12 ~~[(5)]~~ (6) the primary propulsion engine of a motor vehicle providing a power source
13 necessary for mechanical operation, ~~[not including]~~ other than propulsion,
14 and/or passenger compartment heating, or air conditioning;

15 ~~[(6)]~~ (7) the primary propulsion engine of a motor vehicle being operated for
16 maintenance or diagnostic purposes;

17 ~~[(7)]~~ (8) the primary propulsion engine of a motor vehicle being operated solely to
18 defrost a windshield;

19 ~~[(8)]~~ (9) the primary propulsion engine of a motor vehicle that is being used to supply
20 heat or commercial or public passenger transportation or passenger transit
21 operations, in which case idling up to a maximum of 30 minutes is allowed
22 air conditioning necessary for passenger comfort and safety in vehicles
23 intended for;

24 ~~[(9)]~~ (10) the primary propulsion engine of a motor vehicle being used to provide air
25 conditioning or heating necessary for employee health or safety while the
26 employee is using [a] the vehicle to perform an essential job function related
27 to roadway construction or maintenance;

28 ~~[(10)]~~ (11) the primary propulsion engine of a motor vehicle being used as airport
29 ground support equipment;

30 ~~[(11)]~~ (12) the owner of a motor vehicle rented or leased to a person who operates the
31 vehicle and is not employed by the owner; or

32 ~~[(12)]~~ (13) a motor vehicle when idling is necessary to power a heater or air conditioner
33 while a driver is using the vehicle's sleeper berth for a government-
34 mandated rest period and is not within two miles of a facility offering
35 external heating and air conditioning connections at a time when those
