#### **PROPOSAL**

Construct a second story to a one-story contributing house and a new detached garage.

### PROJECT SPECIFICATIONS


The applicant proposes to construct a second story to a one-story house that is contributing to the historic district. The proposed addition will be flush with the existing house and will transform the house from one story to two stories. The proposed addition will match the existing painted brick of the house, will have a hipped roof with a hipped-roof dormer clad in horizontal lap siding. The details around the windows on the existing house will be reproduced on the addition. A new front porch will have wood columns and a metal balustrade above. The one-story section of the addition on the back of the house will have horizontal lap siding, and an open deck with a wooden railing on top. The existing detached garage will be replaced with a new garage with a hipped roof and lap siding.


### STANDARDS FOR REVIEW

The house is contributing to the Old West Austin National Register Historic District, which has no specific design guidelines for additions. General design principles for historic districts encourage additions to the rear of the house with scale, massing, materials, and fenestration patterns complementing the house and other contributing houses within the district.

### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Recommend that the applicant reconsider the transformation of the one-story house into a two-story house. Transformation of a contributing house in a historic district, even when the addition is as compatible with the existing architecture as this proposal is, detracts from the character of the district. Pushing the addition back from the front wall of the house would better preserve the character of the house and the historic district.

Walker was a clerk at the State Department of Health; she resided at the State School for the Blind. John B. Walker is not listed in the directory. NOTE: The 1937 city directory shows John B. Walker Jr at 1707 Colorado Street; he had no occupation listed; Jo Will Walker was a tabulator for the State

Department of Health.

### **BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES**

Mollie B., Jowill, and Ouida Walker (ca. 1940 – ca. 1983)

The 1910 U.S. Census shows the Walker family in Granger, Texas, where Jno. B. was a fire insurance agent. He was 44, and had been born in Texas. Mollie Walker was 43, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed. Their children were: Zollie, 19; Joe Will, 17; Ouida, 14; Louise, 11; and Jno. B., Jr., 8. All of the children had been born in Texas, and none had an occupation listed.

Early city directories show John B. Walker as a collector; Ouida Walker was consistently listed as a public school teacher, and Jowill worked for the State Board of Health for many years. The family lived at 112 W. 18<sup>th</sup> Street in the mid-1920s.

The 1920 U.S. Census shows J.B. and Mollie Walker at an address on W. 18<sup>th</sup> Street, where they were renters. J.B. Walker was 55, had been born in Texas to North Carolina-born parents, and was a deputy collector. Mollie Walker was 55, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed. They had 5 children: Jollie, 28, a school teacher; Jowill, 26, a school teacher, Ouida, 24, a school teacher, Louise, 21, who had no occupation listed; and Bower, 18, who had no occupation listed. John B. Walker died July 30, 1926, and was buried in Granger, Texas.

The 1930 U.S. Census shows Mary [sic] Walker as the renter of 1707 Colorado Street. She was a 68-year old widow with no occupation listed. With her lived her children: Zollie, 35, a teacher at the state school; Jowill, 32, a tabulator at the State Department of Health; Ouida, 29, a public school teacher; and J. Bower, 26, a newspaper salesman.

The 1940 U.S. Census shows Mrs. J.B. Walker as the owner of this house, which was worth \$6,000. She was a 75-year old widow with no occupation listed. With her lived her daughter, JoWill, 44, a tabulating machine operator for the State Department of Health; and son J.B., Jr., 27, a project superintendent for the Works Progress Administration.

MRS. MOLLIE B. WALKER

Mrs. Mollie Bowers Walker, 79. wife of John B. Walker, died at her home, 1415 Westover Road, early Monday. She is survived by func daughters. Miss Jowill Walker, Miss Ouids Walker, Mrs. W. E. Allem and Mrs. Louise Walker Marshall, all of Austin; one son, Bower Walker, two sisters, Mrs. I. N. Keller of

two sisters, Mrs. I. N. Keller of Houston and Mrs. J. T. Mallard of Hillsboro, and two brothers, D. A Bowers of Granger and D. C. Bowers of Oklahoma City.

Funeral services will be conducted at the Weed-Corley Funeral Home Tuesday at 1:30 p. m. by Edmund Heinsohn, after which the body will be taken to Granger, where graveside services will be conducted at 3:30 p. m.
