGWELL.

Leffingwell: MAYOR, THIS IS AS IT SAYS, IT'S A GRANT. THESE FUNDS ARE MORE THAN MATCHED BY OTHER SOURCES, PRIVATE SOURCES TO DISTRIBUTE INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY OPPORTUNITIES IN THE FORM OF COMPUTERS AND TRAININGS, MAINLY TO UNDERPRIVILEGED PEOPLE. AND I THINK IT WILL BE A GREAT ADDITION TO THE BUDGET. IT IS STRONGLY RECOMMENDED BY THE TELECOMMUNICATIONS COMMISSION.

Mayor Wynn: AGREED. FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED? MOTION TO AMEND PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. COUNCILMEMBER LEFFINGWELL.

Leffingwell: AND NOW WE SWITCH TO TREES. I MOVE TO AMEND THE FISCAL YEAR BUDGET OF THE PARKS AND RECOMMENDATION DEPARTMENT BY INCREASING APPROPRIATIONS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$100,000 AND ADDING TWO F.T.E.S FOR ENHANCING TREE MAINTENANCE ON CITYWOAND PROPERTY.

SECOND.

Mayor Wynn: MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER
LEFFINGWELL, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER McCRACKEN
TO FURTHER AMEND THE OPERATING BUDGET
SPECIFICALLY WITH \$100,000 APPROPRIATION TO OUR
PARKS DEPARTMENT FOR TREE MAINTENANCE. FURTHER
COMMENTS?

Leffingwell: AND MAYOR, THIS 100,000 -- AS WE MENTIONED IN

PREVIOUS COUNCIL MEETING IN A DISCUSSION ON THIS SUBJECT, THERE WILL ALSO BE \$1 MILLION THAT'S BEING PROVIDED IN THE AUSTIN ENERGY BUDGET FOR THE SAME PURPOSE. SO IT ACTUALLY WILL BE A TOTAL OF \$1,100,000 BETWEEN THE TWO.

Mayor Wynn: CORRECT. FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED? MOTION TO AMEND PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. COUNCILMEMBER MARTINEZ.

Martinez: I MOVE WE AMEND THE BUDGET BY TRANSFERRING \$100,000 TO THE TOWN LAKE HIKE AND BIKE TRAIL LIGHTING PROJECT TO PROVIDE LIGHTING ALONG THE TRAIL.

Mayor Wynn: MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER MARTINEZ THAT I WILL GLADLY SECOND REGARDING A \$100,000 TRANSFER ESPECIALLY FOR A C.I.P. PROJECT REGARDING THE LIGHTING OF THE TOWN LAKE HIKE AND BIKE TRAIL. I CAN JUST SAY THAT WE ALL RECOGNIZE THE REMARKABLE AMOUNT OF USE THE TOWN LAKE HIKE AND BIKE TRAIL HAS EACH DAY. IT'S A REMARKABLE ASSET FOR US, BUT IT'S TIRED AND IT'S BEEN -- HASN'T BEEN MAINTAINED TO THE LEVEL THAT MANY OF US WOULD LIKE TO SEE. AND BASED ON THAT, THERE'S A GREAT ORGANIZATION, THE TOWN LAKE TRAIL FOUNDATION HAS SPRUNG UP OVER THE LAST COUPLE OF YEARS AND THEY'VE BEEN HELPING US IDENTIFY PROJECTS AND THERE'S BEEN SEVERAL PRIVATELY FUNDED PROJECTS OCCURRED ON THE TOWN LAKE HIKE AND BIKE TRAIL. TWO VERY IMPORTANT SORT OF TRAIL RESTRUCTURE PROJECTS JUST THIS PAST SUMMER. EARLIER IN THE YEAR, THAT SAME FOUNDATION DID A PILOT PROJECT WITH A SMALL PROJECT DOWN NEAR WHERE THE ZILKER TRAIN HAS ITS U-TURN. AND ACTUALLY IT'S A SOLAR-POWERED. LOW-PROFILE LIGHTING AND IT'S A SPOT IN THE TRAIL THAT'S VERY DARK AND IT'S A TRIP HAZARD FOR MANY PEOPLE. AND THAT PROJECT HAS BEEN VERY WELL RECEIVED BY MOST USERS THAT I'VE TALKED TO. THE PARKS DEPARTMENT HAVE IDENTIFIED FIVE AREAS OF THE TRAIL THAT ARE DARKER OR MORE DANGEROUS THAN OTHERS, AND THIS \$100,000 LIKELY WOULD ONLY ACCOMPLISH ONE OF THOSE NEXT FIVE PROJECTS, WE'RE ASKING THE PARKS DEPARTMENT AND OUR FRIENDS WITH

THE TOWN LAKE TRAIL FOUNDATION TO HELP US IDENTIFY AND PRIORITIZE WHICH WOULD BE THOSE PROJECTS. THERE'S STILL THE OPPORTUNITY TO CONTINUE THE MODEL THE FOUNDATION HAS HAD AND THESE FUNDS COULD VERY EASILY BE USED TO MATCH PRIVATE DOLLARS THAT WOULD LIKE TO EXPAND THE EFFICACY OF THESE DOLLARS. SO IT'S, FRANKLY, A PRETTY SMALL AMOUNT OF MONEY WHEN YOU THINK ABOUT THE FACT THAT THERE'S AN ESTIMATED 1.5 MILLION CITIZENS VISITS A YEAR ON THAT TRAIL. AND SO WHEN YOU LOOK AT IT FROM A SORT OF A CITIZEN USE PER DOLLAR RATIO, THIS IS NOT MUCH MONEY, BUT IT'S FOR A HIGH-PROFILE PART OF OUR COMMUNITY THAT I THINK IS IN DESPERATE NEED. I APPRECIATE EVERYBODY'S SUPPORT TO CONTINUE THE PROGRESS AND MOMENTUM ON IMPROVING THE MAINTENANCE AND JUST THE APPEARANCE OF THE TOWN LAKE HIKE AND BIKE TRAIL. AGAIN, MOTION AND SECOND ON THE TABLE REGARDING THE \$100,000 PROJECT FOR TOWN LAKE TRAIL LIGHTING, FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED? MOTION TO AMEND PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. COUNCILMEMBER COLE.

Cole: MAYOR, I'D LIKE TO TO MAKE A MOTION TO AMEND THE PROPOSED BUDGET BY PROBE YAIGHT \$90,258 FOR VARIOUS GENERAL FUND DEPARTMENTS AND INCREASE TRANSFERS TO SUPPORT SERVICES IN THE AMOUNT OF -- I'M SORRY. SUPPORT SERVICES FOR DEPARTMENTS FOR A TOTAL OF \$105,042 TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL FUND TO GO REWARD EXCEPTIONAL EMPLOYEE PERFORMANCE.

SECOND.

Mayor Wynn: MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER COLE, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER KIM TO FURTHER AMEND THE OPERATING BUDGET WITH THIS ADDITIONAL TRANSFER OF \$105,042 FOR USE SPECIFICALLY FOR EMPLOYEE PAY PERFORMANCE PAY. FURTHER COMMENTS? COUNCILMEMBER LEFFINGWELL.

Leffingwell: MAYOR, I BELIEVE THIS REPRESENTS A 25% NUMBER FOR THE APPROPRIATION FOR THE EMPLOYEES FOR EXCEPTIONAL PERFORMANCE. OF COURSE, WE WANTED TO DO MORE. AND WITH THE INSTRUCTION TO THE

SO THAT IS OUR GOAL TO REACH THE 30% OR MORE IN THE NEXT BUDGET ON THIS ITEM.

FOR A \$200,000 APPROPRIATION TO THE OFFICE OF THE CITY
AUDITOR SPECIFICALLY FOR A PUBLIC SAFETY
ASSESSMENT. FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING NONE, ALL
THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED? MOTION TO
AMEND PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. COUNCILMEMBER COLE.
I'LL RECOGNIZE YOU AT THIS POINT. COAL TAR SEALANTS
YES, MAYOR, I'D LIKE TO MAKE A MOTION TO AMEND THE
PROPOSED BUDGET OF THE PUBLIC SAFETY AND
EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT DEPARTMENT BY
APPROPRIATING 90,000 AND ADDING TO MARSHALS TO
PROVIDE ADEQUATE BACKUP WHEN SERVING WARRANTS.

