Additional Backup Information			

This purchase is for inspection and testing services for vehicles and equipment used by the Austin Fire Department, Austin Energy, Austin Water Utility and various other departments to provide services to the citizens of Austin. Inspection and testing ensures that the aerial devices, ground ladders and lifts are in safe operating condition for continued in-service use for the protection of City employees, citizens and property.

Technicians performing the inspection and testing services are required to be fully qualified and certified according to the American Society for Nondestructive Testing (ASNT), National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), and American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM). The previous vendor contracted to inspect and test the vehicles and equipment could not provide documentation that their technicians meet the minimum certification requirements.

Given the safety risk of not having the City's aerial devices, ground ladders, and lifts properly inspected, an emergency procurement was conducted. Of the three quotes obtained, only Reinhart and Associates met all of the certification requirements.
