Additional Backup Information					

The Shoal Creek Restoration Project will make improvements to the Shoal Creek corridor from 15th Street to 28th Street, including areas through Pease Park. This project will include stabilizing approximately 3,000 linear feet of eroding creek banks, removal of wastewater lines from the creek bed, creating storm water infiltration areas, constructing new trails, removing invasive plants, and loosening soils and re-establishing native riparian vegetation. This project is sponsored by the Watershed Protection Department in collaboration with the Parks and Recreation Department and the Neighborhood Connectivity Division of Public Works.

Project benefits include restored parkland for future generations, reduced potential for water pollution from aging wastewater infrastructure, improved creek hydrology, increased tree density in a natural park setting and improved mobility along the pedestrian areas and bikeways improving the quality of life in Austin.

This contract amendment is needed to cover additional design and construction phase services associated with project changes that resulted from stakeholder input.

This amendment was reviewed by the City's Change Control Committee.
