



The CCAG will:

- Ensure open and transparent public process
- Advise Mayor and project team in prioritizing and defining a preferred alignment for the next high-capacity transit investment for the Central Corridor
- Assist project team in a meaningful dialogue with the community



- Frequency: Monthly Meetings, typically Fridays at 1:30
- Location: Austin City Hall, Boards & Commissions room (typically)
- Agendas: Published in advance, available online
- Video: Channel 6, available on-demand
- Public Involvement: During milestone meetings, via website and email, community workshops





- A partnership between Central Texas transportation agencies
- A regional, long-range high-capacity transit system plan for Central Texas

High-Capacity Transit

- Has one or both of the following:
 - Dedicated lane/right-of way for at least a portion
 - Transit priority
- Fewer stops, higher speeds, more frequent service, carries more people
- Congestion Resistant/Proof






Vision Map



- 5. Corridors ranked







- Plan is to link Centers with transit




Central Corridor (cont.)

- 166,500 Residents
- 197,000 Employees (23% of Region)
- 269,000 Daily Work Trips to Central
- 47,000 Daily Work Trips <u>within</u>
 Central

Projected Growth 2010-2035

- 42% Population increase
- 48% Employment increase





- Work Plan will be presented to CCAG at August meeting



Central Corridor Work Plan (cont.)


- Work Plan Objectives:

 - Select Preferred Alternative for Potential Bond Election and Advancement into Environmental
 - Develop Project Funding Plan Capital and O&M Costs






