PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1941 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, irregular-plan, hipped-roof, frame house with a large multi-light bay window in the projecting front hipped-roof bay; otherwise, single and paired 6:6 fenestration; partial-width inset entry hood set into the front hipped-roof bay.

RESEARCH

The house was built in the winter of 1940-41 by Randolph H. Warren, a buyer for Brydson Lumber Company. Warren's name appears on the initial building and utility permits for this house. The first owners and occupants of the house were Rudolph R. and Myrtle L. Enck, who lived here until the early 1990s. Rudolph R. Enck

STAFF COMMENTS

The house is beyond the limits of any City survey.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage re-use of the existing house, which is a very good example of late 1930s – early 1940s minimal traditional design with a prominent bay window; if re-use of the existing house is not feasible, then encourage relocation over demolition, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center.

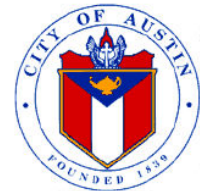

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

Rudolph R. and Myrtle L. Enck (ca. 1941 – ca. 1990)

Rudolph Enck appears in the 1920 U.S. Census as the 10-year old son of Daniel and Setma Enck of Guadalupe County, Texas. Daniel Enck was a Texas-born employee of a flour mill; the family lived in a neighborhood composed almost entirely of flour mill employees. The 1930 U.S. Census shows Myrtle Teas (later Enck) as the 17-year old daughter of Henry and Iris Teas of Lockhart, Texas, where Henry operated a meat market.

Myrtle Lorraine Teas Enck

Myrtle Lorraine Teas Enck, 72, of Austin died Wednesday.

She was a member of Central Christian Church for many years. Mrs. Enck was a member of a pioneer family of Lockhart.

She was the wife of Rudolph R. Enck of Austin; mother and mother-in-law of Sandra Kay and James J. West of Austin; sister of Mildred Lamb of Freeport; niece of Mary Ellison of Lockhart.

She was predeceased by her parents, Henry D. and Iris Teas; brothers, Henry Teas and William Teas; and sister, LeNell Teas.

Funeral services will be Saturday at 10:00 AM in the Colonial Chapel of the Cook-Walden Funeral Home with Dr. Eugene Landry and Reverend Walter Matas officiating. Interment will be in the Lockhart City Cemetery.