Mayor Wynn: MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER COLE, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER MARTINEZ TO FURTHER AMEND THE OPERATING BUDGET WITH A \$90,000 APPROPRIATION FOR TWO MARSHALS. FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE

SAY AYE. OPPOSED? MOTION PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. MAYOR PRO TEM.

Mayor Wynn: MOTION MADE BY MAYOR PRO TEM, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER COLE, AGAIN ON TECHNICALLY A REVENUE EXPENDITURE NEUTRAL PROPOSAL TO AMEND THE OPERATING BUDGET, SPECIFICALLY REGARDING A TRANSFER OF ONE POSITION FROM THE POLICE DEPARTMENT TO OUR HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT. FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED. MOTION TO AMEND PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. COUNCILMEMBER COLE.

Cole: YES, MAYOR, I'D LIKE TO MAKE A MOTION TO AMEND THE PROPOSED BUDGET OF THE AUSTIN POLICE DEPARTMENT BY ADDING ONE FORENSIC CHEMIST IN THE

AMOUNT OF \$88,700 TO BE FUNDED BY TRAVIS COUNTY TO ADDRESS ALL COUNTY CASES ON A PRIORITY BASIS. THE FISCAL IMPACT TO THE DEPARTMENT IS ZERO.

Mayor Wynn: MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER COLE, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER LEFFINGWELL, AGAIN TECHNICALLY AN EXPENDITURE REVENUE NEUTRAL PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE OPERATING BUDGET. SPECIFICALLY FOR A COUNTY-FUNDED FORENSIC EXPERT IN OUR POLICE DEPARTMENT, FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED? MOTION TO AMEND PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. SO FOR FOLKS KEEPING SCORE OUT THERE, WHAT WE HAVE DONE, AGAIN, WE STILL HAVE A MOTION AND SECOND ON THE TABLE REGARDING THE OVERALL OPERATING BUDGET, BUT OUR FIRST AMENDMENT TO THAT BUDGET WAS INCREASING THE REVENUE BY \$9,343,270. SO I GUESS I'D LIKE TO ASK GREG IF HE WOULD READ THE OTHER MAYBE NINE OR SO FUND AMENDMENTS THAT WE'LL JUST ROLL INTO THAT SAME MAIN MOTION.

THANK YOU, MAYOR. AS YOU JUST MENTIONED, THE AMENDMENTS YOU JUST WALKED THROUGH FOR THE GENERAL FUND AND SO ITEM C IS TO WALK THROUGH AMENDMENTS TO OTHER FUNDS AND IN EFFECT THIS IS SINGING UP OTHER FUNDS WITH THE FUNDS YOU JUST MADE IN THE GENERAL FUND. THE FIRST IS AMEND OTHER FUND EXPENDITURES, AUTHORIZE POSITIONS AND TRANSFERS TO REFLECT AMENDMENTS APPROVED FOR THE GENERAL FUND. AMENDMENT 2 IS AMEND THE AUSTIN ENERGY FUND OPERATING BUDGET BY APPROPRIATING \$1,900,000 AND ADDING 26 F.T.E.S FOR ELECTRIC SERVICES DELIVERY TO IMPROVE CYCLE TIME AND FOCUS ON SENATORS DELIVERY. -- CUSTOMERS SERVICE. AMEND THE BUDGET OF THE PARKS AND RECOMMENDATION

MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER MARTINEZ, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER LEFFINGWELL TO APPROVE THESE NINE OTHER FUND AMENDMENTS. FURTHER COMMENTS. HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED? Leffingwell: YEAH, ALTHOUGH TECHNICALLY IT'S AN APPROXIMATE INCREASE AND IS REQUIRED BY STATE LAW TO BE PRESENTED AS SUCH, THE EFFECTIVE TAX RATE, OF COURSE, IS BASED ON AVERAGE PROPERTY VALUES. AND AS WE KNOW, THE AVERAGE HOME VALUE IN AUSTIN NOW IS ABOUT \$208,000. SO IF YOU -- IF YOUR HOME IS WORTH \$208,000, YOU HAVE A VERY SLIGHT INCREASE OF ABOUT \$24 A YEAR. HOWEVER, THE MEDIAN HOME PRICE IN AUSTIN NOW IS ABOUT \$160,000. SO IF YOU HAVE A MEDIAN PRICED HOME OR LESS, YOU ARE GOING TO EXPERIENCE STILL A TAX DECREASE UNDER THIS SCENARIO. I JUST WANTED TO POINT THAT OUT. IT'S NOT A TAX INCREASE FOR EVERYONE, IT'S A VERY SLIGHT TAX INCREASE FOR THE AFTERNOON HOMEOWNER. -- AVERAGE HOMEOWNER.

