

**RESOLUTION NO. 20140320-055**

**WHEREAS**, the Onion Creek flood on October 31, 2013, had a devastating effect on thousands of families in Austin and Travis County; and

**WHEREAS**, the response to the affected area involved many agencies from municipal, county, state, and federal governments as well as neighborhood organizations, churches, non-profits, and volunteers; and

**WHEREAS**, public funds for a portion of the remaining homes in the buyout areas have been made available by the City, Travis County, and the US Army Corps of Engineers; and


**WHEREAS**, homes and families remain in the buyout area and are potentially subject to future flood events; and

**WHEREAS**, informing residents, agency personnel, non-profits, and elected officials of short-term and long-term planning efforts of emergency response and buyout programs is necessary; **NOW, THEREFORE,**

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:**

The City Manager is directed to coordinate with relevant departments; non-City agencies; neighborhood associations in the Bluff Springs, Dove Springs, and Onion Creek area; non-profits; and service providers to discuss short-term and long-term efforts related to emergency response and floodplain buyout programs.
