Approve an ordinance authorizing acceptance of \$60,423 additional grant funds from the TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF STATE HEALTH SERVICES, WOMEN, INFANTS, AND CHILDREN PROGRAM (WIC), and amending the Fiscal Year 2013-2014 Health and Human Services Department Operating Budget Special Revenue Fund (Ordinance No. 20130909-001) to appropriate \$60,423 to maintain WIC services.

Additional Backup Information

The Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children, also referred to as WIC, is a preventive program that targets women and children below 185% of federal poverty level. The WIC Program provides nutrition education, breastfeeding support, and nutritious foods to pregnant women, infants, and children up to age five. The additional \$60,423 will be used for WIC operating expenses. The General Fund will not be required to contribute to this grant. All department grant application requests are reviewed by the Budget Office prior to submission to ensure that the grant minimizes the financial impact to the City.