Mayor Wynn: COUNCIL, IF YOU REMEMBER, ALSO PART OF THE STATE LAW WE HAVE TO TAKE A -- ALTHOUGH WE IDENTIFY ALL OF OUR FOLKS HERE AT CITY COUNCIL, WE TAKE A SPECIFIC ROLL CALL RECORD VOTE FOR THIS MOTION AND SECOND ADOPTING THE AD VALOREM TAX

RATE AND I'LL ASK THE CITY CLERK TO CALL THE ROLL. [ROLL CALL VOTE]

Mayor Wynn: SO ITEM 3 PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. THANK YOU ALL VERY MUCH. ITEM NUMBER 4 TAKES US TO OUR FINES, FEES AND OTHER CHARGES. MR. KANALY, CAN YOU WALK US THROUGH THIS?

ITEM 4 IS FINES, FEES AND OTHER CHARGES AND APPROVING A ORDINANCES AUTHORIZING THE FEES, FINES AND CHARGES. WE HAVE TO APPROVE ON FIRST, SECOND OR THIRD READING OF AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE FEES, FINES AND OTHER CHANGES TO BE CHARGED BY VARIOUS CITY DEPARTMENTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2006, 2007, BEGINNING ON OCTOBER 1ST, 2006, AND ENDING ON SEPTEMBER 30th, 2007, AND AMENDING THE CITY CODE INCLUDING THE ERRATA.

HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE.

OPPOSED? MOTION TO AMEND PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0.

SO THAT WILL TAKE US BACK TO THE MAIN MOTION OF -- BY

COUNCILMEMBER McCRACKEN, SECONDED BY THE MAYOR

PRO TEM REGARDING FINES, FEES AND OTHER CHARGES.

FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR

PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED? MOTION PASSES ON A VOTE OF

7-0. COUNCIL, ITEM NUMBER 5, CIVIL SERVICE ITEM

REGARDING OUR FIVE DEPARTMENT.

THANK YOU, MAYOR. ITEM 5 IS APPROVE ON FIRST, SECOND OR THIRD READINGS OF AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH THE CLASSIFICATIONS AND POSITIONS IN THE CLASSIFIED SERVICE OF THE AUSTIN FIRE DEPARTMENT AND REPEAL ORDINANCE NUMBER 20060608-010.

Mayor Wynn: I'LL ENTERTAIN THAT MOTION.

ONCE AGAIN, MAYOR, I'LL DONATE MY POSITION BACK.

SO MOVED.

Mayor Wynn: MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER MARTINEZ. SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER KIM TO APPROVE ITEM 5, THE CIVIL SERVICE ITEM REGARDING OUR FIRE DEPARTMENT.

AND MAYOR, WE'LL JUST ASK FOR CLARIFICATION HOW MANY READINGS?

Mayor Wynn: ALL THREE READINGS. THANK YOU VERY MUCH. FURTHER COMMENTS ON THE MOTION? HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED? ITEM 5 PASSES ON THREE READINGS WITH VOTE OF 7-0. ITEM 6 IS SIMILAR, OUR CIVIL SERVICE ITEM REGARDING OUR POLICE DEPARTMENT.

AGAIN, ITEM 6 APPROVE ON FIRST, SECOND OR THIRD READINGS OF AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH CLASSIFICATIONS AND NUMBER OF POSITIONS IN THE CLASSIFIED SERVICE OF THE AUSTIN POLICE DEPARTMENT AND REPEALING ORDINANCE 20060525-024.

Mayor Wynn: I'LL ENTERTAIN THAT MOTION.

