The House on 51<sup>st</sup> Street.

The house was built in 1942 during WW2. The roof instead of using plywood because of the shortage during the war, was sheetrock instead of plywood. This lasted about 10 years. In 1952 the home was remodeled and stone was added to the exterior of the home, during the remodel a dining room was added. The exterior siding and the subfloor of the existing home was used to build a new garage. The original hardwood floors are seen in the garage as well as the subflooring that was originally below the hardwood floors. As it stands now there is no subfloor in the home. You can see this from the crawlspace. You can see the original date carved into the concrete at the front porch, it says 1952 and someones initial. The roof over the main bedroom is warped due to incorrect framing in the valley of the roof and I have rebraced it several times. The living room that was added had termite damage and had to be repaired and have the concrete slab removed 10 years ago because of the termite infestation. The garage has been treated for termite damage as well. You could push the structure down with very little effort due to termite damage. The house was sold to me by the second owner and told me the story. No one famous has ever lived in this house. I am the third owner and have been living here since 1997.
