This contract is for the purchase of approximately 23,185 linear feet of eight-foot tall game fencing at three separate locations (Lime Creek, Park West, and Coldwater) within the Balcones Canyonlands Preserve. The Wildland Conservation Division is made up of the Balcones Canyonlands Preserve program and the Water Quality Protection Lands program protecting over 40,000 acres of land from roughly Cedar Park to Kyle. The BCP was established as a result of a federal permit issued to the City of Austin and Travis County to authorize impacts to eight endangered species. This permit requires active management and protection of these endangered species in the preserve. Fencing is identified as part of the BCP land management plan to minimize trespass impacts. The game fencing is also needed for deer management on the preserve to maximize hardwood production. The existing fencing is old barbed wire fencing, and much of it is not intact and therefore does not serve the needed purpose.
