Chapter 10-3 Public Health Services & Sanitation

- Definition based on trailers being "mobile"
- Focuses on the trailer and not the property location
- Rules currently stipulate that all equipment, including trash containers, must be attached to the unit.
- When waste is removed from the unit, it must be disposed of at the Central Preparation Facility.

Health Department estimates that there are 1400 trailers and 18 food courts.





- Chapter 10-3 regulates the individual vendor, not the property owner.
- Universal Recycling Ordinance identifies the responsible party as the property owner.
- No current land use classification or permitted use process for mobile food courts.





- How to ensure mobile food vendors and permanent food establishments are on a level playing field?
- Do you regulate the vendor or the property owner? Who is responsible party?

Proposed objective of stakeholder meetings:

To provide recommendations to the ZWAC URO Committee, including possible City code amendments, that would require mobile food courts and vendors to recycle [and compost] in consideration of food safety and other City code requirements.









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