MAYOR, I'D LIKE TO MOVE APPROVAL ON FIRST, SECOND AND THIRD READING ON AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH CLASSIFICATIONS AND NUMBER OF POSITIONS IN THE CLASSIFIED SERVICE OF THE AUSTIN POLICE DEPARTMENT AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NUMBER 20060525-024.

Mayor Wynn: MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER COLE, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER MARTINEZ TO APPROVE ITEM 6 ON ALL THREE READINGS. FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED? MOTION PASSES ON ALL THREE READINGS ON A VOTE OF 7-0. ITEM NUMBER 7 IS OUR PERSONNEL POLICIES.

THANK YOU, MAYOR. ITEM 7, ADOPT A RESOLUTION
AMENDING THE PERSONNEL POLICIES BY INCREASING
VACATION ACCRUAL SCHEDULES FOR NON-CIVIL SERVICE
EMPLOYEES, MODIFYING POLICY LANGUAGE TO ALLOW FOR
NEW DOMESTIC PARTNER BENEFITS AND VACATION
ACCRUAL FOR PEACE OFFICERS AND EMERGENCY
MANAGEMENT DEPARTMENT.

Mayor Wynn: I'LL ENTERTAIN THAT MOTION.

MOVE APPROVAL.

Mayor Wynn: MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER
LEFFINGWELL, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER McCRACKEN
TO APPROVE ITEM 7, OUR PERSONNEL POLICY. FURTHER
COMMENTS? MOTION PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. COUNCIL, I
BELIEVE WE CAN TAKE UP ITEMS 8, 9 AND 10 TOGETHER AS
ONE MOTION, BUT I'LL LET MR. KANALY CONFIRM THAT AND
PERHAPS WALK US THROUGH THEM.

YES, MAYOR, YOU ARE CORRECT. ITEMS 8, 9 AND 10 YOU CAN TAKE UP COLLECTIVELY. THEY ARE ALL REIMBURSEMENT RESOLUTIONS RELATED TO THE CAP PAL BUDGET OF THE -- CAP PAL BUDGET, AUSTIN WATER AND ENERGY. WHAT THIS ALLOWS IS TO BEGIN PROJECTS, THE BEGINNING OF FUNDING PROJECTS AND SELLING THE DEBT AT A LATER DATE. I'LL READ THEM NOW. ITEM A, REIMBURSEMENT TO DECLARE INTENT TO -- AND \$7 MILLION

IN CERTIFICATES OF OBLIGATION BONDS. ITEM 9, REIMBURSEMENT RESOLUTIONS FOR AUSTIN WATER. AUSTIN'S ATTEMPT TO REIMBURSE ITSELF FROM PROCEEDS OF TAX EXEMPT OBLIGATIONS FOR ACQUISITION AND CONSTRUCTION COSTS IN AN AGGREGATE MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$170 MILLION RELATED TO THE FISCAL YEAR 2006-2007 AUSTIN WATER UTILITY CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS. ITEM 10, REIMBURSING RESOLUTION SES FOR AUSTIN ENERGY. APPROVE A RESOLUTION DECLARING CITY OF AUSTIN'S OFFICIAL INTENT TO REIMBURSE ITSELF FROM THE PROCEEDS OF TAX EXEMPT OBLIGATIONS TO BE ISSUED FOR ACQUISITION AND CONSTRUCTION COSTS IN AN AGGREGATE AMOUNT -- MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$89,101,000 RELATED TO ELECTRIC UTILITY CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS.

Mayor Wynn: I'LL ENTERTAIN A MOTION ON COMBINED ITEMS 8, 9 AND 10. MOTION MADE BY THE MAYOR PRO TEM, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER McCRACKEN TO APPROVE ITEMS 8, 9 AND 10 AS OUTLINED BY MR. KANALY. FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING NONE, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. OPPOSED? MOTION PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. ITEM 11, IS OUR ACVB PARKING PLAN AND MR. BOB LANDERS AND HIS STAFF HAVE JOINED US. PERHAPS JUST A FEW WORDS FROM MR. LANDER ABOUT THE PLAN AND THE SUCCESS WE'VE BEEN HAVING LATELY. WELCOME, MR. LANDER.

