The City Council Questions and Answers Report was derived from a need to provide City Council Members an opportunity to solicit darifying information from City Departments as it relates to requests for council action. After a City Council Regular Meeting agenda has been published, Council Members will have the opportunity to ask questions of departments via the City Manager's Agenda Office. This process continues until 5:00 p.m. the Tuesday before the Council meeting. The final report is distributed at noon to City Council the Wednesday before the council meeting.

QUESTIONS FROM COUNCIL

- Agenda Item # 10 Authorize negotiation and execution of a professional services agreement with TRC ENGINEERS, INC. or one of the other qualified responders to RFQ Solicitation No. CLMP134, to provide engineering services necessary for Telecom/Fiber Make-Ready Work, in an amount not to exceed \$2,500,000.
 - a. QUESTION: Are these professional services being outsourced only because of the expected number of requests, or is this service typically outsourced by the city? COUNCIL MEMBER SPELMAN
 - b. ANSWER: Austin Energy staff anticipates that the workload/requests created by the telecom providers will be above the capacity for existing Austin Energy staff to review. There are approximately 100,000 utility poles in the AE system. Austin Energy staff estimates that the telecom/fiber initiative will impact up to 1,200 utility poles per month. The professional services procured through this process will allow AE to meet the workload/request demands in a timely manner without impacting other critical AE services.
- Agenda Item # 26 Approve a resolution authorizing the City's Municipal Court
 to record proceedings before the court, as allowed by the Texas Government
 Code, instead of providing a court reporter.
 - a. QUESTION: Will this recording equipment be used in all court cases (with the exception of DACC as mentioned in the RCA) or will it be at the discretion of each judge? COUNCIL MEMBER SPELMAN
 - b. ANSWER: The Presiding Judge agreed that the equipment would be used in all courtrooms for all trials, pre-trials and hearings. There will be no contract for court reporters except for the one monthly DACC meeting so I don't see how the individual judges would be able to find and pay court reporters without going out for RFP or RFQ for a contract, which was not planned.
- 3. Agenda Item # 28 Authorize the negotiation and execution of all documents and instruments necessary or desirable to purchase in fee simple a tract of land totaling approximately 606.7 acres in Hays County, Texas, located on FM 967, from JEREMIAH VENTURE, LP, through an assignment of an Option Contract for the Purchase of Real Estate, assigned by The Nature Conservancy, for a total amount not to exceed \$18,060,000.
 - a. QUESTION: Please provide more information on the value of the specific

land we are purchasing, with regard to water quality. What would be the result of not purchasing this land? COUNCIL MEMBER SPELMAN

- 4. Agenda Item #33 Approve the final design of the Auditorium Shores Improvement Project.
 - a. QUESTION: Please provide a list of off-leash dog parks in Austin, those currently in use and those approved and in process. Also provide a map of those locations, overlaid with the 10 new Council districts, and include the size of the park area. COUNCIL MEMBER MORRISON
 - b. ANSWER: See attachment
- 5. Agenda Item # 61 Authorize award and execution of a 36-month requirements service contract with GIVENS COURT REPORTING to provide court reporting services in an amount not to exceed \$100,238, with three 12-month extension options in an amount not to exceed \$33,413 per extension option, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$200,475.
 - a. QUESTION: How does this contract amount compare to previous contracts? COUNCIL MEMBER SPELMAN
 - b. ANSWER: The prior contract was established in 2007 for \$180,000 (\$90,000 for initial 36 month term and 3-12 month extension options at \$30,000 each) as compared to \$100,238 for this new 36-month term and \$33,413 per 12-month option, which there are 3 options available. The total amount of this new contract is not to exceed \$200,475.
 - c. QUESTION: In the Judicial Committee meeting, it was stated that judges would be able to opt in to using the recording equipment instead of court reporters. If this is not the case, and the use of the recording equipment is mandatory, then why is the cost of the new court reporting contract very similar to the cost of the previous one? COUNCIL MEMBER SPELMAN
 - d. ANSWER: These are hearings relative to public safety administrative hearings and civil service proceedings that take place at the Law Department. These meetings do not take place in a court room in front of a judge. The use of recording equipment alone is not mandatory; this contract is for an individual as well as recorded transcription. The prior contract was also for an individual and recorded transcription. The Law Department's reasoning to use both an individual and recorded transcription is as stated: The Court Reporting Service not only transcribes the proceeding using a stenographic device but also records the audio of the proceeding. Audio is not sufficient. In almost every single case the Hearing Examiner requests a transcribed copy of the proceeding to use in the drafting of his/her decision. The parties also use the transcript and cite to specific testimony in the post hearing briefs they

