Additional Backup Information			

Approval of this interlocal agreement with Camino Real Regional Mobility Authority, El Paso, Texas will allow the City of Austin and Camino Real Regional Mobility Authority to participate in the purchase of various types of goods and services through the use of contracts already in place through each jurisdiction's purchasing processes.

The ability to share competitive contracts between jurisdictions assists each to accomplish acquisitions more efficiently. Aggregating demand with other local jurisdictions should result in reduced unit prices for requirements because of increased volume.

City of Austin purchases exceeding the City Manager's authority (currently \$57,000 FY14) will be brought forward for Council approval on a case-by-case basis prior to ordering the products or services.

This agreement is entered into under the provisions of the Interlocal Cooperation Act, Chapter 791, Texas Government Code.
