Additional Backup Information

This resolution will nominate Spansion LLC ("Spansion") as a single Enterprise Zone Project under the Texas Enterprise Zone Act. Spansion is a global leader in Flash memory-based embedded systems solutions. Spansion's Flash memory, microcontrollers, mixed-signal and analog products drive the development of faster, more intelligent and energy efficient electronics. Over the next five years, Spansion anticipates investing over \$200 million to improve manufacturing capabilities and capacity at its Fab 25/Text 25 facility. The investment will serve to keep Spansion competitive and ensure that it retains one of the most capable 200 mm semiconductor plants in the United States. Spansion currently employs approximately 860 employees at its Fab 25/Text 25 facility in Austin, and will commit to retain all full-time jobs for the purposes of the Texas Enterprise Zone Program. The company qualifies for designation because of a planned investment at the business site located within the City of Austin and the retention of jobs.

If so designated as an Enterprise Zone Project, Spansion would be eligible for refund of State sales and use tax based on the employment criteria and the amount of capital spent at the qualified business site. The Texas Legislature currently authorizes 105 state designations each biennium. The City of Austin is eligible to receive up to nine (9) Enterprise Project designations based upon availability and competiveness of the project every two years.
