ANALYSIS / ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: The Austin [re]Manufacturing Hub is a specialized eco-industrial park which will attract reuse and recycling manufacturers to the redeveloped former FM 812 Landfill site. Redeveloping this land will provide local and sustainable recycling markets, reduce transportation costs and attract jobs and investment to Austin. The Austin [re]Manufacturing Hub will create up to 1,250 jobs and attract an estimated $\$ 30$ million in private investment. The City of Austin has completed site surveys, a Phase I environmental assessment, a land plan, a real estate appraisal, and preliminary infrastructure design.

Austin Resource Recovery has received a Federal grant of $\$ 1,000,000$ from the United States Economic Development Administration to partially fund the development of infrastructure on the site, including the construction of water and wastewater lines. This grant will have no fiscal impact on the General Fund.