THANK YOU, MAYOR, MAYOR PRO TEM, COUNCILMEMBERS, MADAME CITY MANAGER. WE HAVE ENJOYED RESURGENCE I THINK IS THE BEST WAY TO PUT IT AND WE'VE HAD AN EXCELLENT YEAR AS FAR AS THE CONVENTION MARKET IS CONCERNED. WE HAVE AN ANNOUNCEMENT THAT'S GOING TO COME OUT TODAY I THINK IS EXCITING. WE HAVE REBOOKED ONE OF OUR MAJOR MUSIC CONVENTIONS FOR NEXT JULY WHICH IS 20,000 PEOPLE COMING BACK AGAIN FOR THE CONVENTION KNOWN AS NAM AND IT'S THE INTERNATIONAL MUSIC PRODUCTS ASSOCIATION. THAT WILL COME OUT TODAY AND THEY WILL REBOOK. THEY ARE COMING BACK TO AUSTIN NEXT SUMMER. OUR PLAN MUCH LIKE THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DIVERSITY THAT YOU ALL ARE TALKING ABOUT FOR THE CITY, WE KIND OF MATCHED THAT IN OUT WE'RE GOING TO ATTACK THE

MARKET IN UPCOMING YEARS FOR THE CONVENTION MARKET, AS THE ECONOMIC DOWNTURN CAME ACROSS THE COUNTRY AND CAME TO AUSTIN IN THE AREA OF TRAVEL AND HOSPITALITY. I DON'T THINK FIVE YEARS AGO WE WERE PREPARED WITH A DIVERSE MARKET MIX. AS WE LOOK FORWARD. WE ARE PREPARED TO ADDRESS ALL MARKETS ACROSS THE BOARD AND HOPEFULLY HAVE THE FUNDS TO BE ABLE TO ADDRESS THOSE MARKETS, NOT ONLY CONVENTION MARKETS, THE LEISURE MARKETS AND THE MARKETS THAT IN TIMES WHEN WE HAVE SOME [INAUDIBLE] ECONOMY WILL NOT TAKE QUITE SO AN UNCERTAIN DOWNTOWRN AS WE HAVE IN THE PAST, WE'RE VERY EXCITED ABOUT THE FIEW. FUTURE BOOKINGS ARE MOVING UP EVERY DAY AND OUR PRODUCT AND THE INVESTMENT THAT WE MADE IN INFRASTRUCTURE CERTAINLY HAVE HELPED AND EVERY DAY THE PROMINENCE OF WHAT WE HAVE TO OFFER IN AUSTIN RISES.

Mayor Wynn: GREAT. THANK YOU, MR. LANDER. COUNCILMEMBER KIM.

Kim: THANK YOU, I THINK YOU ARE DOING AN EXCELLENT JOB. I'M HOPING WE'LL BE ABLE TO SEE MORE CONVENTIONS IN AUSTIN. ONE YOU KNOW WE'RE COMPETING FOR IS THE NATIONAL ROWING CHAMPIONS WHICH WAS JUST HELD IN SEATTLE. THAT'S 2,000 VISITORS TO THAT CITY. AND I'M HOPING AUSTIN WILL WIN THE BID FOR THAT NEXT YEAR. I WANTED TO ASK YOU A FEW QUESTIONS HAVING TO DO WITH THE CHANGES OR THE NEW INITIATIVES IN YOUR MARKETING PLAN SPECIFICALLY WITH THE MINORITY CHAMBERS AS WELL AS FOR THE INTERNATIONAL VISITORS, CONVENTION ATTENDEES AS WELL AS VISITORS TO AUSTIN.

