On March 28, 2013, City Council approved Ordinance No. 20130328-015 establishing classifications and positions in the classified service of the Emergency Medical Services Department.						
On June 27, 2013, City Council repealed Ordinance No. 20130328-015 and replaced it with Ordinance No. 20130627- 032. This ordinance reclassified seven (7) Medic II – Field positions to Medic I – Field positions for the purpose of hiring entry level Medic I positions under the department's new staffing model. The ordinance also added twenty- four (24) additional Medic I – Field FTEs funded by Travis County, as a result of Amendment Five to the Agreement Between the City of Austin and Travis County for Emergency Medical Service, to allow staffing of one new 24/7 ambulance in East Travis County and allow the conversion of two 12/7 Demand Ambulances to 24/7 staffing, one in northeast and the second in southwest Travis County. This ordinance increased the total number of classified positions in the Field Division by twenty-four (24) and increased the total number of positions from 451 to 475. The department is reclassifying seven (7) Medic II – Field positions to Medic I – Field positions for the purpose of						
hiring entry level Medic I positions under the department's new staffing model.						

This ordinance repeals Ordinance No. 20130627-032. The civil service classifications of the Emergency Medical Services and the number of positions in each classification are established as follows:
