These agreements will provide the City of Austin with five independent Contractors to serve as Protest Hearing Officers on a rotational basis. The Hearing Officers will conduct hearings for protests of the solicitation process, protests of the City's MBE/WBE Business Procurement Program and protests of disqualifications resulting from the City's Anti-Lobbying ordinance. This contract will be utilized by FSD, CMD and SMBR departments of the City of Austin.

These various protest processes use an external hearing officer to review information presented by the protester and the City. The Hearing Officer conducts the hearing and produces a fact-finding report consistent with City of Austin policies. The Purchasing Officer uses the report in deciding the final outcome of the protests.

The City will select a hearings officer from the list on a rotational basis as requirements arise. The City will contact the first of the Hearings Officers, determine availability, and issue a purchase order for the service. As the second requirement arises, the City will contact the second Hearings Officer in the rotation, et cetera, until the list has been cycled, and then will return to the first listed again. If during the course of the contract term a Hearing Officer cannot provide the required services according to the City's schedule, the City will move on to the next available Hearing Officer in the rotation.