send to the Hearing Examiner. In addition, many times the witness' testimony is unclear and the court reporter can ask the witness to speak up or repeat the testimony. If there is only a recording then important testimony may not be captured. Finally, if the City or the employee files a lawsuit in District Court or the employee files a discrimination charge with the EEOC a copy of the transcript is almost always filed with the Court or sent to the EEOC. Not having a court reporter at the hearing is not going to avoid the necessity of having the recording transcribed. Pricing on the last contract was \$4.50 per page transcribed (using a stenographer) and this recommendation is for a contract that is for \$4.95 per page (using a stenographer). That's a 10% increase. To note, the Legal Service section of the Producer Price Index and Consumer Price Index increased by 22% during this same time frame (2007 and 2013).

 - a. QUESTION: Council Member requested the Review and Assessment Matrix for the Google Fiber Community Connection Program. COUNCIL MEMBER MORRISON
 - b. ANSWER: See attachment

Agenda Item #81 Approve a resolution directing the City Manager to propose an appointment process for utility billing hearings officer and necessary code amendments that ensures the highest levels of impartiality and customer service in the dispute process.  - a. QUESTION: 1) How many disputes received an administrative review in the past year and for which utilities? 2) How many administrative reviews resulted in formal hearings? 3) Of those formal hearings, how many were settled in favor of the customer and how many in favor of the City? 4) What oversight or regular reporting to management is done regarding disputes and the outcomes of the administrative review and hearing process? 5) How are customers currently made aware of the option for an administrative review?

- Agenda Item # 136 Conduct a public hearing and consider an ordinance approving a consent agreement for the Cascades Municipal Utility District No. 1 ("MUD") subject to adoption of an ordinance approving a strategic partnership agreement between the City and the MUD.
 - a. QUESTION: 1) Does the City already have utility service to the MUD? 2) Approximately half of the project is already in the City's full purpose jurisdiction, so why would the City not want to annex the remainder? 3) How does the proposed MUD compare to other MUDs in the City's jurisdiction? 4) Does the application demonstrate a need for a MUD? COUNCIL MEMBER TOVO
 - b. ANSWER: 1) Yes, Austin Water Utility will be the retail provider of water and wastewater service for this project. The City Council has already authorized CIP funding for the extension of water and wastewater utilities that will meet the requirements of proposed development. On December 18, 2008, the City Council approved Resolution No. 20081218-005 for reimbursement of \$3.4 million of actual construction costs, engineering, design, and project management costs associated with the 24-inch water transmission main that would cross through the property. 2) The City's Imagine Austin Comprehensive Plan calls for the City to continue to annex areas that will be provided with municipal services and utilities. The location of this project between the city limits and a large regional center just one mile to the south at the intersection of IH 35 and SH 45 also makes it a good candidate for annexation. Creation of a MUD establishes a long-term delay to the ability of the City to annex the area. 3) In comparison to the recently created Southeast Travis County and Pilot Knob MUDs, this project is located closer to the existing city limits and city services; thus, the creation of a MUD is not necessary to allow the City to extend land use controls. The costs that the Austin Water Utility would potentially avoid by the creation of a MUD are much smaller, \$3.4 million compared to \$16 million and \$27 million for the other projects. Other aspects of the proposed development are similar to the proposals from other developers requesting special consideration from the city such as providing affordable housing, energy efficiency, donation of a site for public safety, trails, and enhanced environmental protection. Unlike the other MUDs, Cascades does not provide sites for public schools or mass transportation facilities. 4) The Council adopted policy regarding MUDs provides guidance for reviewing a request to create a MUD in the City's jurisdiction. In accordance with the policy, the MUD should demonstrate that the MUD confers an extraordinary benefit not only to the properties within the MUD but also to the community in general and to the City. The proposed MUD does not appear to meet several basic requirements established by this policy. For example, it is not clear that the City would benefit more from the creation of a MUD than from use of the other available

