**PROPOSAL**

---

Demolish a ca. 1934 contributing house.

---

**ARCHITECTURE**

---

One-story, rectangular-plan, side-gabled frame house with an almost-full width front-gabled independent porch on ornamental metal supports; single 1:1 fenestration.

---

**STANDARDS FOR REVIEW**

---

The house was built around 1934 by Leonora May, who had it as a rental property. The house appears on the 1935 Sanborn map and again on the 1961 Sanborn map. There were a variety of tenants in the house over the years, including a defense worker, porters, a teacher, and later, city and county employees. The house has been vacant for a good portion of its existence.

Staff believes the house is contributing to the Clarksville National Register Historic District. It was rated as a Priority 3 for preservation in the Clarksville survey, but with an incorrect date of construction of 1950.

**STAFF RECOMMENDATION**

---

Postpone the case to May 19, 2014 to consider alternatives to demolition. The house is contributing to the Clarksville National Register Historic District and should be preserved if possible.

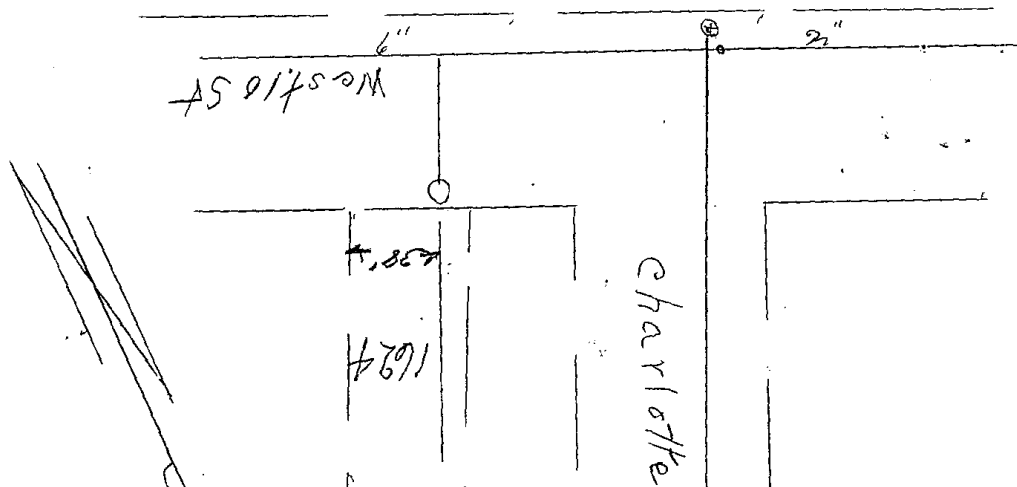

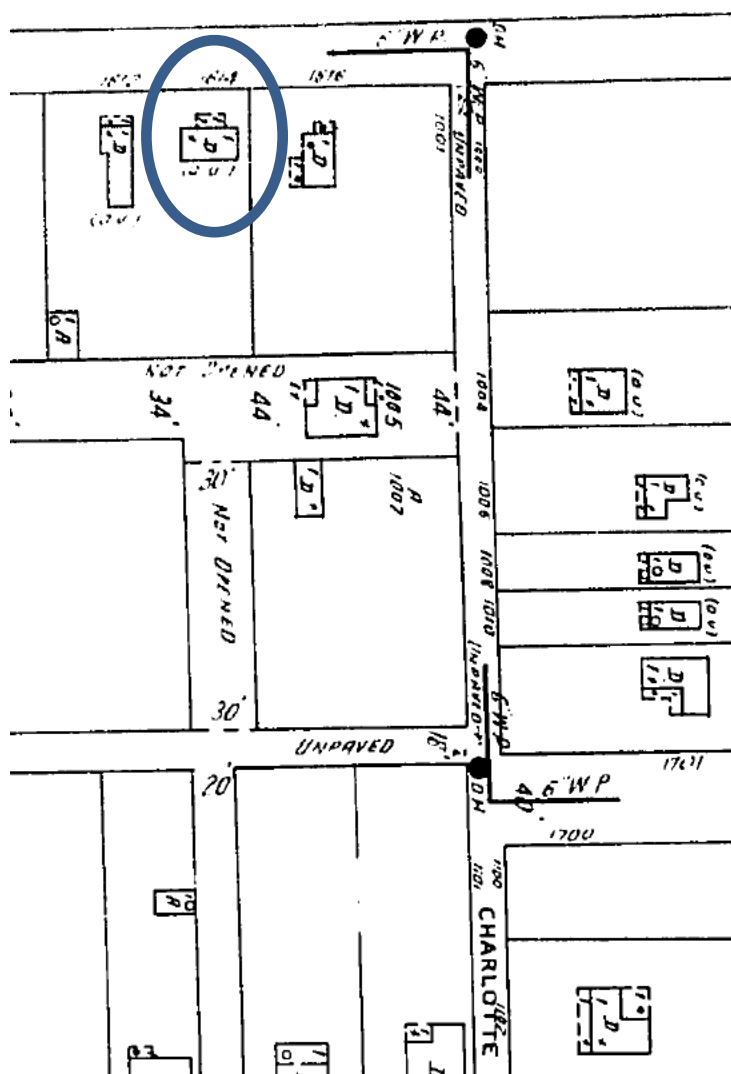

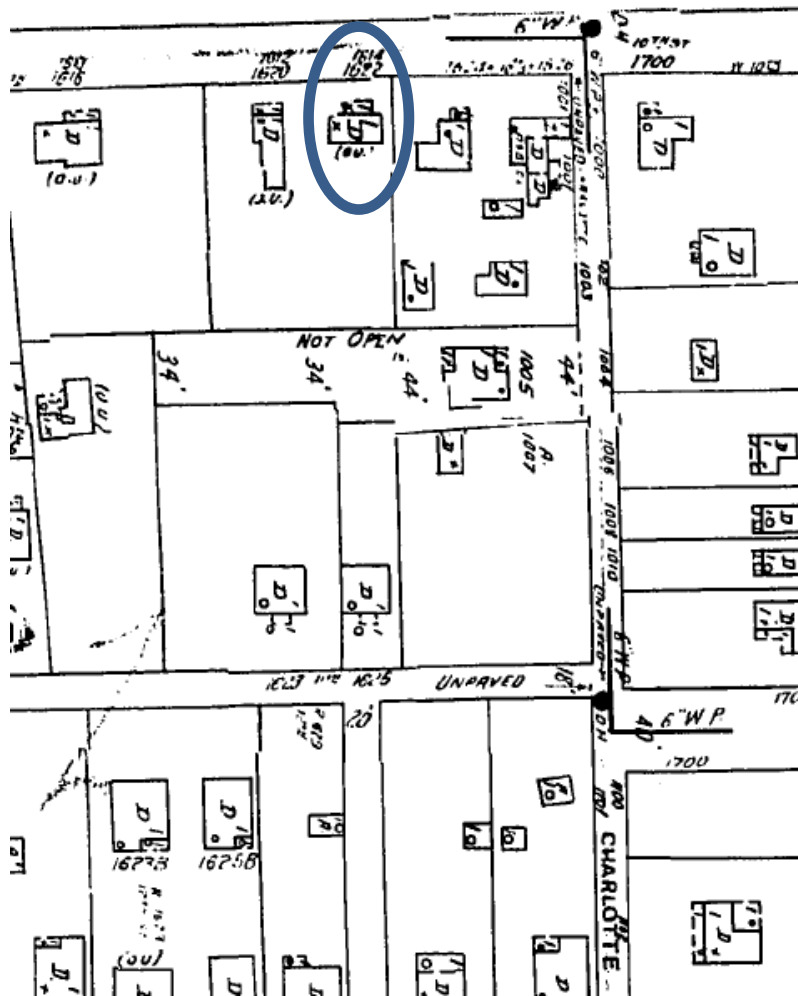
