PRICE ANALYSIS

- a. Sole bid. Other vendors were contacted but made a business decision not to bid.
- b. Twenty-three notices were sent. There are no known MBEs or WBEs for this commodity code. One bid was received.
- c. The pricing offered represents a 10.2% increase from the last purchase made November 2010. This is due to the increase in exchange rate between the United States dollar and the Swiss Franc; these scales are manufactured in Switzerland.
