If approved, funding will be provided for a one-year contract to Business Investment Growth (BiGAustin). BiGAustin will provide training and technical assistance to at least 33 eligible microenterprise firms. These services include: certifying eligible microenterprise businesses; training activities on topics such as marketing, sales, financial management, how to write a loan proposal, and how to manage small business taxes; technical assistance to existing businesses seeking to expand; and direct assistance with developing marketing plans. The contract term shall be from October 1, 2013 to September 30, 2014.

The Microenterprise Technical Assistance (META) program provides operational funds for the administration of training and technical assistance for qualified microenterprises in the City of Austin. HUD defines a microenterprise as either: 1) a business with five or fewer employees, one being the owner; or 2) an individual who is actively working towards developing a business that is expected to be a microenterprise.
