<p>The Texas Department of State Health Services (TDSHS) awarded the City of Austin Health and Human Services (HHSD) \$7,941 for the grant period January 1, 2014 through June 30, 2014. The award is for a discretionary fund project in support of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Public Health and Emergency Preparedness Budget to enhance local and regional preparedness, planning and response efforts. While improving overarching all-hazards planning efforts, this project provides funds for an emergency notification system associated with public health emergency response activities. Funds in the current budget will cover the required 10% match.
