Approve an ordinance setting the assessment rate and approving a proposed 2015 assessment roll for the South Congress Preservation and Improvement District. Related to Items #19 and #72

Amount and Source of Funding

The 2015 assessment rate of \$0.20/\$100 valuation is estimated to produce \$77,825 at a 90% collection rate.

There is no unanticipated fiscal impact. A fiscal note is not required. Additional Backup Information

The South Congress Preservation and Improvement District (PID) is comprised of 44 properties lining South Congress Avenue from Nellie Street to Annie Street. The assessment rate is \$0.20/\$100 valuation. In 2015 this assessment rate is expected to generate \$77,824 at a 90% collection rate. This action will approve the proposed South Congress Preservation and Improvement District assessment rate and proposed roll for 2015. Approval of the proposed roll is necessary so that notices may be sent to the property owners, giving them an opportunity to review the property valuations prior to the public hearing. All previously approved exemptions and exclusions from assessments are retained in this year's roll. State law requires Council approval of a proposed roll. Council requested that this assessment process be timed so that it coincides with the receipt of other tax bills.

A related item sets a public hearing on Thursday, November 20, 2014 to consider the 2015 assessments for the South Congress Preservation and Improvement District. State law requires a public hearing by Council to consider the proposed assessments. Each property owner has a right to appear at the hearing. The South Congress Improvement Association submitted a 2015 budget for the PID in the amount of \$75,825. This amount includes \$77,825 in 2015 assessments (at a 90% collection rate) minus \$2,000 for reserve. Approval of the proposed PID budget and the ordinance adopting an assessment rate and proposed roll are the first steps in the annual process of approving PID assessments.
