Call to Order: Staff called the Board Meeting to order at 5:35 p.m.

1. CITIZEN COMMUNICATION: GENERAL

2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A. Introductions of Attendees

B. History of PAC Creation

Staff gave an overview of the Pedestrian Advisory Council. The Walkability Summit in May indicated the need for an advocacy organization and a Pedestrian Advisory Coalition. WalkAustin was created to fulfill the advocacy role and that group worked with Council Member Riley's office throughout the summer, presenting to the Urban Transportation Commission and the Bicycle Advisory Council to work out logistics of collaboration. WalkAustin announced the creation of the PAC in September.

C. What Role Does a PAC Play?

Staff discussed the role that a PAC can assume in Austin, and differentiated between an advisory council and an advocacy organization.

Look at older, neglected neighborhoods first, sidewalk and walkabililty needs to be met, upgrading/bringing up to code,

Crosswalks, cars don't recognize ped rights

Lighting on sidewalks for commuting and travel

Getting back areas of public right of ways, what is the procedure to do that

Sidewalk restaurants, don't want to be too close, valet parking same

Airport blvd. MLK to Bolm, many businesses

Shade trees will help with summer walking

Coordination with utilities, popping up in sidewalks

Increase crosswalk density, too many 3 sided crosswalks

Traffic speeds next to sidewalks

Older neighborhoods,

Springdale and airport, no sidewalks over the bridge, City vs. TXDOT problem, passing the buck

Need ped signals in east Austin

East side pies/carver crosswalk, no one is stopping

Connect with BAC, cyclists on sidewalk on 6th

Feel unsafe walking thru gas stations for example, with wide curb cuts

Need to partner with outside entities: Austin Police Department, businesses, Cap Metro, Austin Energy,

Construction crossing/issues/need advance warning

Visioning: expectations may be different for various people, what do you define as walkable, let's get agreement on walkability, inspire others to understand why they are interested in walking, see to the future

Work with schools on siting in walkable places; AISD 2 mile radius isn't realistic for walking 2nd graders

Commercial development: bring in chambers of commerce and their subcommittees (health/transportation? Talk with code enforcement

Hear from sidewalk group, budgetary committee/capital improvement/public works/trees/

Should we devote more time to sidewalk redevelopment program? Want to know what is possible, what can the PAC ask for, what are the ropes.

Spend meeting #2 on sidewalk program, spend next few meetings on other components

People want education

Produce asset map, where is the money, what can it be used for?

Look at the cumulative picture, what have we done so far. A chronology of events/building/money spent and how we match up to peer cities

The group consensus was to hear from staff about the sidewalk program at the next meeting.

2. Bylaws

Jess Lowry, Emily Risinger, Delfin Salazar, and Alba Sereno volunteered to join a working group to help refine draft bylaws

3. Attendance at and Relationship to the Urban Transportation Commission and Bicycle Advisory Council

Staff related conversations and interest of the Urban Transportation Commission and the Bicycle Advisory Council to solidify working relationships between the three entities in order to work more effectively.

4. Schedule Meeting Times

The consensus of the group was to establish regular meeting times for 6pm on the first Monday of each month. Due to the proximity to November, the group will meet for the second time December 2^{nd} .