- City development process. Another goal established in the MUD policy is to extend land use regulations that otherwise would not be available without the creation of the MUD; however, at this location, annexation is a feasible means to land use regulation without forgoing tax revenues from creation of a MUD.
- Agenda Item # 138 Conduct a public hearing and consider a resolution regarding local consent to the Texas Department of Criminal Justice proposal to construct an office building at 3928 Promontory Point Drive to be used as a parole office.
 - a. QUESTION: Please explain the reasoning for staff opposition as stated in the draft resolution. Where is this population currently being served? COUNCIL MEMBER SPELMAN
 - b. ANSWER: Local consent to the operation is considered to be granted under state law unless the City Council determines by resolution after a public hearing that the operation of the facility is opposed- as a result, the only resolution that can accompany this item would be one that refuses the state the right to build. The draft resolution was offered should Council decide to oppose the building after the hearing. At this point, APD is not in opposition of the new site. Based on the feedback received during our outreach efforts, we found no activity conflict with the local church and no presence of a homeowner's association. The surrounding area is completely industrial. The current parole facility is operating at 2101 East Ben White, approx.. 1.5 miles from the new proposed facility on Promontory Point.

QUESTION: Please provide more information on the value of the specific land we are purchasing, with regard to water quality. What would be the result of not purchasing this land? COUNCIL MEMBER SPELMAN

RESPONSE:


The current fair market value (CMV), as determined by an independent third party appraiser, is \$18,300,000. The Nature Conservancy's Option for the Purchase of Real Estate is \$18,000,000. In addition, an independent land planner provided a review of the development readiness and entitlements.

For approximately six years, Jeremiah Ventures, LP has been actively pursuing entitlements to allow the development of a residential subdivision. There is an approved subdivision agreement, a municipal utility district has been created to provide water and wastewater service, and numerous other entitlements are in place. This property is a vacant tract and the Sales Comparison Approach is the most reliable method of estimating the CMV. A variety of sources were used to assemble and document the most recent sales of vacant property possessing physical and location features similar to those exhibited by the Jeremiah property. The sales were then compared with the subject and adjusted for the most significant differing characteristics to render a value conclusion for the subject.

Given the value conclusion of \$18,300,000 and the potential yield of single family lots with on-site wastewater system the appraiser also looked at on-site septic. The CMV is supported with either wastewater treatment facility or septic service. The difference between the two wastewater systems is lot size and product. Example: On-site treatment facility allows for smaller (estimated at 1,000 lots) and a less expensive product; on-site septic systems (estimated at 600 lots) are larger lot sizes and a more expensive product. Note: The CMV is based on the price per acre not the number of lots and it was considered equivalent in value between the two wastewater systems.

Water quality. Dye traces conducted near the Jeremiah Ventures (Hudson Ranch) tract indicate that water recharging the Edwards Aquifer in this area flows to Barton Springs. The tributaries from the tract drain to Onion Creek as well as Bear Creek which also recharge the aquifer. The tract shares a boundary on the west side with several large tracts already protected by the City's Water Quality Protection Lands program. Staff identified 170 features on the site, 105 of which rated as sensitive features (using TCEQ guidelines), including eight caves and three large upland sinkholes. Approximately 10% (or 60 acres) of the 607-acre ranch drains to these upland features. In addition, some of these features are in or adjacent to areas proposed for effluent irrigation.

Not purchasing: The City of Austin open space team looked at Jeremiah through a matrix system and the property scored the highest with the next runner up at 13 points below. The owners have spent the last six years obtaining water and wastewater permits and other permits and agreements for development. If the City does not purchase the property, staff fully expects the owners to complete permitting which would allow approximately 1,000 small lot homes served by a water line from the West Travis County Public Utility Agency and Lower Colorado River Authority (LCRA) and a central wastewater collection system which would have the first wastewater effluent irrigation permit from the TCEQ over the Barton Springs recharge zone.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CITY CODE CHAPTER 15-7 REGARDING ACCESS TO UTILITY INFRASTRUCTURE BY COMMUNICATIONS PROVIDERS AND MANAGEMENT OF RIGHT-OF-WAY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

