Call to Order: Staff called the Board Meeting to order at 5:35 p.m.

1. CITIZEN COMMUNICATION: GENERAL

No citizen communication occurred.

2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

4. NEW BUSINESS

A. Introductions of Attendees

Everyone present gave a brief introduction of themselves and why they were interested in walking issues

B. History of PAC Creation

Staff gave an overview of the Pedestrian Advisory Council. The Walkability Summit in May indicated the need for an advocacy organization and a Pedestrian Advisory Coalition. WalkAustin was created to fulfill the advocacy role and that group worked with Council Member Riley’s office throughout the summer, presenting to the Urban Transportation Commission and the Bicycle Advisory Council to work out logistics of collaboration. WalkAustin announced the creation of the PAC in September.

C. What Role Does a PAC Play?

Staff discussed the role that a PAC can assume in Austin, and differentiated between an advisory council and an advocacy organization.

D. Next Steps

1. Identify First Staff Presentations

In order to identify possible staff presentations, priority issues were identified. The group identified the following issues:

North Lamar, north of 183, north of rundberg, East riverside	pedestrian in that parking lot	Quality of sidewalk, width, circuitous, etc.
Issue of enforcement	South congress, south Austin, places to walk to but not walkable, walking through parking lots,	Look at older, neglected neighborhoods first, sidewalk and walkabililty needs to be met, upgrading/bringing up to code,
Del Valle	Entire zip codes of 78744, 78745	Crosswalks, cars don’t recognize ped rights
