In 2004 the city entered into an interlocal agreement with Travis County to provide sign language interpreters for Municipal Court and Health and Human Services. The original agreement was for 12 months with eight 12-month extension options. This agreement will provide the same sign language interpreter services for the one year period of October 1, 2013 through September 30, 2014 and will automatically renew annually on the 1 st of October unless the agreement is terminated by either party in whole or in part for specified reasons with 30 day notice or without cause with 60 day notice.							
The Municipal Court utilizes interpreter services at the Municipal Courthouse, the Downtown Austin Community Court and Central Booking. The Court is statutorily required to provide verbatim translation for defendants by persons certified by the State of Texas to translate court proceedings in the State of Texas.							

The Health and Human Services Department utilizes interpreters for patients of the Sexually Transmitted Disease, Tuberculosis and Refugee clinics. Interpreter services are also used for hearing impaired clients attending Food Manager classes provided by the Environmental and Consumer Health unit.

This agreement is entered into under the provisions of the Inter/local Cooperation Act, Chapter 791, Texas Government Code.
