PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1936 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, side-gabled, frame house with a central, shed-roofed entry cover over the front door; single 1:1 fenestration.

RESEARCH

The house appears to have been built around 1936 – the address first appear in the city directory of 1937 as the rented home of T.L. and Geneva Davis, who lived here until around 1938. T.L. Davis was a salesman for JC Penney department store. Rankin and Elizabeth Rylander are listed as the next renters of the house, from around 1938 through about 1940. Rankin Rylander was a drug store clerk. A station attendant, L. Homer Glenn, is shown as the next renter. The 1940 U.S. Census shows him with a wife, Leola, in San Antonio, Texas, but Leola is not listed in the 1941 city directory for Austin. A State Highway road construction laborer, Guy H. Stevenson, and his wife, Lula rented the house through the late 1940s; the longest-term tenant resided in the house from the mid-1950s until around 1960. Mrs. Bullard was employed at the Austin Laundry and Dry Cleaning Company. Lorene Franklin, a waitress, is listed as the owner of the house from around 1960 through the 1990s. She worked at Youngblood's Fried Chicken and at Hill's Café on South Congress Avenue.


STAFF COMMENTS

The house is not listed in any city survey.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Recommend relocation over demolition, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. While the house has little individual historical or architectural distinction, it is a good example of mid-1930s working-class residential architecture in Austin.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

Thomas L. and Geneva Davis (ca. 1936 – ca. 1938)

T.L. and Geneva Davis appear in the 1940 U.S. Census for San Antonio, Texas. T.L. Davis was then 27, had been born in Texas, and was in advertising for a department store. Geneva Davis was then 25, had been born in Texas, and was a saleslady in a five-and-dime store. They had no children listed with them. The census report notes that T.L. and Geneva Davis had lived in Austin in 1935.

Rankin and Elizabeth Rylander (ca. 1938 – ca. 1940)

Rankin and Elizabeth Rylander appear in the 1940 U.S. Census for San Marcos, Texas. Rankin Rylander was then 26, had been born in Texas, and was a salesman for a retail drug store. He had lived in Austin in 1935. Elizabeth Rylander was then 24, had been born in Texas, and was a clerk in a retail drug store. She had lived in Fort Worth in 1935.

L. Homer and Leola Glenn (ca. 1940 – ca. 1944)

L. Homer and Leola Glenn are listed in the 1940 U.S. Census as the renters of 302 E. 14th Street in Austin. L. Homer Glenn was then 40, had been born in Texas, and was the attendant

at a storage garage. Leola Glenn was then 30, had been born in Texas, and was a service observer for the telephone company. They had lived in Temple, Texas in 1935.

Myrtle (Mrs. Elmer) Bullard (ca. 1954 – ca. 1960)

Myrtle and Elmer Bullard are listed in the 1940 U.S. Census for Hico, Texas, where Elmer Bullard was a 40-year old Texas-born highway construction laborer. Myrtle Bullard was a 39-year old Texas-born laundress at home. They had 6 children, ranging in age from 2 to 17.

MRS. E. E. BULLARD

Mrs. E. E. Bullard, 84, of 5407 Chesterfield Dr., died in a local hospital Monday afternoon. She was a member of the Methodist Church and had been a resident of Austin for 26 years.

Survivors include two daughters, Mrs Madge Vickers of Austin and Mrs. Lois Blackwell of Beaufort; six sons, Alfred Bullard of St. Louis, Mo., Eddie Bullard and Noble Bullard, both of Austin, Owen Bullard of Elgin, Olen Bullard of Borger and Arlon Bullard of Los Angeles, Calif.; two sisters, Grace Brownlee of Heavener, Okla., and Mrs. Minnie Black of Poteau, Okla.; one brother, Will Sweeten of Poteau, Okla.; 13 grandchildren; three great-grandchildren.

The body will lie in state at Hyltin-Manor Funeral Home until noon Wednesday, at which time it will be taken to the Lawrence Chapel near Elgin for services at 3 p.m. Rev. Howard Buchanan officiating. Burial will be in Lawrence Chapel Cemetery.
