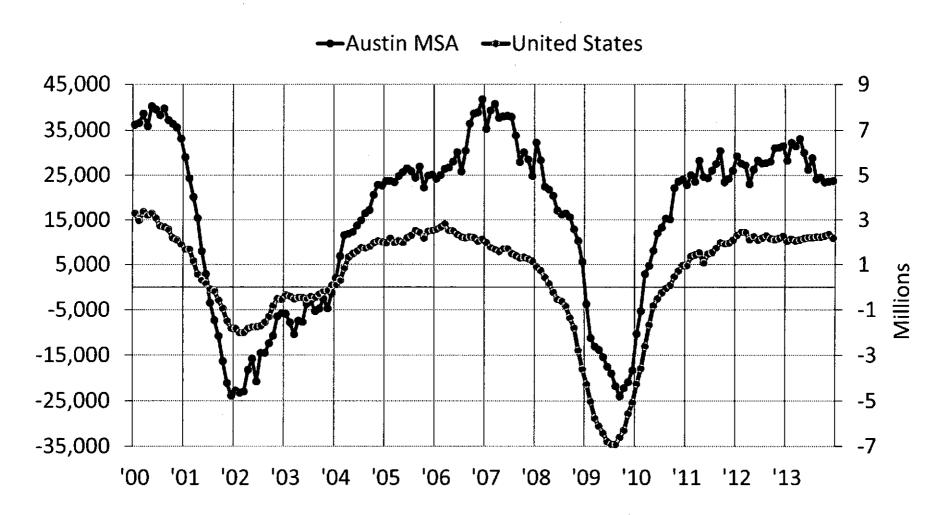

Nonfarm Payroll Jobs Year-Over-Year Change

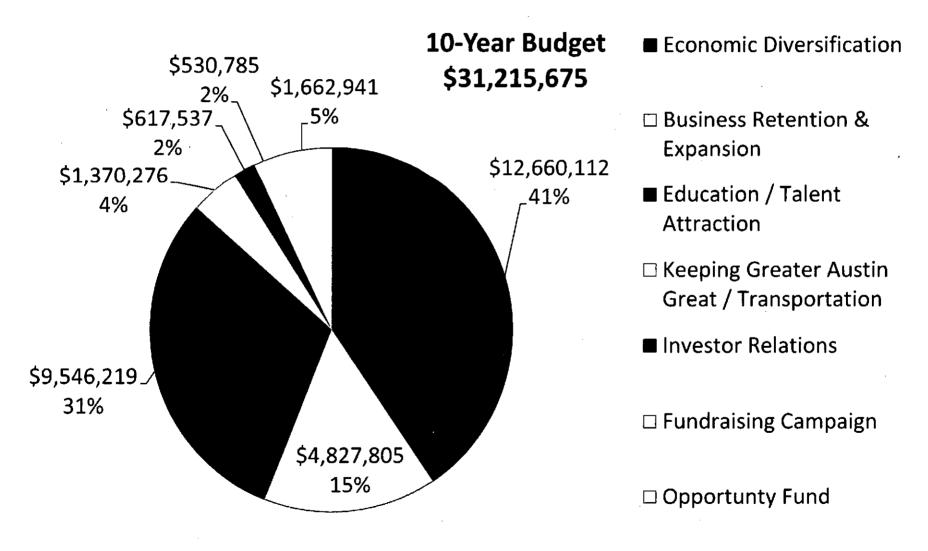

Opportunity Austin Budget 2004-2013





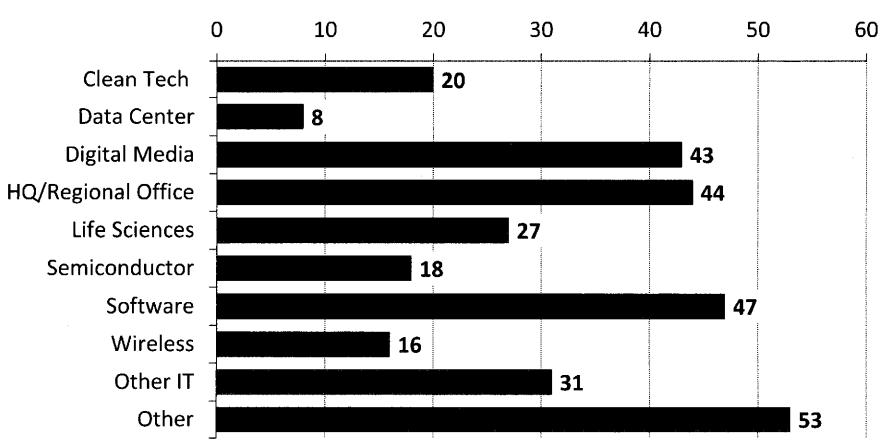

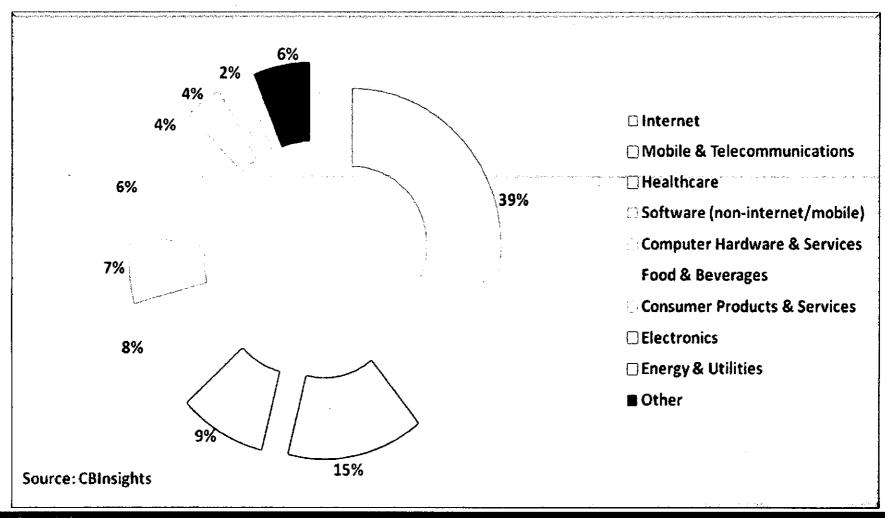
