The proposed ordinance amends Chapters 25-2, 25-5, 25-7 and 25-8 relating to Lake Austin (LA) District zoning regulations, boat dock regulations, and development along the shoreline of Lake Austin, Lady Bird Lake and Lake Long. The ordinance was developed in response to Council Resolution 20130829-078 directing staff to implement in part recommendations from the Lake Austin Task Force (<u>http://www.austintexas.gov/latf</u>) final report published in August 2013.						
The complexity and intensity of development and recreational use has changed substantially, particularly on Lake						

The complexity and intensity of development and recreational use has changed substantially, particularly on Lake Austin, since the current shoreline and dock regulations were previously updated. The proposed revisions provide greater clarity for applicants and City of Austin review staff that will protect the quality of Austin's public water supply, preserve safe navigation in the lake, and enhance compatibility of development along this critical regional recreation resource. Ordinance highlights include: better alignment of variance approval processes with other development activities and state law requirements, clarification of the size and length of docks, clarification on the accessories allowed for docks, re-organization of existing code provisions into more logically related subsections, clarification on allowed enclosures of docks to reduce unauthorized uses and reduce flood hazards, defined processes for fill and dredging in the lakes, and improved riparian vegetation protections.
