3900 CHERRYWOOD ROAD**

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**PROPOSAL**

Demolish a ca. 1950 house.

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**ARCHITECTURE**

One-story, wing-and-gable plan, brick-veneered minimal traditional frame house with a partial-width shed-roofed independent porch on ornamental metal supports; single and paired 1:1 fenestration.

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**RESEARCH**

The house was built in 1950 by Hickman T. Baker, a local carpenter, who lived on Breeze Terrace. The first owners and occupants of the house were Bruce and Rhudell Allen, who lived here until around 1953. Bruce Allen was an assistant State Attorney General. Annie Giles owned and occupied the house from the mid-1950s until the early 1970s. She was a single woman whose family had been in the wallpaper business for many years in Austin. During the time she lived here, she was either listed as retired or with no occupation. Lee E. Thompson, a technician for IBM who then worked as an engineering aide at the State Highway Department, was the owner and occupant of the house with his wife, Bessie, through the 1990s.

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**STAFF COMMENTS**

The house does not appear in any City survey.

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**STAFF RECOMMENDATION**

Encourage adaptive re-use and retention of the house if feasible; otherwise, release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. The house has neither the historical nor the architectural significance to warrant individual designation as a historic landmark.

Steve:

The neighborhood is still in favor of reuse when possible. The builder met with some of the adjacent neighbors and said they would incorporate what was suggested if they can into the design.

I have asked for a red line version of these suggestions to at least have something on paper.

Is there anything else we can do to help insure these get implemented? My understanding is that issuance of the demolition permit is more or less automatic at this phase, with maybe some comments or special conditions from the Historical Landmark Commission. Is this correct?



#### BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

##### Annie Giles (ca. 1953 – ca. 1970)

Annie Giles appears in the 1940 U.S. Census as the owner of the house at 706 W. 22<sup>nd</sup> Street, which was worth \$3,500. She was 58, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed. She lived alone. The 1930 U.S. Census shows her as the daughter of Mrs. Val Giles, at 710 W. 22<sup>nd</sup> Street. Annie's mother was a 79-year old Texas-born widow with no occupation listed. Annie Giles had a wallpaper business from the house. The family had a housekeeper who lived in the house with them. The 1920 U.S. Census shows Val Giles and Annie B. Giles at 710 W. 22<sup>nd</sup> Street. Val Giles was a wallpaper merchant. Annie had an indecipherable occupation. The 1910 U.S. Census shows Val and Lou Giles at 710 W. 22<sup>nd</sup> Street. Val was in the wallpaper business. Annie lived with them and had no occupation listed. With them also lived Val and Lou's son, Val, Jr., who was also in the wallpaper business, and Val, Jr.'s wife, Mamie, who had no occupation listed.
