Subject

Approve a resolution authorizing the application for and acceptance of \$50,000 in grant funding from the State of Texas, Governor's Office, Criminal Justice Division to implement the Austin Police Department (APD) project entitled APD Victim Crisis Intervention Project.

Amount and Source of Funding

Funding in the amount of \$50,000 is available from the State of Texas, Criminal Justice Division, Victims of Crime Act Fund for the project period of September 1, 2014 – August 31, 2015. A match of 20% (\$12,500) of the total project cost is required and will be met be accounting for the salary of an existing city-funded victim service supervisor.

Additional Backup Information

This action will provide the required resolution needed by the Criminal Justice Division to complete the award process related to \$50,000 in grant funding. The project period is September 1, 2014 – August 31, 2015.

Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) funding will allow the City to continue the salary of an existing grant-funded victim services counselor (currently funded with VOCA discretionary dollars). The counselor will provide mental health and practical intervention as close to the time of a criminal incident as possible. This intervention may include crisis counseling and stabilization, justice support, personal advocacy, emergency placement in shelter, safety planning, and information and referrals to other helpful service providers.

APD anticipates that the counselor will provide services for 500 victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking, and/or dating violence during the project period.

The grantor requires a resolution approved by council that includes items one through four below.

- 1. Authorization by your governing body for the submission of the application to CJD that clearly identifies the name of the project for which funding is requested;
- 2. A commitment to provide all applicable matching funds;
- 3. A designation of the name and/or title of an authorized official who is given the authority to apply for, accept, reject, alter, or terminate a grant (Note: If a name is provided, you must update CJD should the official change during the grant period.); and
- 4. A written assurance that, in the event of loss or misuse of grant funds, the governing body will return all funds to CJD.