PART 1. City Code Section 15-7-1 (*Definitions*) is amended to read:

- (A) Except as provided in Subsection (B), in this chapter:
 - (1) APPLICANT means a person who applies to use utility infrastructure.
 - (2) ATTACHMENT includes:
 - (a) on a pole, each aerial cable, together with its associated messenger cable, guy wire, anchors and other appurtenant and incidental facilities;
 - (b) in a conduit, each linear foot of occupancy of a City-owned conduit or duct by each cable or other attachment; and
 - (c) each antenna, transceiver, amplifier, repeater or other device or equipment of a user supported by, affixed to, contained in, or placed on or in a unit of utility infrastructure.
 - (3) ATTACHMENT RIGHT means the right of a user to place, install, construct, replace, move, remove, keep, maintain, operate, or use an attachment on or in City-owned utility infrastructure under this chapter or a permit or contract issued under this chapter.
 - (4) CABLE means a wire rope or a bound or sheathed assembly of conductors, wires, or fibers, including fiber optic cable, coaxial cable, and twisted pair copper cable. Each cable that is lashed to another cable or to a common messenger cable is a separate attachment.
 - (5) COMMUNICATION SERVICES PROVIDER means a user who provides or offers to provide cable, telecommunications, or video services pursuant to a federal or state franchise or certificate and who has a right to use the City's public right-of-way under federal, state, or local law.
 - (56) DIRECTOR means the director of the Austin Electric Utility.

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- (7) JOINT USER means a user who owns or controls at least 1,000 poles on which the utility has placed electric lines or other equipment by agreement with the joint user, regardless of whether the infrastructure contract required by this chapter is in effect or has expired.
- (8) JOINT USE POLE means a pole owned or controlled by the utility or a joint user.
- (69) USER means a person who has been granted the right to install an attachment under this chapter, regardless of whether the infrastructure contract required by this chapter is in effect or has expired.
- (710) UTILITY means the Austin Electric Utility.
- (811) UTILITY INFRASTRUCTURE includes utility distribution poles, transmission structures, ducts, transmission and distribution conduit, building entry conduit, utility tunnels, manholes, vaults, radio towers, other radio equipment, fiber optic cable capacity and active communications capacity, poles and horizontal arms for street lights, poles and horizontal arms for traffic signals, and appurtenant facilities.

PART 2. City Code Section 15-7-2 (*Purpose*) is amended to read:

§ 15-7-2 PURPOSE

This chapter establishes a uniform policy for use of utility infrastructure to enable the City to:

- (1) permit fair, reasonable, and non-discriminatory access to the available capacity on utility infrastructure and other user-owned infrastructure located within the public right-of-way;
- (2) safeguard the reliability and integrity of the electric utility system;
- (3) obtain fair compensation for the use of utility infrastructure through fees and usage and other charges;
- [(4) comply with applicable federal, state, and local regulation, including the National Electrical Code, the National Electrical Safety Code, and the utility's transmission and distribution standards;]provide open, comparable, nondiscriminatory, and competitively neutral access to the public right-of-way for cable television systems, telecommunications providers, and holders of state-issued certificates of franchise authority for video services.

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(5) support cost-effective, optimal use of public resources and economic development through increased competition in [tele]communications services delivery; and

(6) manage and regulate the use of the public right-of-way to protect the public health, safety, and welfare by minimizing [avoid] the congestion, inconvenience, cost, visual impacts, deterioration, safety hazards and other adverse effects on the [City's street, highways, and] public right-of-way which could result from the construction, operation, and maintenance of redundant infrastructure.

PART 3. City Code Section 15-7-4 (*Fees and Charges*) is amended to read:

- (A) Except as otherwise provided by this section, [T] the council shall establish the fees and charges under this chapter by separate ordinance based on the type and number of proposed attachments and the type of utility infrastructure on or in which the proposed attachments will be placed.
- (B) A charge established under this chapter may not exceed the maximum amount permitted by applicable law.
- (C) Filing fees and usage charges shall be calculated and applied in a consistent manner for all similarly situated users. If federal or state law or regulation preempts a filing fee or usage charge under this chapter, the filing fee and usage charge collected by the City [may not exceed] shall be the maximum amount permitted by federal or state law or regulation.
- (D) Any attachment that the city manager determines is used exclusively for the delivery of services to the public will not be subject to the established filing and usage fees so long as the services are non-discriminatory and provided free of charge.
- (E) A joint user's annual usage charges shall be calculated on the difference between the number of jointly-used poles owned by the utility and the number of jointlyused poles owned by the joint user.
- **PART 4.** Subsection (C) of City Code Section 15-7-5 (*Application to Use Utility Infrastructure*) is amended to read:
- (C) Denial of an application.
 - (1) The director may deny an application <u>for an attachment</u> if:
 - (a) the applicant fails to submit a complete application;