SURE. THE POTENTIAL THAT COMES OUT OF OUR INVESTMENT INTO THE MINORITY CHAMBERS IS DIFFERENT FOR EACH GROUP, AS YOU KNOW. THE -- WE'VE HAD SOME TREMENDOUS SUCCESS IN THE HISPANIC MARKET. WE HAD THE U.S. HISPANIC CHAMBER, WE'VE HAD TREMENDOUS SUCCESS IN THAT MARKET. WE ARE NOW EXPERIENCING SOME VERY, I THINK, SIGNIFICANT SUCCESS IN THE AFRICAN-AMERICAN MARKET, BELIEVE IT OR NOT THAT IN THE LAST YEAR WE HAVE PUT ACTUALLY 13 PIECES OF DEFINITE BUSINESS ON THE BOOKS IN THAT MARKET. WITHIN

THE ASIAN MARKETS, I THINK THE POTENTIAL ON THE GROUP SIDE OR THE MEETINGS MARKET IS CERTAINLY LESS THAN WHAT WE INITIALLY COULD HAVE DETERMINED. WE'VE CONTACTED ABOUT 100 DIFFERENT GROUPS IN THE ASIAN MEETING MARKET AND HAVE FOUND THAT THE POTENTIAL FOR AUSTIN NOT TO BE AS SIGNIFICANT AS OTHER GROUPS. HOWEVER, WE THINK THAT MARKET PARTICULARLY IS A MARKET THAT COULD GIVE US SOME SUCCESS AS RELATES TO INDIVIDUAL TOURISTS AND WHAT WE CALL THE F.I.T. MARKET.

Kim: THE WHAT MARKET?

INDEPENDENT TRAVELERS.

Kim: DO YOU HAVE INFORMATION ON VISITORS IN TERMS OF MONEY THEY SPEND AND THE AMOUNT OF TIME THEY SPEND FROM THE VISITORS FROM ASIA OR THE ASIAN-AMERICAN TRAVELER?

YES. WE HAVE THAT -- THOSE NATIONAL FIGURES, AND NATIONALLY AS RELATES TO THE ASIAN MARKET, THAT MARKET IS KNOWN TO BE CERTAINLY A MARKET THAT STAYS A LITTLE BIT LONGER, SPENDS A LITTLE BIT MORE AS IT RELATES TO THE OTHER MARKETS.

Kim: WHAT IS OUR ALLOCATION FOR OUTREACH FOR THE ETHNIC CHAMBERS TO HELP NEWS GETTING MORE HOTEL AND -- HOTEL AND MOTEL TAX?

EACH OF THE CHAMBERS PAID A DIFFERENT AMOUNT, EACH OF THE MINORITY CHAMBERS HAVE PAID A DIFFERENT AMOUNT WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE TWO ASIAN CHAMBERS AND THEY ARE PAID EQUALLY.

Kim: WHAT IS THE AMOUNT THE TWO ASIAN CHAMBERS GET?

\$60,000 COMBINED.

Kim: EACH CHAMBER GETS 30,000?

RIGHT.

Kim: ARE THEIR SCOPES OF WORK DIFFERENT?

THEY ARE NOT. AND THAT IS SOMETHING WE NEED TO ADDRESS BASICALLY BECAUSE OF WHAT I TALKED ABOUT EARLIER, THE POTENTIAL IN THAT MARKET CERTAINLY IS MUCH LOWER THAN IT IS IN THE HISPANIC MEETINGS MARKET OR THE AFRICAN-AMERICAN MEETINGS MARKET.

Kim: SURE, IN TERMS OF CONVENTIONS GEARED TOWARDS THOSE POPULATIONS. I UNDERSTAND THAT. HOW MUCH DOES THE HISPANIC CHAMBER AND THE AFRICAN-AMERICAN CHAMBER RECEIVE FROM THE CONVENTION AND VISITORS BUREAU?

THE HISPANIC CHAMBER IS ABOUT 125,000, AND THE BLACK CHAMBER IS 90,000.

Kim: SO THE TWO ASIAN CHAMBERS GET 30,000 EACH. WELL, I WOULD LIKE NOT IN THIS BUDGET BUT IN THE NEXT -- FOR THE NEXT YEAR LOOK AT COMBINING THOSE TWO GRANTS INTO ONE. I THINK IT'S IMPORTANT AS WE ARE FOCUSING WITH SUCH SMALL DOLLARS TO REALLY DO WELL IN TERMS OF GETTING MORE ASIAN VISITORS AND AS WELL AS CONVENTIONEERS, THAT IT JUST MAKES SENSE WITH TWO SCOPES OF WORK THAT ARE SIMILAR TO HAVE THAT TO REALLY BE MEANINGFUL FOR THAT TO BE ONE.

