Upon the approval of the Republic Square Master Plan, the Austin Parks Foundation (APF) and the Downtown Austin Alliance (DAA) communicated their interest in design, construction, operation and management of the park to the Parks and Recreation Department. APF and DAA proposed control of the schematic design, design development, construction documents, bidding documents and construction administration of the proposed Phase 1 improvements outlined in the Master Plan. Additionally, APF and DAA have agreed to conduct a capital campaign to provide supplemental funding in order to complete the project.
