# PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1947 house.

# ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, hipped-roof frame house with a wraparound front porch with non-historic railings; single and paired 1:1 fenestration; ca. 1960 hipped-roof second-story addition to the rear of the house.

# RESEARCH


The house was built in the winter of 1946-1947 by Wayne Price, a local investor. The first owners and occupants were R. Mayo and Bess King, who lived here from 1947 to around 1957. R. Mayo King was the proprietor of King's Record Shop on the Drag at the time that he and Bess bought this house. He then went into the wholesale radio supply business, and owned the Standard Radio Supply Company on Lavaca Street. By the early 1950s, he was in partnership with Ralph Smoot in Smoot's plumbing supply house; King later developed the business as K&M Supply Company of Austin. By the late 1950s, Mayo and Bess King sold the house to George M. and Patricia Warren. George Warren had been the assistant manager, then vice-president and manager of King's K&M Supply Company; he later became the president of the company. By the mid-1970s, Warren was operating as a manufacturer's representative with offices on W. 34<sup>th</sup> Street.

# STAFF COMMENTS

The house does not appear in any City survey.

# STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Release the permit. The house has neither the architectural nor the historical significance to warrant individual designation as a historic landmark, and has been modified so that documentation is not justified.

# **BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES**

### R. Mayo and Bess B. King (ca. 1947 – ca. 1957)

Mayo King appears in the 1930 U.S. Census as the 15-year old son of R.E. and Mary King, who rented the house at 604 W. 9<sup>th</sup> Street in Austin. His father, R.E. King, was a 45-year old Texasborn tax collector. His mother was 41, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed. Mayo was the oldest of the couple's 2 boys listed; both he and his brother, Robert, 9, had been born in Texas. The 1920 U.S. Census shows the King family in Center City, Shelby County, Texas, where they rented a house. Robert E. King was a stenographer at an abstract office. Robert, Jr. is not listed in this census report, but Mayo had an older sister, E. Louise King, who was then 9.

#### George M. Warren

George M. "Bud" Warren was born on November 2, 1923 to Alma and Bill Warren in Hallsville, Texas. He died on August 17, 2009 in Austin, Texas where he lived for over sixty-two years.

Bud served in the Army Air Forces during World War II as a pilot in the Pacific Theater. He was a 2nd Lieutenant. He endured the misery of war, but he surely did enjoy flying those C-47s.

Soon after their marriage in 1947, Bud and Pat (O'Brien), who survives him, settled in Austin. Their children, David Warren, Kelly Warren Smith, and Tracy Warren; and their grandchildren, Stephanie Barnett, Grant Smith, Meredith Warren, and Margot Warren also survive him, as well as Tracy's wife Jean, and Stephanie's husband Will. The roles of father and grandfather suited Bud. He was a natural.

Bud worked in the wholesale heating and air-conditioning business, first with Milstead Co., then with K&M Supply, eventually founding the George Warren Co., which he owned until his retirement in 1998. He was known around town for his integrity and his ability to deal with the tough problems in the business.

Known as "The Mayor of Stevenson Ave." by neighbors for blocks around, Bud humbly attributed this honor to his fifty-two years in residence.

Bud had nine brothers and sisters, and thought that being a member of such a large family was the result of great good luck. Three brothers and two sisters preceded him in death. Four of his sisters survive him: Charlotte Matthews of Austin, Doris King, Mary Starr, and Winifred Adams.

There will be a visitation for family and friends beginning at 6:00 p.m., Friday, August 28, 2009. A memorial service will begin at 10:00 a.m., Saturday, August 29, 2009. Both will be at Weed-Corley-Fish Funeral Home, 3125 North Lamar Blvd.