WE'LL LOOK FORWARD TO WORKING WITH BOTH ASIAN CHAMBERS. WE'VE HAD VERY LITTLE RESOURCES TO BE ABLE TO ADDRESS THE INTERNATIONAL MARKETS IN ANY SIGNIFICANT WAY THE LAST FEW YEARS. I THINK SOMETHING ON THE HORIZON WE HAVE TO LOOK TO. WE HAVE TO TAP INTO AIR LIFT THAT COMES IN THROUGH HOUSTON AND DALLAS, BUT WE THINK THERE IS POTENTIAL AND THERE'S POTENTIAL IN EUROPE AS WELL AS IN ASIA AND I THINK THOSE ARE TWO THINGS WE NEED TO KEEP IN OUR LINE OF SIGHT FOR SURE. [ONE MOMENT, PLEASE, FOR CHANGE IN CAPTIONERS]

I WOULD LIKE YOU TO TALK A LITTLE BIT ABOUT THROUGH THE QUALITY OF LIFE, YOU FOUND THAT THE OUTREACH INTO THE AFRICAN AMERICAN COMMUNITY HERE SOMETIMES NEEDS TO BE BROUGHT AND BY DOING SO WE'VE BEEN ABLE TO UTILIZE OUR CONTACTS WITHIN THE COMMUNITY NOW AND OF COURSE WITH THE NEW SALESPERSON DEDICATED TO THIS MARKET AND ALSO DEDICATED TO OUTREACH IN THE COMMUNITY. YOU'VE BEEN VERY EFFECTIVE, AND I THINK EVEN TO AN EXTENT THAT WE DON'T FULLY UNDERSTAND, WE'VE BEEN RUNNING TO MIX ON SOME CONVENTIONS THAT PEOPLE IN THE AFRICAN AMERICAN COMMUNITY HAVE SAID BUT YOU DON'T HAVE TO SHOP, WE'RE FINDING THAT IS NOT TRUE, SO WE'RE -- WE NEED SOME PRODUCT IMPROVEMENT, YOU KNOW, IN AUSTIN AS RELATES TO THAT MARKET, BUT RIGHT NOW WE'RE FINDING THAT WE'RE NOT ABLE TO AT... ATTRACT -- WE WERE INCLUDED IN THE FINALS, WE DIDN'T GET IT, WE CAME CLOSE TO THE LARGEST ONE, CALLED NESBI. WHICH IS AN ENGINEERING CONFERENCE. WE WERE DOWN TO THREE, ST. LOUIS AND ATLANTA, AND THOSE ARE TWO VERY TRADITIONAL AFRICAN AMERICAN DESTINATIONS FOR CONVENTIONS. WE DIDN'T GET IT.

I WANTED TO COMMEND YOU ON THE EFFORT AND COMMITMENT TO WORK ON THIS.

THANK YOU.

Mayor Wynn: FURTHER COMMENTS, QUESTIONS? THANK YOU, MR. LAMBERT. WILL YOU WALK US THROUGH TECHNICALLY WHAT OUR ITEM 11 WILL BE?

THANK YOU, MAYOR. IT'S TO APPROVE THE MARKETING PLAN, EXTEND THE CONTRACT AND AISLE WEED THROUGH THAT, APPROVE A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE AUSTIN CONVENTION AND VISITOR BUREAU 2006 DOCTOR 2007 MARKETING PLAN AND PROPOSED BUDGET IN THET AMOUNT OF \$8,159,156. SET THE CONTRACT TO AVCB. APPROVE NEGOTIATION AND EXECUTION OF NEW AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF AUSTIN AND AVCB, ENDING SEPTEMB th 2011. AS REQUIRED BY THE TEXAS TAX CODE.

Mayor Wynn: I'LL ENTERTAIN THAT MOTION, ITEM NUMBER 11.

MAYOR, MOVE APPROVAL.

MOTION MADE BY COUNCILMEMBER KIM, SECOND MADE BY

COUNCILMEMBER COLE. FURTHER COMMENTS? HEARING NON, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR PLEASE SAY AYE. AYE, OPPOSED, MOTION PASSES ON A VOTE OF 7-0. ITEM NUMBER 12, MR. CANALE.
