This contract will provide Austin Energy with repair, restoration, and maintenance of the 17 moonlight towers in Austin. The moonlight towers were erected in 1894 to serve as street lighting for the City at night. They became Texas State Landmarks in 1970 and were added to the U.S. National Register of Historic Places in 1976. Austin is the only city in the world that still has moonlight towers.

The moonlight towers were last restored between 1993 and 1995. Since then, they have been maintained on an asneeded basis for preservation. Many of the towers need painting and inspection to ensure safety, preservation and public enjoyment.

Currently there are two towers in storage due to construction in their vicinity. This contract includes the restoration and replacement of these two towers.