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(b) the applicant fails to supplement its application with additional information or otherwise cooperate with the utility as <u>reasonably</u> requested in the evaluation of the application;

- (c) the applicant fails to pay the filing fee;
- (d) the proposed attachment[s are] is of excessive size or weight or would otherwise subject utility infrastructure to unacceptable levels of additional stress;
- (e) [approval] the proposed attachment would jeopardize the reliability or integrity of the electric system or of individual units of utility infrastructure, or violate generally applicable engineering principles;
- (f) [approval] the proposed attachment would present a safety hazard to a City employee or the public;
- (g) [approval] the proposed attachment would unreasonably impair the City's ability to operate or maintain utility infrastructure;
- (h) approval would require an unacceptable change, upgrade, or addition to utility infrastructurethere is insufficient capacity or placement of the attachment would violate the National Electric Safety Code or the utility's standard design criteria, and the utility infrastructure cannot reasonably be modified or enlarged at the cost of the applicant; or
- (i) approval would expose the City, the utility, its ratepayers, or other users to increased liability or financial risk; or
- (i) the applicant is not in compliance with any provision of this chapter.
- (2) If an application is denied, the director shall notify the applicant in writing of the reason for the denial. If an application is denied, an applicant may file a new application that corrects the reason for the denial. If an application is denied for a reason other than that set forth in subsection (C)(1)(i), an applicant may appeal the denial to the director no later than the 30th day after the date of the denial as prescribed by the director. If the director upholds an original decision which denies an applicant all or substantially all requested attachment rights, the applicant may appeal to the city council under Section 15-7-8 (Appeal to the City Council).

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PART 5. City Code Section 15-7-7 (*Joint Use Agreements*) is amended to read:

§ 15-7-7 JOINT USE [AGREEMENTS] OF POLES.

- (A) [This section applies to a person who owns or controls a minimum of 1,000 utility poles who offers the joint use of its poles by the utility in exchange for use of the City's utility infrastructure, if the utility has a use for the user's utility poles.
- (B) A person shall pay to the City the usage charges in accordance with Section 15-7-4 (*Fees and Charges*) on the difference between the number of jointly-used utility poles owned by the City and the number of jointly-used utility poles owned by the joint user.
- (C) Each person who uses a jointly-used utility pole is] A joint user and the utility are responsible to perform [the-] each person's own work on jointly used poles, including construction of a jointly-used utility pole, and installation, operation, maintenance (including tree trimming), replacement, removal, rearrangement, or relocation of the person's attachments. If a joint user fails to perform required work on or related to a jointly-used utility pole owned by the City, the utility may perform the work on behalf of the joint user. If the utility performs work under this section, it may elect to:
 - (1) charge the joint user for the City's expenses under this section including the cost of labor, material, equipment, overhead, general and administrative expense, general fund transfer, and other charges and costs; or
 - (2) own the utility infrastructure improvements installed or constructed by the utility.
- [(D) Before a joint user may occupy City-owned utility infrastructure, the joint user must execute an infrastructure usage contract under this chapter.
- (E) As a condition to a grant of the use of City-owned utility infrastructure, a joint user must agree not to unreasonably deny other users the right to place attachments on the utility infrastructure of the joint user, to the extent of available capacity or space and under the terms of a usage agreement between the joint user and the other user, including payment of reasonable and non-discriminatory fees.]
- (B) Upon the request of a communication services provider, a user who has utility poles located in the City's public right-of-way shall allow the requesting communication services provider to place attachments described in Subparagraph 15-7-1(A)(2)(a) on the user's poles within the City's right-of-way on rates, terms, and conditions that are just, reasonable, and non-discriminatory.
