PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1949 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, front-gabled, hollow-tile bungalow with a partial-width, front-gabled independent porch on ornamental metal posts; wood siding in the tympanum of both main and porch gables; metal-framed multi-light casement windows.

RESEARCH

The house appears to have been built around 1949; there is a 1948 city water permit to Wendon Thiele, who with his wife, Asilee, owned and occupied the house until they passed away. Because this house was outside the city limit, there is no building permit on file, nor is there any entry in the city directories prior to 1955 indicating the presence of the house or Wendon Thiele in Austin. Wendon Thiele was a butcher in a meat market, who later went into the wholesale grocery business, with offices at this house.

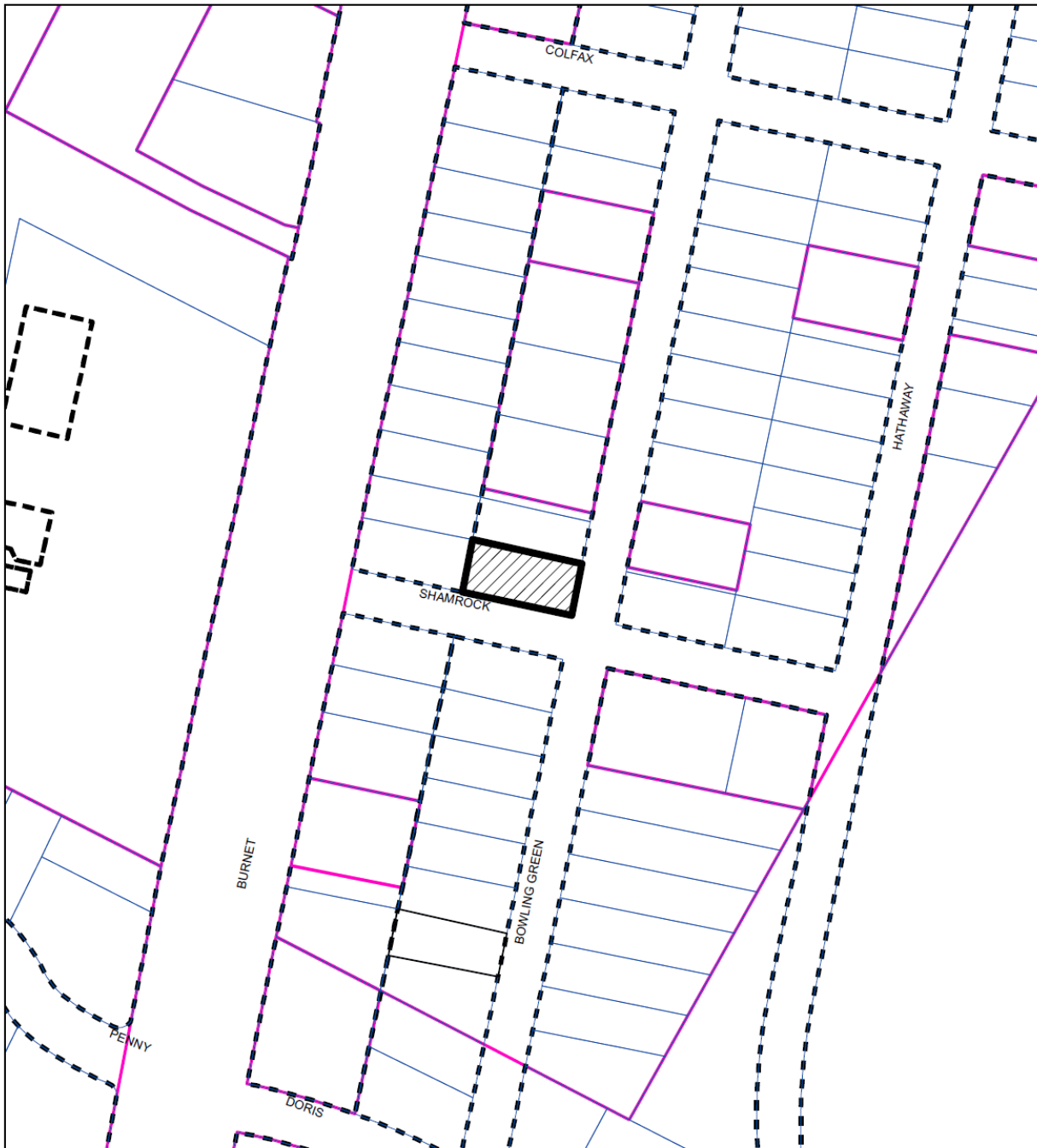
STAFF COMMENTS

The house is beyond the bounds of any City survey.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Release the demolition permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. The house represents a relatively rare construction material in residential building in Austin, but has neither the architectural nor the historical significance to warrant individual designation as a historic landmark.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

Wendon W. and Asilee P. Thiele (ca. 1957 – ca. 1986)

Wendon Thiele appears in the 1940 U.S. Census as the 33-year old divorced son of Otto and Dina Thiele, who lived at 4101 Marathon Boulevard. Wendon Thiele had been born in Texas, and was a butcher at a retail meat market, as was his father. The 1930 U.S. Census shows Wendon and Mary Thiele renting a house at 404 W. 25th Street in Austin. He was a butcher in a meat market; she had no occupation listed.

Wendon W. Thiele

Wendon W. Thiele, 80, of Austin, died at home Monday, November 17, 1986.

A lifelong Austin resident, he was born of November 4, 1906. Mr. Thiele owned and operated his own produce business for 34 years until his retirement in 1978.

Funeral services will be held at 1:00 PM, Wednesday in the Colonial Chapel of the Cook-Walden Funeral Home, with Reverend Gary Bowie officiating. Interment will be in Capital Memorial Gardens.

Mr. Thiele was the husband of Asilee Smith Thiele; father of Elizabeth (Ann) Niemann; grandfather of Ronald Eugene and Randy Allen, Tammy Lynn Niemann; and brother of Gertrude Thiele, all fo Austin.
