Authorize award and execution of a 29-month requirements service contract through the Houston-Galveston Area Council Cooperative with CERES ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES, INC.; ASHBRITT, INC. DBA ASHBRITT ENVIRONMENTAL; PHILLIPS AND JORDAN, INC.; AND CROWDERGULF, LLC to provide disaster debris clearance and removal services in an amount not to exceed \$600,000 each and combined, with three 12-month extension options in an amount not to exceed \$200,000 per extension option each and combined, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$1,200,000 each and combined. Funding in the amount of \$33,333 is available in the Fiscal Year 2013-2014 Operating Budget of the Austin Resource Recovery Department. Funding for the remaining 20 months of the original contract period and extension options is contingent upon available funding in future budgets. Fiscal Note

Additional Backup Information

This contract will provide the City of Austin Resource Recovery (ARR) Department with multiple vendors to aid the department in cleaning and removal of debris throughout the city in the event of widespread weather damage. An established list of approved vendors and funding allocation will give the ARR department quick access to additional assets and manpower to remove and dispose of debris after major storms as experienced with the Halloween flooding last fall.

The Houston-Galveston Area Council (HGAC) established a disaster debris clearance and removal program to assist end users with an on-call contract that may be activated in the event of debris generated from a disaster. H-GAC has established contracts with seven national firms.

Six of the seven firms on the H-GAC contract responded with proposals for ARR's consideration. The Federal Emergency Management Agency and H-GAC has recommended a primary vendor and several back-up vendors in case the primary vendor is unable to fulfill the City's requirements following a disaster. The primary contract will be awarded to Ceres Environmental Services, Inc. based out of Houston, TX. The recommended backup providers are Ashbritt, Inc., Phillips and Jordan, Inc. and CrowderGulf, LLC.

No funds will be expended under this contract until services are required.
