## PROPOSAL

Relocate a ca. 1946 house to outside the City.

## ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, hipped-roof, rock veneered frame house with a recessed roundarched entry and paired 1:1 fenestration.

#### RESEARCH


The house was built around 1946 by Cecil E. Dudley, but it is not clear if he ever lived in the house. The address first appears in the city directory of 1949. The first known owners and occupants were Mancel and Myrtis Shelton, who lived here from 1948 until around 1975, when Mancel passed away. Mancel Shelton was a school custodian; Myrtis Shelton was a school helper. Rick Glasebrook, who was employed by United Parcel Service, is listed as the owner of the house in the 1980s; the house was vacant in the early 1990s.

## STAFF COMMENTS

The house is beyond the bounds of any City survey.

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Release the permit upon completion of a City Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. The house has neither the architectural nor the historical significance to warrant individual designation as a historic landmark.

#### **BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES:**

## Mancel and Myrtis Shelton (ca. 1949 - ca. 1975)

Mancel and Myrtis Shelton appear in the 1940 U.S. Census as the renters of a house at 208 Leland Street in South Austin, where they lived prior to moving into this house. Mancel Shelton was then 42, had been born in Texas, and was a janitor in the public schools. Myrtis Shelton was then 40, had been born in Texas, and was a helper in the public schools. They had 3 children and 3 female lodgers living with them. None of their children had occupations listed; their female lodgers were all waitresses at a creamery.
