### Additional Backup Information

The Texas Department of State Health Services (TDSHS) awarded the City of Austin Health and Human Services Department (HHSD) \$5,769 for the grant period January 1, 2014 through June 30, 2014. The award is made in support of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Public Health and Emergency Preparedness Budget to enhance local and regional preparedness, planning and response efforts. This project provides funds for an emergency notification system associated with public health emergency response activities.

### The funding allows HHSD to:

- 1. To provide additional resources to Austin/Travis County to address regional public health and medical planning and response capabilities for all emergencies with public health consequences.
- 2. Improve regional public health and medical emergency preparedness planning, response, and communization in the Austin/Travis County area by providing access to an emergency notification system.

The General Fund will not be required to contribute to this grant. This amendment will not affect performance measures.
