ANALYSIS / ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: The interlocal agreement with Travis County Central Healthcare District will expand the EMS Community Health Paramedic Program and adding 1.0 new Medic II full-time equivalent position along with operating expenses and one-time equipment purchases. Beginning in FY 2015, the one-time costs of \$124,598 for a vehicle and related IT equipment are removed. Additionally, an annual 4% increase in personnel, commodity and contractual cost drivers is also projected.
