Subject

Authorize negotiation and execution of an interlocal agreement between the City and the Capital Area Emergency Communication District (CAECD) related to the City's participation in the enhanced 9-1-1 emergency telephone system as follows: CAECD reimbursement in an amount not to exceed \$577,874 for a 12 month term for maintenance of the 9-1-1 database on a county-wide basis. Additional Backup Information

Until last year, the City of Austin and Capital Area Council of Governments (CAPCOG), through interlocal agreements, cooperated in delivering emergency 9-1-1 service in Austin and Travis County. The delivery of 9-1-1 service requires maintaining and upgrading equipment and software, providing supplies to employees, training employees and maintaining the 9-1-1 database for the areas served. The City provided these services and was reimbursed by CAPCOG annually.

As of September, 2013 the Capital Area Emergency Communications District (CACHED) is the entity responsible for the 9-1-1 system in the area. The State of Texas created this political subdivision to establish and maintain Next Generation 9-1-1 emergency communications services within the District. The City established an ILA with CAECD at that time. The agreement is set to expire at the end of September.

This RCA is requesting approval of a new ILA with CAECD with a start date of October 1, 2014 to end on September 30, 2015.
