## Additional Backup Information

These contracts will provide the Parks and Recreation Department (PARC) with spare parts and services for the maintenance and repair of City of Austin Aquatic Facilities. PARC currently maintains 51 Aquatic Facilities throughout the City and has identified several services that cannot be provided by City staff, including the repair and installation of pool equipment, chemical supplies, pool coatings, and related pool amenities. These services are required to efficiently provide maintenance and repair to aquatic features and mechanical systems to ensure an enjoyable experience for the citizens of Austin.

To ensure compliance with the MBE /WBE ordinance, in the event subcontracting opportunities are identified throughout

the duration of the project, the vendors are required to adhere to the MBE /WBE Program Requirements and contact SMBR for assistance.

These cooperative contracts have all been competitively bid and negotiated. Utilizing the BuyBoard cooperative contracts provides for volume discount pricing, flexibility for acquiring maintenance, as well as renovation services in an efficient manner.
