INDEMNIFICATION, LIMITATION OF LIABILITY AND INSURANCE ADDENDUM TO AGREEMENT FOR PRODUCTS/SERVICES BETWEEN

Thermo Electron North America LLC (Seller)
AND
City of Austin (Buyer)

Notwithstanding anything contained in the above-referenced Agreement for Products/Services (the "Agreement") to the contrary, the terms and conditions of this Addendum shall govern the rights and obligations of the parties hereto and in the event of a conflict between the provisions of this Addendum and the Agreement, the provisions of this Addendum shall prevail.

INDEMNIFICATION AND LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

Seller agrees to indemnify, defend and save Buyer, its officers, directors, employees, agents and representatives hamless from all losses, expenses, demands and claims made against Buyer, its officers, directors, employees, agents or representatives because of any personal injury, death or property damage to the extent caused by the negligence or willful misconduct of Seller, its employees, agents or representatives in connection with the performance of Seller' obligations under this Agreement; provided, however, that in no event shall Seller be liable for any indirect, special, consequential or incidental damages, regardless of whether Seller (a) has been informed of the possibility of such damages or (b) is negligent. The Buyer shall provide prompt written notice of any third party claim covered hereunder to the Seller. The Seller shall have the right to assume exclusive control of the defense of such claim or; at the option of the Seller, to settle the same. The Buyer agrees to cooperate reasonably with the Indemnifying Party in connection with the performance by the Seller of its obligations under this Addendum. Notwithstanding the above, Seller's liability for indemnification and damages, in the aggregate, shall be limited to an amount equal to the lesser of (a) the total purchase price theretofore paid by Buyer to Seller with respect to the product(s) giving rise to such liability or (b) one million dellars (\$1,000,000).

INSURANCE

Seller will maintain and carry hability insurance which includes but is not limited to employer's liability, workmen's compensation, general liability, public liability, property damage liability, product liability, completed operations liability and contractual liability in amounts set forth below with insurance companies rated A or better by "A.M. BEST" rating services.
